Primarily, Service battery is composed of three major sections. one can be singled out as most important it would probably be the Ammunition section. This group is responsible for procurement and delivery of all ammunition to the firing batterics. Without ab-lute coordination of the ammunition section the entire period could ove worthless to the personnel of the firing batteries.

During five days of big gun tiring the ammunition section delivered over 1000 rounds of ammunition to the firing batteries. In addition they contributed countless rounds of small arms, rocket and machine gun ammunition to the training troops. Besides de-livering the ammunition, the section was responsible for returning all expended cortridges, both large and small.

It is said an Army travels on its stomach, but the military's wheeled vehicles are of primary concern to commanders and troops alike. Maintainance, supply of parts and coordination of all move-ment of the battalien's 69 jeeps, 3 4, 2½ and five ton trucks and all trailers was the responsibility of the Wayne unit's motor section.

Third major group making up the battery is the battalion supply section. All food and equipment such as bunks, tents, mat-tresses, soap and kitchen-supplies for the entire battalion is handled by this unit. Even the wire which afforded electricity to the tent city was the responsibility of the supply section.

In addition to the three major sections, a final group, the adquarters section, completes the battery organization. This unit fudes the battery motor pool which cares for its own vehicles, a battery "mess" or kitchen and finally the command post group ich handles administrative details of the unit.

County Agent's Column . . Storing Corn for Price Rise Not Always

Money-Maker; Give Warning on Silo Gas. It costs from 23 to 30 cents per bushet to store \$1.20 corn for a ter-month period. The shrinkage (22 percent down to 15 percent moisture) costs into earts per bushet, which is the big-gest item. Other costs to be com-sidered are interest, extra hand-ing, damage, insurance and taxes. Storing corn for a price rise doesn't always make money and carries some risk. For the eight-year period, 1945-1952, the average price rise from cribbing to sale the following August was 26 cents. per bushet. The biggest rise was 92 cents in 1947.
