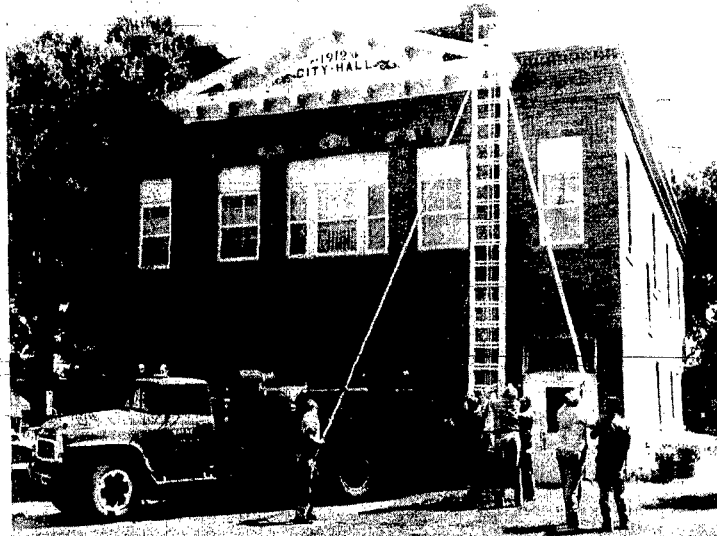

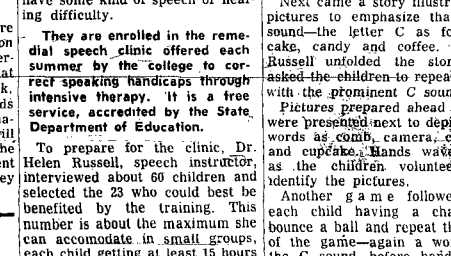

They started with a rhythm period of clapping hands and stomping feet. This helped them relax and drain off some excess energy.

Next came a story illustrated by pictures to emphasize that day's sound—the letter C as found in cake, candy and coffee.

Russell unfolded the story, she asked the children to repeat words with the prominent C sound.

Pictures prepared ahead of time were presented next to depict such words as comb, camera, camping and cupcake.

Another game followed with each child having a chance to bounce a ball and repeat the word of the game—again a word with the C sound—before handing the ball to a classmate.

Frequently Dr. Russell uses a tape recorder to help the children hear their own voices.

The problems being treated this summer include delayed speech, severe articulation defects, hearing, cleft palate, stuttering and foreign dialects.

What are the results? They vary, Dr. Russell says. One month is not enough to solve all the problems, but it does suffice to whet a child's interest in speech improvement and also to acquaint parents with the methods.

When parents continue to work with their children through the year, improvement is usually noticeable. Dr. Russell noted that five children returning from the 1959 clinic speak better now.

Of the 23 enrolled, 19 live in towns other than Wayne. Two come from Columbus. The ages range from five to 16, though most are in elementary grades.

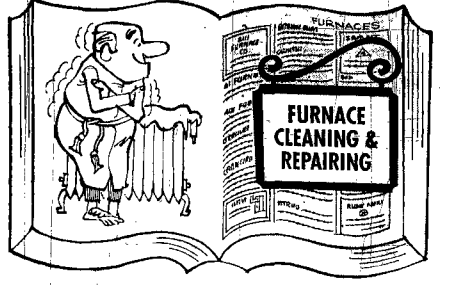


