

Historical Museum Permanent Memorial to Past



WAYNE COUNTY'S Historical Museum, in Wayne, stands as a permanent reminder and home for many displays and antiques depicting the history of the county. Several improvements have taken place at the museum, which is located at 702 Lincoln St., and many of the relics are placed in authentic surroundings.

It's been nearly two years since the family of the late Reille Lay turned over the family home in Wayne to the County Historical Society to use as a permanent housing for museum pieces collected during the years.

Since then, many changes have occurred both in and around the museum, which is located at 702 Lincoln St.

The house recently received a thorough cleaning by the Confusible Collectables Cleaners Club of Wayne. Grounds around the house are kept attractive looking with the help of David and Doug Doeschers, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Darrell Doeschers.

The museum was opened for a while recently to do some remodeling in preparation for a grand opening late this summer or in early fall.

Tours, however, are once again being given each Sunday afternoon from 2 to 4 p.m. and each Thursday evening from 7 to 9 p.m. Special tours for groups can be arranged with the curator, Mrs. Clifford Johnson.

Hosts at the museum tonight (Thursday) are Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Olds and Kay Cattie, Mr. and Mrs. Leo Jensen and Mrs. Gordon Nedergaard will greet visitors to the museum on Sunday, June 18.

Three hosts are always on duty as greeters and guides, and Mrs. Johnson says she plans to train five to 10 members of the Historical Society more extensively. A brochure of the history and general information about the

museum will soon be printed to distribute to visitors.

Improvements which have taken place at the museum in the last year include a display of horse equipment along one wall in the basement. The wall was built to resemble the side of a barn and houses old harnesses, saddles, bridles, fly nets and other horse paraphernalia.

Small farm machinery, much of it hand operated, is arranged in two rooms.

A small basement kitchen for laundry and canning supplements the main kitchen on the first floor.

Floors of inlaid design decorate each of the main rooms on the first floor of the museum. The entire entry is paneled in wood, and all of the light fixtures are original.

Three of the five fireplaces in the home are located on the first floor. A china cabinet in the dining room nearly extends the length of the entire wall. Several old musical instruments add interest to the front parlor.

Two stairways lead to the second floor, which houses four bedrooms and a maid's room. Ample windows and a fireplace in one bedroom make it suitable for an upstairs sitting room. Other rooms contain venerated souvenirs of early Nebraska territorial days, and a sleeping porch now holds many American Indian artifacts.

The most extensive work in the museum has been done on the third floor (attic), where several glass-fronted wardrobes have been secured to the

walls. During June, old wedding dresses, hats, shoes, and men's suits are being displayed on forms.

Old sewing machines and other apparatus also are located on the third floor, as well as displays of old photographic relics. Also serving as conversation pieces are the windows, in wall-fitting patterns.

The Elkhorn Valley Iris Society has provided flower arrangements for the museum's library this spring. Mrs. William Hagerman has used irises from the gardens of Lucile Larson, Jim Hummel and Roger Nelson.

The Historical Society is in the process of erecting a flag pole and sign at the museum.

The Society recently sponsored a Table Fashions on Parade show at the city auditorium, which realized nearly \$140 to help with improvements at the museum site.

All Wayne County Clubs were invited to provide table settings for the show, which took place in April. Thirty-two organizations responded with displays ranging from an outdoor cookout to a child's tiny tea party and oriental table settings.

Focal point of the show was the museum dining room table and chairs, which displayed old china, silverware, glassware, linens and an ornate lamp. The Wayne Federated Woman's Club was in charge of a tea table and served coffee, tea and cookies to the visitors.

The Historical Society plans to make the Table Fashions on Parade show an

annual affair.

Besides the new museum, the Historical Society takes an active interest in the old LaPorte Cemetery, which is located two miles south and three and a fourth miles east of Wayne.

LaPorte was the original site of the town, before the railroad's arrival made it necessary to move the town to its present location at Wayne.

Each spring the Society encourages a youth group to clean the old cemetery. This year the Teen Supremes 4-H Club went about the task. On Memorial Day, the American Legion conducts simple services there. Rain, however, curtailed the activities this year. Adolph Korn, a neighbor who resides near the cemetery, has hung the American flag in the cemetery on all military holidays for the past several years.

Without doubt, the Wayne County Historical Society plays a vital role in preserving the history of the county.

New officers of the organization are Cletus Sharer, president; Willis Johnson, vice president; Mrs. Allen Shufelt, secretary, and Leon Meyer, treasurer. Other members of the board are Mrs. Joe Claybaugh, Mrs. Terry Bartling and Wayne Gilliland.

The Society plans to have a get-acquainted coffee for the Wayne Chamber of Commerce soon and hopes to continue the plan with other organizations.

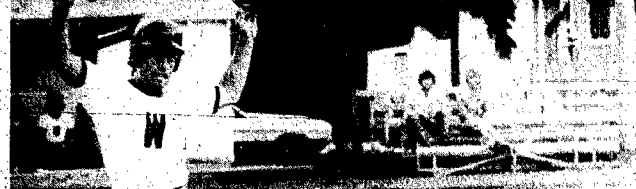
Carroll Pitches No-hit Shutout

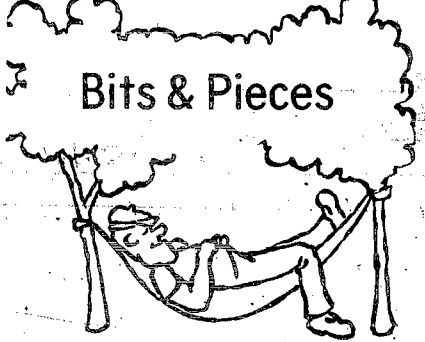

'Gray Water' Can Be Used

The use of gray water is becoming more of an accepted practice. This water is water that has been used once — in washing machines, dishwashers, showers and bathtubs and kitchen sinks.

These gray waters can be used in the home garden but certain facts should be known about them. Detergents which are found in the washing machine water are sodium salts of various organic acids. Soaps which are found in shower and tub water and some kitchen sink water are sodium or sometimes potassium salts of certain fatty acids. This sodium is not used

by the plants. It also accumulates in the soil and may reach toxic levels. Potassium, even though it is used by plants, may reach toxic levels also. The use of gray water depends on several factors. The first is the concentration of the soaps and detergents in the gray water. The greater the concentration of these particular elements.

Not all plants can use gray water. Because of its alkaline nature, gray water should not be used on acid-loving plants. Monocots tend to tolerate gray water and grass seeds to tolerate sodium quite well.

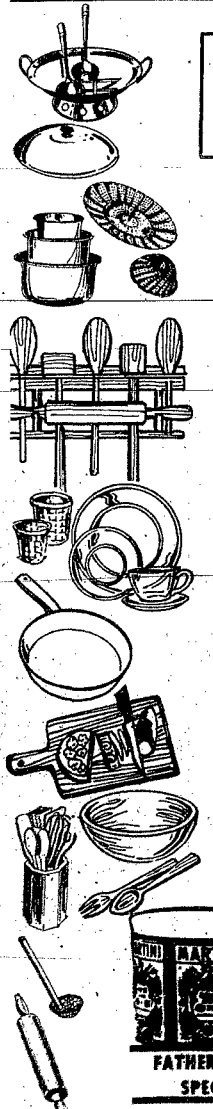
When injury does occur, gypsum can be used. Gypsum contains calcium, which replaces sodium in the exchange reaction of the soil. The sodium can then be leached out of the soil by additional water.

It is important not to use soaps or detergents which contain boron, as this is very toxic to plants and low concentrations will affect them. Water with bleach in it can be used, but should be allowed to stand in the sun one day before using. Bleaches break down in the presence of light and air to form less toxic salts.

Plants vary in their sensitivity to gray water, so damage is more likely to occur in container-grown plants than those grown in open ground. Therefore, when using gray water, do not use it on plants in containers.

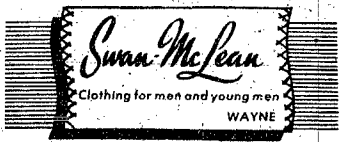
New Water Well
