Monday a hearing will be held on a bill to pra-it printing so-called "voter's guides" or cam-ing political candidates in newspapers less-n 15 days prior to election. This bill, LB 475, written to protect political candidates from: les statements, prejudiced opinions, half-truths, intional omissions and unwarranted infer-es."

es. Authors of the bill feel that such a law will e a candidate a chance to answer any such rges before election.

rges before election.

AT FIRST GLANCE the bill seams reasonable and proper. A little study, however, shows: it to be unneccesary, and rather futile.

Any, person is protected by libel laws. If he feels he has been hurt by false statements he can seek recourse in-court.

Newspopers, like anyone else, have a right to their opinions. If they are prevented from expressing these opinions or making comparisons of the various conditions, they are being deprived of their right to speak, a right guaranteed in the Constitution. Certainly every candidate for office, will feel that he has the right to voica his opinions right up to election day. If such a bill is passed, it requires only one more short step to curb the spoken word. ... and ellminating freedom of speech.

The lengthy preamble of the bill decries the practice of a very small number of editors who saved their big-blast for the last; thus preventing the opposition from answering. If this must be done, thas let us include in the bill, provisions preventing anyone from even mentioning candidates within a specified time prior to elaction, either in writtenior spaken word.

THE BILL, HOWEVER, WOULD CURB ONLY WRITTEN MATTER and allow candidates to run ads within that 15 days, apparently permitting them to, say anything they like, THUS AVALLING THEM OF A RIGHT DENIED TO OTHERS.

This bill probably will not pass. If the legislators are wise it will be killed in committee.

Americans have long since learned that laws must be written for the good of the whole country, not for the benefit of a privileged few, did denying such a basic right as expressing opinions on politi-
