#### **Group Sponsors County Meetings** On Redistricting

Relative costs of two-room rural schools, operation of school buses and a survey of teachers available for rural schools in 1958 were main points of discussion at a redistricting meeting last Thursday night at the courthouse. Attending were about 25 members of county rural school boards. The meeting was sponsored by Wavne County Rural School Boards association and headed by Gordon Nuernberger, chairman of the ischool boards group. Nuernberger took as an example a \$12,000,000 district, about the size of the proposed Wayne district. He said a conservative estimate of the area involved would be about 160 square miles. Two-room rural schools, he said, would service an estimated 16 square miles. Thus it would require five such units in an 80-square mile area.

# WSTC Is Growing . . .

Wayne State's ever-increasing popularity is shown by its enrollment and additions to the physical plant. A 23% increase in resident campus enrollment was shown this year over last, pringing this year's total to 896 resident students.

A \$600,000 library will be completed in June and construction will start this summer on a new physical education building and auditorium. A new dormitory for girls will also be started this summer. Expansion of a boys' residence hall will be be completed before fail. Many other improvements are slated for campus buildings and grounds.

Recent additions at WSTC include the nursery school, instituted in 1954, home management house, apartments on compus for married stydents and faculty, new lights for the football field, air conditioning in Student Union lounge and additional poving.
