Allen Lady Adds Unusual Find to Rock Collection

A short trip out to a gravel pit near Allen turned out better than Mrs. Irene Armour ever imagined.

The rock found ever since she was a child, Mrs. Armour ended up the day owning what rock specialists say is a very rare possession — a petrified turtle in almost perfect condition.

Mrs. Armour went to the pit to look through some of the rocks for anything she doesn't already have in her collection. While digging around, a truck driver came over and asked if she wanted a rock which had fouled up one of the augers. He gave it to her, jumped in his truck and drove off before she could thank him. The rock turned out to be shaped exactly like a turtle with legs and head drawn into the shell.

She showed it to some of the members of the Gem and Mineral Club in Sioux City, which she joined only recently, and they "went wild." They told her it was not too unusual to find living things turned into stone, but it is very unusual to find them in such perfect condition in Nebraska, especially in gravel pits where machines often crush or break rocks.

The rock, about six inches long and quite heavy, has creases on the top where the turtle's shell would be and on the bottom where the hard belly would be. The creases are too perfect to have been formed by erosion by wind or water. Slight portions of the shell area have been chipped away, possibly by a machine at the gravel pit or by erosion.

David Hamer of Wayne, another rock hound, said that the rock was probably pushed into Nebraska during the time of the glaciers. He said it could be anywhere from 60 to 120 million years old.

Mrs. Armour, who has lived in the Allen area all her life, admitted that all the credit for the find belonged to that truck driver. "But he took off before I could even thank him," she said.

She wasn't the only one who thought she was awful lucky to add the rock to her collection only a short time after joining the rock club. "One club member just looked at the rock and walked away muttering to himself that some people have all the luck," she said.

"Viet Nam Profile," a documentary film produced by Dr. Bob Pierce for World Vision International will be presented Sunday evening at the Evangelical Free Church in Concord at 7:30 p.m., according to Rev. Melvin Loge.

The sound-color documentary, 80 minutes in length, takes the viewer through war-torn Viet Nam portraying "the drama of God at work in the midst of war."

Dr. Pierce, president of World Vision International, spent the major part of two years in Viet Nam filming and directing production of "Viet Nam Profile," while establishing his organization's vast relief program there.

"Viet Nam Profile" shows the people of the war-torn little country — the colorful aboriginal mountain tribespeople as well as the Vietnamese people themselves. It ties the viewer into scenes of actual combat. It follows missionaries and Vietnamese Christians in their faithful and often heroic labors for Christ. It depicts the ministries of a typical U. S. chaplain.

Narration and most of the filming were done by Dr. Pierce personally, assisted by Camera-men Nguyen van Duc of Viet Nam and Y. B. Tang of Hong Kong. Ralph Carmichael composed and directed original music for the film.

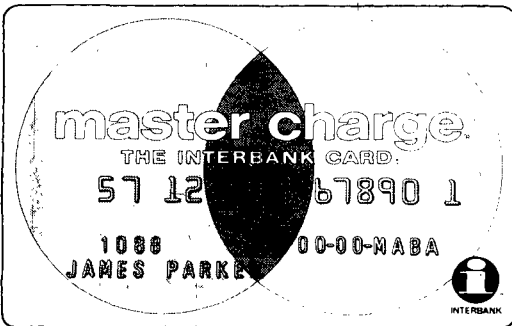

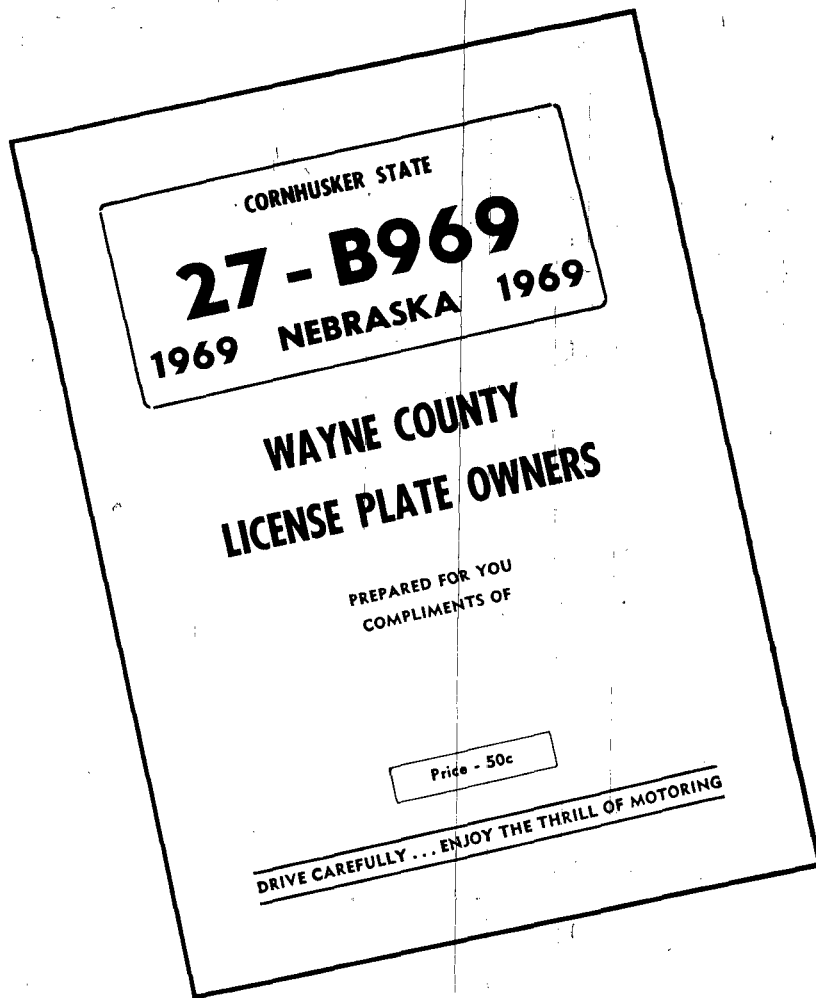

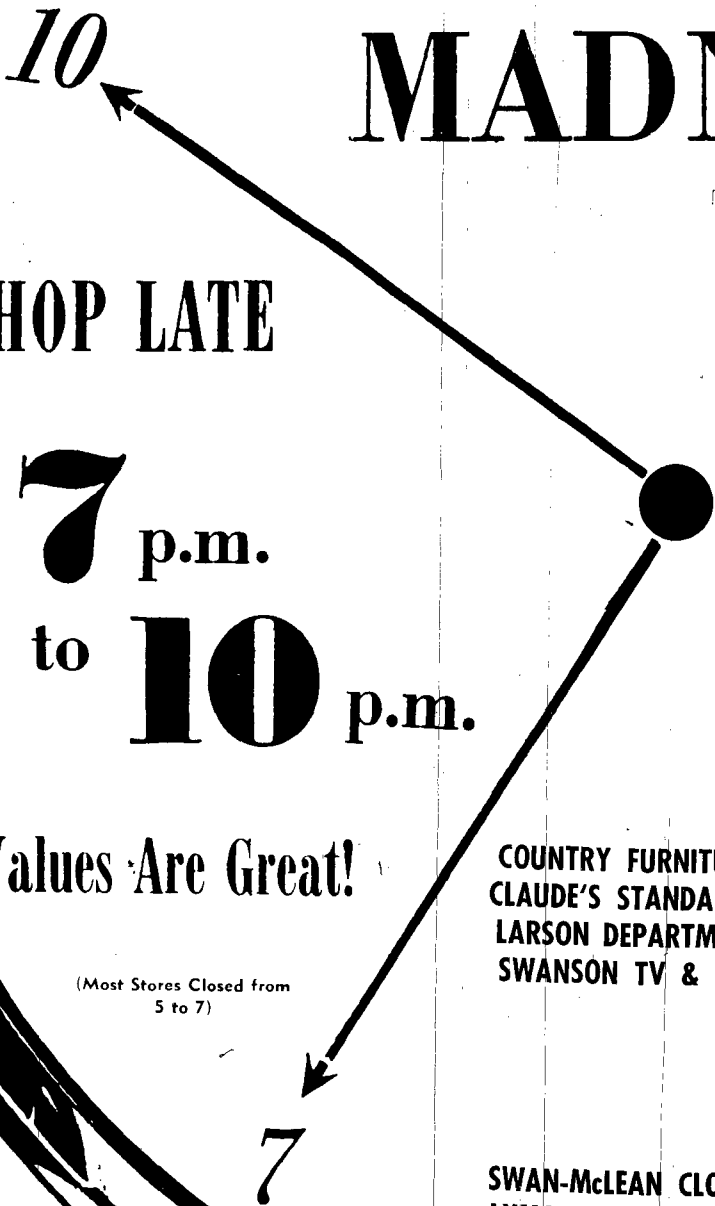
