Wayne High baseball team took their first victory and their second loss of the season Tuesday and Thursday last week with Creighton and West Point respectively.

Jerry Granquist and Doug Manske pitched for the Blue Devils when they defeated Creighton 11-0 in a game at Creighton.

The second defeat was added to the record in spite of efforts of the players to keep themselves on top a little longer Thursday when West Point went ahead in the final inning to defeat the Blue Devils 4-3.

Meet Held Friday

Last Friday was the day for the second annual Blue Devil Relay track meet. Twenty-six schools participated. Nine were Class B schools.

St. Bonn led all Class B schools in the point department with 52 followed by Bloomfield with 23, Laurel 19, Tekamah 18, and Wayne with 14 points. Aquinas, Crofton, West Point, and Cedar Catholic failed to score in double figures.

St. Bonn took the Class B 480 hurdle shuttle relay in a time of 1:08.1. A new record was set in the two mile relay by Wayne's Weirld, Bernthal, Wochler, and Addison. The time was 8:42.5 which was five seconds better than the old record set by St. Bonn of 8:47.5.

The 440 yard relay was won at 45.7. The open shot put event was won by Hanly Anderson, Wausa, with 46' 0".

The 880 yard relay was won by St. Bonn with 1:35.9. The open 100 yard dash was won by Mathisen from Ponca with time of 10.5 breaking his own record last year of 10.7. The mile relay was won by St. Bonn with the time of 3:37.9.

In class C competition in the 480 hurdle shuttle relay Lyons won with 1:10. The two mile relay was won by Belden with the time of 9:03.9. The 440 yard relay was won by Lyons in time of 46.5. The mile medley was won by Wakefield with the time of 4:00.9. The 880 yard relay was taken by Lyons with the time of 1:38.7. The sprint medley relay was won by Ponca with the time of 1:44.3. The mile relay was taken by Ponca with a time of 3:40.1.

The team standings for Class C schools are Lyons leading with 35, Ponca, 28; Burns 17, Creighton and Oakland 14, and Wakefield and Belden with 13 and 10.
