





Oats High in Feed Value When Harvested For Silage; Use Chlordane for Cutworms

Oats makes a high yield in feed value when harvested as silage. The proper time to cut oats for silage is in the late milk to early dough stage when the moisture content is 70-75 percent.

Oats dry rapidly due to the hollow stems. Chopping in two to three-inch lengths, will reduce moisture loss. Oat silage should be packed more than other silage. Preservatives are not necessary.




