





### Raise for 4,725,000 Persons

The some 4,725,000 persons now receiving Old Age and Survivor's insurance checks under Social Security program received receive. hikes in payment. Total monthly Social Security payments rose from \$168,400,000 to \$190,500,000.

This micrease represents a 13 per cent increase represents a 13 per cent increase to retired workers and their families and to dependent survivors of workers. The increase was automatically provided by a new law passed in the last session of Congress.

The social security laws are very strict and we feel unjust in some cases.

Under the program, you are entitled to earit \$50 a month. If you earn over that, you are "penalized" and probably have to forfeit payments. This may not sound unjust but let's investigate a little further.

The Social Security program is a wonder-ful thing, but it needs overhauling.

One of the basic changes of the law should be that when anyone becomes eligible for the benefit he has paid for, he or his survivors will get that benefit irrespective of anything else.
