## Northeast Station Research on Agenda During NE Nebraska Farm Group's Meet

The highlights of research at the University of Nebraska Northeast Station at Concord and a panel discussion on the topic, "Should I Consider Irrigation?" will be presented at the High School Auditorium in Plainview on Tuesday, Mar. 11, at the annual meeting of the Northeast Nebraska Experimental Farm Association. The public is invited to attend the meeting, which begins at 1:15 p.m.

The association involves nearly 2,000 people in 14 counties in northeast Nebraska who contribute funds to aid in establishing and developing the Northeast Station. The most recent assistance has been the contribution of \$19,000 to aid in developing the new swine research facilities.

## Area Men Find Outlook Better For Highway 57

A group of 96 northeast Nebraska businessmen from rural and town areas including Laurel, Coleridge, Wynot and Carroll met with Governor Tiemann and the State Highway Commission Feb. 24 in Lincoln. The delegation met with the officials to seek hard-surfacing for Highways 57 and 84.

John Hethwisch, Carroll postmaster, said Friday that Governor Tiemann latched with the group and that the outlook appeared real encouraging. State highway commissioners indicated they would at least plan to grade and gravel the stretches of Highway 57 and 84 that were brought to their attention. The project will be scheduled sometime during the next two years.

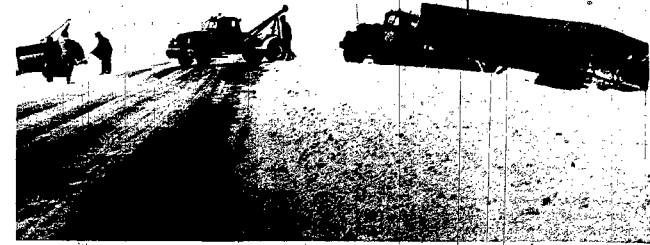
