

## Farm Bureau Talent Find and Talk Meet Final Plans Made

The annual Farm Bureau Talent Find and Talk Meet has been set for Nov. 9 at 8:00 p.m. in the Laurel High School. The bureau is urging all interested youths and young adults between the ages of 10 and 30 to get their entries registered with Mrs. Ernest Swanson, Wayne or Mrs. Clarence Johnson, Laurel.

As to rules, entrants must be from a Farm Bureau family; the talk meet subject for the 10 through 13 year old group is "Symbol of Democracy"; the 14 through 16 year old subject will be "Inflation," and the 17 through 30 year old's subject will be "Towards New Frontiers."

The first two are memorized with notes three minutes talks, the young adult is a five minute extemporaneous speech, no notes. Talent find may be vocal, instrumental, dramatic or dancing and not more than five minutes.

There are prizes for all entrants and the winner in each of the two contests will compete at the state convention in Lincoln, Nov. 13. County winners from across the state will be entered in the state meet.

The state winner for the young adult's contest will receive traveling expenses to the national convention, Denver.

## Final Report Shows 1,359 WSTC Students

Fall enrollment at WSTC is 1,359. Registrar Milton Childs announced this week in a final report. The total includes all resident students in college courses, but not correspondence students. Full-time students (those taking 12 or more hours credit) number 1,179.

As usual, men outnumber the women, 723 to 636. Only the sophomore class has more women, 188, than men, 164. The freshman class is almost even with 246 men, 241 women.

By classes, the totals are: 487 freshmen, 352 sophomores, 247 juniors, 224 seniors, 46 graduates and three post-graduates.

The Prep campus school totals 335 students in all grades, with boys outnumbering the girls, 178 to 157. There are 191 in the elementary grades from kindergarten through sixth; 76 in junior high, and 68 in high school (tenth through 12th grades).

## "Oklahoma" to be Presented by Prep

The Wayne Prep music department announced that a contract had been signed and plans were already underway for the school to present the Broadway musical, "Oklahoma" on January 12 and 13 of the current school year.

The production of such a show is a major undertaking in both musical and staging efforts. The production calls for 23 speaking and singing leads and for different stage settings. The show will be given at the Rice Memorial auditorium.

Fred Vorce, Music Supervisor, has stated that to his knowledge, Prep will be one of the smallest schools ever to undertake such a project, since high school enrollment totals only about 68 students this year.

## Taxes Due in October Listed in Tax Calendar

The October tax calendar for Nebraska listed two taxes, applicable to individuals, that are due now.

First, federal income tax: The fourth quarterly installment and last day to file amended declaration of estimated individual income tax for taxpayers for the fiscal year ended Sept. 30. However, individuals, other than farmers, may file final return (1040) by October 31 in lieu of amended estimate.

Other installments due now are: Third quarterly installment, fiscal year ending Jan. 31, 1961. Second quarterly installment, fiscal year ending Apr. 30, 1961. First quarterly installment, fiscal year ending June 30, 1961.

## Farmer Turns to Teaching During Successful Career

David Chambers, a lifelong farmer, decided this fall, at the age of 34, to go to college at Wayne State. Now all five in his family are students on the campus. His farm is located 8 1/2 miles northwest of Pender.

His wife, Kathryn, is a senior at Wayne State, and their sons, Ken, 13; Jim, 12, and Pat, 9, are students in the Prep campus training school.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Chambers are heading for teaching degrees. She already has been a teacher (for four years in the 1940's) but Dave never has taught school.

What induced him to switch from farming to studying — rather, to add a full-time college course to his farm duties? Why leave a well-developed farm in the fertile Logan Valley?

The teaching idea has grown from a sideline to his farming. For about eight years Chambers has been a square dance caller and teacher, working in about half the states from coast to coast.

"Square dance teaching convinced me that I would like to teach school," he explains. "And after serving several years on our school board, I decided there is a big need for teachers. We have too many farmers, not enough teachers."

### Bowling Roll-off To be Held Here
