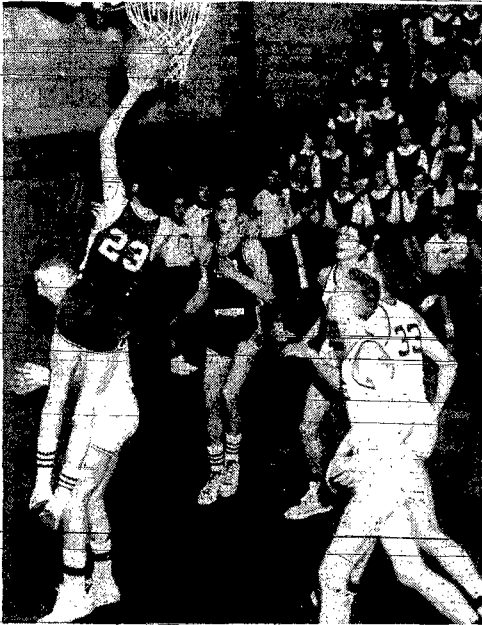

Former Resident Of Wayne Dies in Portales, N. M.

Funeral services for Bert Cassan, 69, Portales, N. M., were held Feb. 9 in the Portales Presbyterian church.

Mr. Cassan, a former Wayne jeweler, died Feb. 2 after a four-week illness. He was stricken with a severe heart attack, spent three weeks in a hospital and suffered a fatal attack a week after being sent home.

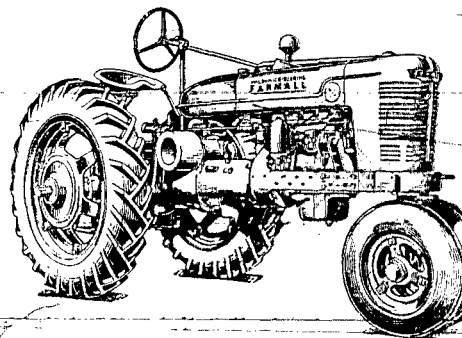

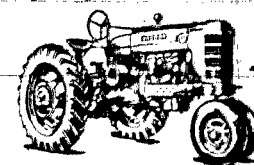
