### Cattle Feedlot Rations Need Added Vitamin A

Cattle feedlot rations should include added synthetic vitamin A, according to the Doane Agricultural Digest. Researchers are finding that the carotene contained in legumes often doesn't provide a consistent source of vitamin A. Too, minimum recommendations for vitamin A ration content are not high enough to support best growth rates. Fattening steers should receive 30,000 to 35,000 International Units.

### Dehorn Cattle Before Putting Them In Lots

Cattle should be dehorned as calves, but if some are missed they should be dehorned before going into the feedlot, say Doane Agricultural Digest editors. Up to 30 pounds of shrink can be expected from dehorning yearlings, but this is usually made up in 10 to 20 days. Bruising is reduced and feedlot gains are better when all cattle are dehorned.
