Driver's License Renewals Due September 1

- 2. Renewal must be secured in the county in which you live.
- 3. Renewal must be secured before November 1.
- Cost of license remains the same—\$2.00 for people 20 years old or older, and \$1.50 for people under 20 years of age. The \$1.50 license is good for one year only.
- To secure a renewal, you must surrender your present driver's license. If you have lost this license, you must secure a duplicate at the county treasurer's office; at an additional cost of 50 cents. IF YOU LICENSE IS UNDER SUSPENSION FOR ANY REASON, IT CANNOT BE RENEWED.
- Office hours at the court house are from 8:30 to 12 and 1 to 5 daily except saturday from 8:30 to 12 only. The court house will be closed Monday, Sept. 2 for Labor Day Holiday, and renewals will be issued beginning on Sept. 3.
- Renewals may be secured by mail. Simply mail in the old driver's license and the necessary fee. Be sure your old license has been signed.
- The License Examiners will be at the court house in Wayne to give examinations for new licenses and school permits and issue Learners permits, on the following Friday aftermoons from 1 to 5 p.m. Aug. 30, Sept. 13; Sept. 27, Oct. 11, and Oct. 25.




