For Light Plant Engine
A new crankshaft for the dis-
abled Nordberg engine at the
Wayne light plant arrived Tuesday
morning.

shaft broke near the flywheel last
March.
The new shaft, which weighs
about seven tons, will cost the
city \$13,500. The remainder of the
cost and installation, estimated at
about \$8,000, will be paid by the
Nordberg firm.

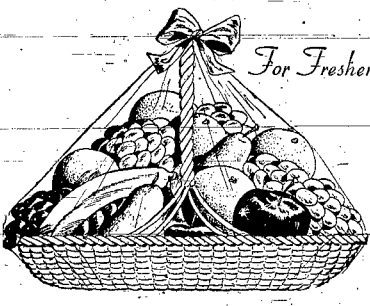

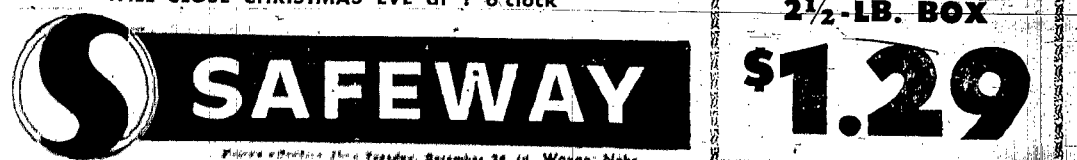
