Carbon Monoxide, Silent Killer. This silent killer, more commonly referred to as carbon monoxide, is invisible, odorless and tasteless.

Generally thought of in connection with car exhaust fumes, carbon monoxide also can occur in the home.

Protect your family by following these rules: 1. Don't close the fireplace damper until you are certain the fire is out.

2. No heating device such as a space heater that is designed for venting should be used until it has been properly vented to the outside.

3. Use only heating devices that bear the label of a nationally recognized testing laboratory.

4. Make certain the attached garage is well sealed off from the rest of the house.

5. Check heating systems—furnace, space heater, water heater, fireplace and incinerator—annually to make sure they are operating efficiently.

6. If charcoal grills or hibachis are used indoors, be sure to provide for additional fresh air.

Capital News Approved Schools to Get Driver Education Funds

LINCOLN—The State Department of Education anticipates it will pay out more than \$243,000 to local schools that applied for driver education funds under a law passed by the last legislature.

Payments are made retroactively for the 1963-64 school year, according to Floyd K. Alexander, director of education. Alexander said about 13,000 students in 213 school systems in Nebraska participated in the program last year.

The 1963 law provides that part of the fees paid for driver licenses be made available to schools with approved driver education classes.

Alexander said that 11 school systems, including Lincoln and Omaha, have not been paid for last year's program because of a technicality involving the qualifications of some driver education instructors.

Each school with an approved program is eligible to receive \$30 per student taking driver education. The per pupil cost, however, is almost always higher than that, Alexander said.

Amounts received so far by major school systems for last year's driver education programs: Ainsworth, \$1440; Alliance, \$3,900; Aurora, \$1,620; Blair, \$3,270; Fremont, \$6,909; Holdrege, \$2,250; Kearney, \$4,770; Lexington, \$3,840; York, \$4,230; Beatrice, \$6,300; McCook, \$6,240; Ogallala, \$6,180; Hastings, \$8,220; Norfolk, \$2,880; Scottsbluff, \$7,500; Grand Island, \$7,600; Sidney, \$6,750; and Omaha Westside, \$12,150.

Fund Formula Changed

The Nebraska Hospital Advisory Council has agreed to change the percentage of federal funds applied to Hill-Burton hospital projects in the state.

Presently, the federal matching percentage is 40. The Council lowered this to 33 1/2 per cent to allow the funds to be spread over more projects.

Nebraska annually receives about \$1.8 million in federal funds under the Hill-Burton Act. Large projects often consume most of the money.

The change must be approved by the State Health Board to be final since the Council is only an advisory body.

The new formula was proposed by Council member Hal Perin, Omaha, who said it would make for better community planning by increasing local participation.

Local participation will be upped 10 per cent and federal participation decreased by 22 per cent under the proposal.

The Hospital Council deferred action on a proposal to limit to \$1 million the amount of Hill-Burton funds that may be allocated to any one project.

Canvass Completed

The official State vote canvass has been completed. No changes resulted in previously announced returns of the Nov. 3 election but the total vote was revealed as the fifth highest in Nebraska history.

Secretary of State Frank Marsh, who compiled information for the canvassing board, said the total vote was 592,673 with about 70 per cent of the es-

timated eligible voters going to the polls. The vote fell short of the 619,399 recorded in the 1960 election and the all-time high of 623,781 set in 1940.

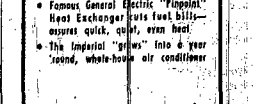
