Most Counties in Same Boat

County Assessor Henry Arp is having a hard time closing the tax books this year. By the time his office makes all the adjustments ordered by the state last week, Henry is going to be ready for a long vacation.

Early returns from the state's coun-ies, according to "Today's Taxes," show-d a drop in the assessed valuation of per-onal property and an increase in farm and city real estate.

Because most counties were skeptical the state would make all 93 counties comply, most of the returns sent to Lincoln were not in line with recommendations of the state board—and assessed values were hiked.

Only a handful of counties showed an increase in the total valuation of all property. These were: Burt, 1% of Cheyenne, 7%: Dakota, 3%; Deuel, 36%; Dodge, 24%; Hamilton, 9%; Kimball, 30%; Logan, 6%; Madison, 7%; Saline, 1%; Sarpy, 6%; Washington, 7%; and York, 5%.
