The pool is a much-needed public improvement. Its benefits can be summarized as follows:

The value of a town is in the service it renders to its people and its youth. The youth of a town want to swim and they will swim, either in pools in other towns or in creeks or rivers.

If a town has its own pool, it can be regulated for purity, cleanliness and safety. Also, most of Wayne's recreational facilities are primarily for boys. A swimming pool would be one recreation that could be shared equally by boys and

Harmers living halfway between two towns, one of which had a pool, would choose to patronize the town with the pool.

In prior years the college pool has been used. on occasion, but now it cannot handle the job.

A pool in Wayne would, insure a properly supervised place for your children to swim without having to travel long, dangerous distances to use pools in neighboring towns.

Besides, pool officials in other towns are seriously considering restricting use of the pool to persons in their own trade areas.

The proposed swimming pool MUST BE BUILT IN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF WAYNE. That is the way the question is worded on the

Every qualified voter is eligible to vote on this question. Many persons feel that only property holders are eligible, but this is not the case. If you are a qualified voter, you may vote on the swimming pool issue.

Qualification requirements are as follows: You must be over 21; a tapayer with 6 months residence in the state, 30 days in the county and 10 days in your ward. The taxes you pay may be real estate, personal property or others.
