## Flying in Sunday

### Preparations for Santa's Visit

Come snow, sleet or howling winds, Santa Claus will come to town Sunday.

This is the word from the Wayne Chamber of Commerce which has been the go-between with the Grand Old Man of the North and area youngsters who are anxiously awaiting the first visit of Santa Claus.

According to Gary Van Meter, Wayne Chamber executive, Santa Claus is scheduled to fly to Wayne Sunday with Dave Bodlak, flight instructor at the Wayne municipal airport, as the pilot.

Van Meter said Santa had commissioned Al Robinson, airport manager, as the pilot for the flight while his sleigh is being made ready for its Christmas Eve trek. But Robinson was unable to make the trip and Bodlak was given the nod for the flight which is expected to arrive back at the Wayne airport at about 1:30 p.m. Sunday.

Van Meter said area children and their parents are welcome to help greet Santa at the airport and escort him to his head-

quarters at the Peoples Natural Gas company office on Main Street.

Santa will visit with area youngsters from 2 to 4 p.m. Van Meter said youngsters planning to visit with Santa must have a parent or an adult with them.

While Santa has a very busy schedule, Van Meter said he has agreed to several more visits to Wayne to make certain he has

the opportunity to visit as many youngsters as possible.

Santa will be in Wayne from 7 to 8:30 p.m. on Dec. 12, 13, 14, 15, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22 and from 2 to 4 p.m. on Dec. 16 and 17.

Rick Pomerville, public information director for Wayne State College, has been commissioned by Santa to be his official photographer during his visits to Wayne. Pomerville and

an assistant will be on hand to take color photographs of Santa and his young visitors - a first for Wayne.

Other Wayne downtown activities include carolers on yet to be announced nights, throughout the business district and east and north shopping centers.

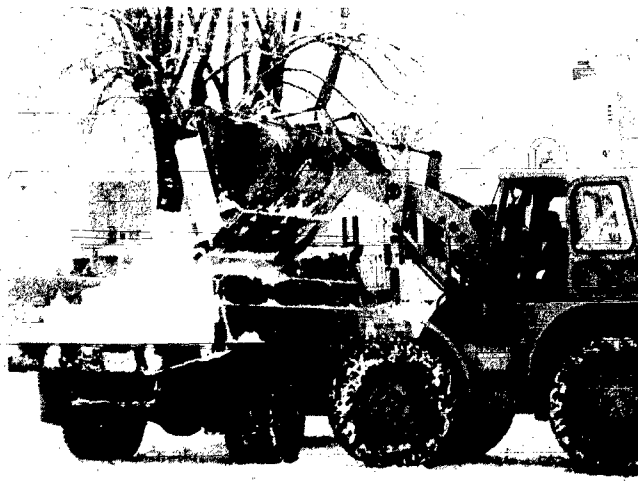
### Fire Destroys Pick Up Truck

## Storm Buries Area in 14 Inches of Snow



The first winter storm of the season last weekend carried a one-two punch as it dumped nearly 14 inches of snow on the Wayneland area in a 48-hour period.

However, it did not deal the knock-out blow... wind... and the area was let off the hook - comparatively speaking.

The storm moved into the area Friday afternoon with a prediction of four to six inches. Street Commissioner Vern Schulz had city crews out bright and early Saturday morning clearing streets and alleys, thinking the storm was about over.

However the fickle nature of weather decided to back up and have another go at making it as miserable as possible, and it just about turned the trick.

City Clerk Bruce Mordhorst said the storm had all the ingredients of a record-breaker...except one. "If there had been a 30 mile-an-hour wind with the storm, we would still be tunneling out from the drifts."

As it was, city crews were able to keep up with the snow accumulation, working throughout the weekend. They were able to keep streets open despite the heavy snow which kept falling throughout the day Saturday and into the night Saturday night.

The storm was bad enough late Saturday afternoon, the state pulled its crews off the highways. Highways were snow-packed and icy.

The storm didn't stop an eight-team high school wrestling match Saturday afternoon. However, it did stop the winning team from Randolph, its coaches, trainers and student fans who spent the night in the Amber Inn, Wayne.

Sunday bloomed bright, clear and cold and the digging out began. While it looked like the end was in sight, the storm lingered long enough to put a Wayne businessman in the hospital after he slipped on ice in the alley behind his place of business late Sunday morning.

Roger Nelson of Swan-McLean Rusty Nail was taken to Providence Medical Center by emergency ambulance where he was treated for a leg injury. The extent of the injury was See **STORM**, page 7

A rural Wakefield family was named third place winner in the farm Northeast of Wakefield, received the honor during the 60th annual meeting of the Farm Bureau.

Included in the honor were Mattes, his wife, Sondra and

their two children, Scott, 4 years old and Sara, two months old.

Mattes farm 320 acres on the "home" place two miles east and three miles north of Wakefield.

He is a graduate of Wakefield high school and attended the University of Nebraska for one year before entering the navy.

He began farming in 1970. This year he had 120 acres of corn, 40 acres of hay, 20 acres of oats, 85 acres of beans with the rest in pastureland.

He feeds about 350 hogs per year and raises calves from a 60-head cow herd in partnership with his father, Joe Mattes of Wakefield. See **HONORED**, page 8

**Look to Kitchen for Heirloom Gifts**

Some gifts, especially something passed down from one generation to another, don't cost a penny and are considered priceless by the receiver.

"A family heirloom doesn't have to be expensive or even unique," says Teresa Shaffer, Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources Extension foods specialist.

"For example," she says, "if you just look around your kitchen, you're bound to find a number of gifts that pass on family memories as well as good wishes."

Kitchen utensils that have been used in the family for years make ideal gifts, she said. They could include toothpick or napkin holders, special rolling pins, antique plates, butter knives or cookie cutters.

Often such gifts enable the continuation of a family food tradition, according to the nutritionist. Families of Norwegian descent, for example, might pass on a lefse rolling pin with special grooves in it for making Norwegian flat bread.

Stamps or a rolling pin with special designs used for making Scandinavian Springle cookies also would make a treasured gift, she noted. Other ideas include a rosette iron for traditional Bohemian cookies or a Spritz cookie mold or press for the ethnic German treat.

When giving such items, the specialist suggested including a favorite recipe of the person who originally owned the item or even a sample. Also, include the history of how the item came into the family and how it was used.

Kitchen utensils don't have to be unique, however, to be cherished. With today's revived interest in family history, many young people would be pleased with something as simple as an egg beater, measuring cup or bread board that their grandmother used, noted Shaffer.

Old cookbooks are another item not to be overlooked when considering family heirlooms from the kitchen. Mark favorite recipes and add personal "success" tips for the recipient.

Or, fill an old candy dish or preserve jar with candy or popcorn for an inexpensive and meaningful gift.

For more exclusive gifts, consider china, cut glass, silver or linens. More expensive keepsakes can be a way to avoid inheritance taxes later which friends and relatives might incur if they were willed an item instead.

"Or, if you don't want to part with things now, give your children, or grandchildren a special note saying you intend for them to have a certain object. Then attach the name to the underside of the object or mention it in your will," she said.

It always pays to doublecheck and Winside wrestling coach Doug Reeves received an early Christmas present Tuesday after he doublechecked the team standings of the Wayne State Wrestling Tournament.

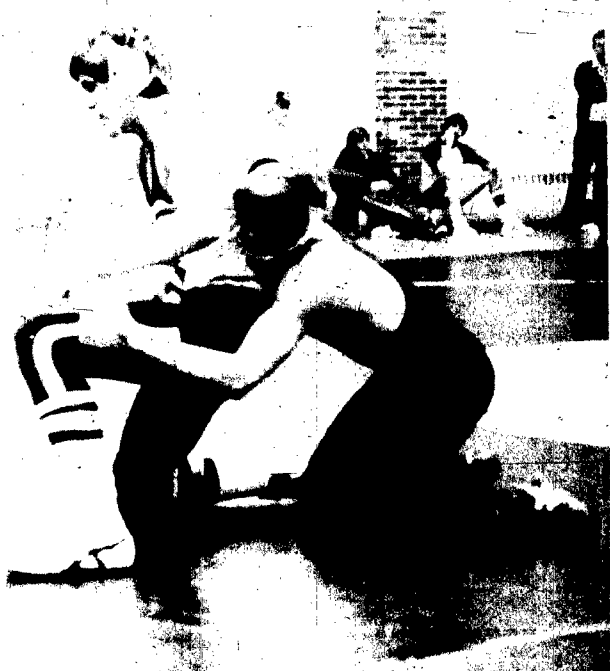

The "Lost Wax" Process

Although mysterious sounding, the so-called "lost wax" method of producing intricate designs in gold jewelry is no mystery. It was developed by the ancient Egyptians in the third century B.C. and used also by the pre-Columbian Indians of South America. Today this process is used by modern designers to produce more than half of the karat gold jewelry made.



MOST JEWELRY is cast in gold using a melted wax process.

Here is how the venerable process works. First, a metal model is made of an original design, say a ring. The model is then used to make a rubber mold. From this mold multiple copies are made in wax. The wax is then affixed to a wax base and plaster of Paris is poured over it. After the plaster hardens, the mold is fired in an oven. In the oven the wax melts or is "lost," leaving a hollow mold. High-speed spinning in a centrifuge forces molten gold lid to every nook and cranny of the mold. The result is a perfect gold replica of the original design. The "lost wax" method enables jewelry manufacturers to produce intricate gold designs in multiples at a mere fraction of the time and cost necessary to make a single original piece of jewelry.

Pilot Plan For Workfare

Able-bodied food stamp recipients aged 18 to 60 living in 14 pilot project areas will be required to "work off" the value of the food stamps they receive, according to Assistant Secretary of Agriculture Carol Tucker Foreman.

In signing final regulations for the pilot "workfare" projects, Foreman said that cities, counties or other political subdivisions already sponsoring public service employment programs or having demonstrated an ability to operate such a program are eligible to conduct the projects. The Food Stamp Act of 1977 specified that the workfare projects be carried out in one urban and one rural area in each of the seven administrative regions of the department's Food and Nutrition Service. The projects will be administered jointly by the department and the U.S. Department of Labor. They are scheduled to begin next spring in conjunction with new food stamp eligibility rules.

Potential sponsors must submit an application within the next 45 days if they want to participate in the program. Basic administrative costs borne by sponsors in running workfare operations will not be federally reimbursed, she said. Under workfare, employable persons 18 to 60 in families receiving food stamps will be required to work off their food stamps if their household's total earned income is less than the value of its food stamps. The number of hours a workfare participant will be required to work will be calculated by subtracting earned income from the dollar value of the food stamps the family receives and dividing the remainder by the federal minimum wage.

Participants must have been unable to find paid employment within 30 days after registering for work. Refusal to comply with workfare requirements will result in suspension of food stamp benefits. Political subdivisions wanting to sponsor a project should apply to Deputy Administrator, Family Nutrition Programs, Food and Nutrition Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, 500 12th Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20250.

operate a workfare pilot project, Foreman said. She said that the department is actively seeking cities, counties, and other political subdivisions that might participate. It is up to the sponsor to determine what type of jobs food stamp recipients will do, Foreman said.

Foreman also said that the culture department will reimburse workfare sponsors for the costs of keeping records needed to evaluate the program. The Agriculture and Labor departments will evaluate the costs, benefits and operational feasibility of the program and submit a report to Congress by October 1980.

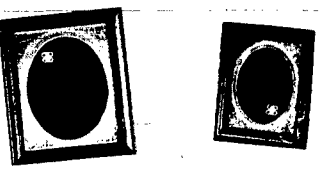

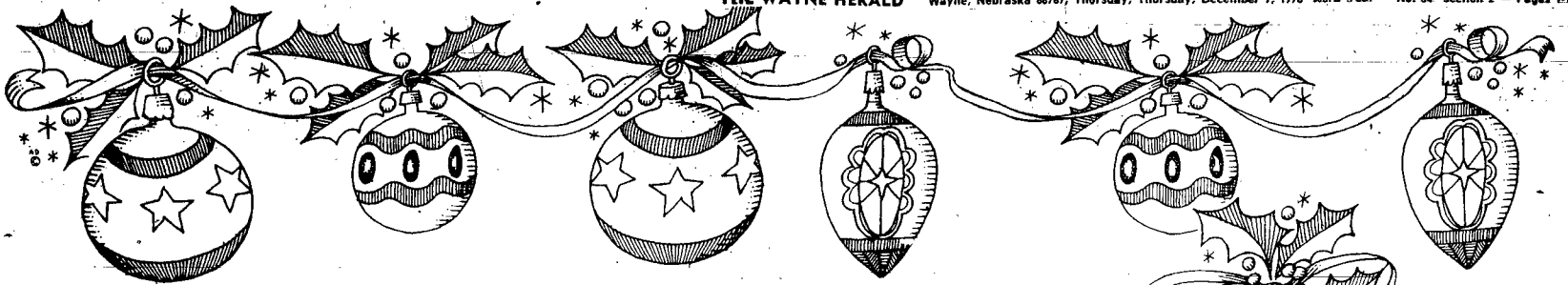

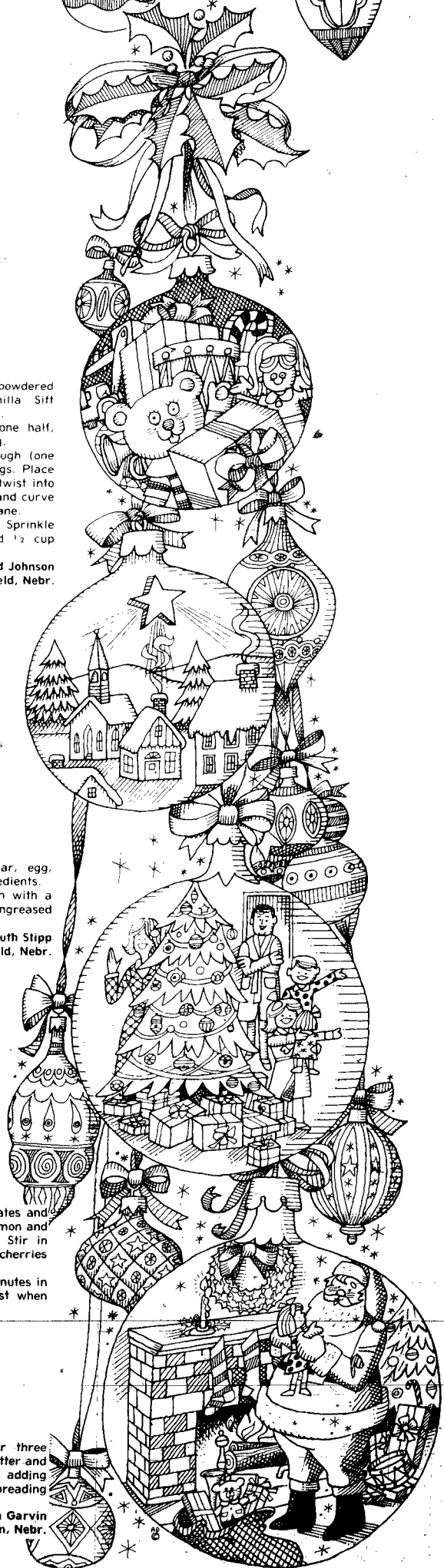

### Quit Jobs; Quit Stamps

Primary wage-earners who quit their jobs without good cause would find their families ineligible for food stamps for two months under a U.S. Department of Agriculture proposal.

Assistant Secretary Carol Tucker Foreman said the proposed regulations will insure that an able-bodied head of household cannot quit a job in order to start receiving food stamps. The proposal implements a provision of the Food Stamp Act of 1977.

"The new rule is consistent with the desire of the Administration and Congress to assure that those not in need of food stamps not receive them, while doing more to get stamps to those who truly are in need, such as the elderly and the working poor," Foreman said.

The proposed rule appeared in the November 24 Federal Register. Comments should be sent to Nancy Snyder, Food and Nutrition Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D.C., 20250. Deadline for receiving comments is Dec. 21.

## Examine Aspects Of Future Planning

The Nebraska State Colleges Board of Trustees will meet on the Wayne State College campus Monday and Tuesday, Dec. 11 and 12 for the Board's December meeting.

In addition to regular business, a special presentation by three Wayne State faculty members will examine various aspects of WSC's planning for the 1980s.

Presented will be information on three topics, including cultural pluralism and its effects on educational institutions, the WSC Pre-College Institute and a scheduled WSC In-Service Faculty and Staff Planning Workshop.

The cultural pluralism topic covers a wide range of definitions but deals primarily with the variety of backgrounds that make up American society. WSC will host a Dec. 14, 15 and 16 conference to examine a ruling by the Nebraska Council on Teacher Education, the accrediting agency for all Nebraska teachers, which says that all Nebraska post-secondary institutions that train teachers must, within five years, have curricula and patterns of staffing and recruiting that reflect the culturally pluralistic society in which we live.

WSC has already initiated action to examine the changes necessary to meet that ruling in the 1980s.

The WSC Pre-College Institute, designed to orient and motivate outstanding high school juniors and seniors to the college environment, will also be discussed in the presentation.

The institute, currently in the planning stages, will provide an opportunity for participants to do college level work during a three-week session held annually during the summer months.

The third portion of the WSC planning presentation, will cover a WSC faculty and staff in-service planning workshop, scheduled for two days in the spring 1979.

The purpose of the workshop will be to develop a planning model for various anticipated changes in the 80s and to familiarize WSC faculty and staff with the need for planning for the future of the college.

Dr. Kent Alm, North Dakota Commissioner of Higher Education, will coordinate the workshop, which will be funded by the Wayne State and Danforth Foundations.



## Survival In A World of Bigness

The independently-owned grocery store near your home may stay in business — despite the growing dominance of supermarkets and retail chain grocery stores in the past few decades.

But to survive, said economist Robert E. Frye of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the store will probably affiliate with a large wholesaler or grocery association or, rather than even compete with supermarket chains, resign itself to serving its customers' "fill-in" needs.

Whatever the outcome, the step will be more in the evolution of the U.S. food retailing business. So far it has gone through several distinct phases during this century, said Frye.

"The mom and pop store dominated the grocery scene at the turn of the century," he said. "From 1910 to 1930, chain-type operations appeared with their efficiencies of vertical integration, standardization and lower prices. Supermarkets brought perishable products and self-service into the grocery store and flourished in the 1930s."

While some small independents and chains withstood competition of large chain stores, many failed, said Frye. Grocery stores reached a peak of about 387,000 in 1939, and dwindled to about half that number by 1972.

With more people to feed and higher per capita incomes than 40 years ago, today's Americans are buying more — not less — food, despite fewer markets. Total grocery store sales soared from \$7.7 billion to \$93.3 billion between 1939 and 1972 — the largest gross sales of any U.S. industry.

"In 1972, 66 percent of total grocery store sales occurred in supermarkets with annual sales of \$1 million or more," said Frye, "but that's also because stores

became larger. In 1953, the average new supermarket had 13,000 square feet. In 1974, it had 26,000."

Meanwhile, the variety of stock items available grew from 867 different items a half century ago to 9,000 by 1974.

"Stores set an accompanying trend toward greater nonfood sales, such as clothing and drugs. From 1963 to 1972, the percentage of sales of food from grocery stores dropped from about 91 to 85 percent," Frye said.

"The advent of food chains — firms with 11 or more stores — is largely a 20th century event. In 1930, chains operated 45,000 stores compared to 2,000 in 1910 — controlled a third of the industry's business. By 1972, they operated 17 percent of all stores and controlled more than half of U.S. grocery store sales."

Other major developments include a "no frills" approach by some stores, Frye said, offering staple products in cut-open shipping cases to minimize overhead and labor costs and permit low gross margins and prices.

Also, some are adopting the universal product code identification system, a code readable by electronic scanners. "Though store owners are slow to install the expensive equipment many recognize the market intelligence and operational control it gives them."

**ROOM FOR RIVALS**

The major chains — those with more than 100 stores — accounted for nearly 40 percent of sales in 1972, with only 13 percent of all stores.

While national chains are prominent in metropolitan markets, there's still room for smaller rivals, Frye said. In 37 cities, one or more of the four top firms in gross sales operated only one store in the U.S. One or

more of the four largest firms in 80 cities operated 2-4 stores and in 62 cities, one or more of the top four firms ran only 5-10 grocery stores.

A factor in the small chain and independents' ability to survive is their growing tendency to

affiliate with large wholesaling firms or to cooperate with other retailers in wholesaling, said Frye.

**LABELS AND NONLABELS**

"Many chains find the use of private labels advantageous. They contract with food processors to package products with their own label at a price below that of leading food manufacturers, which gives the chain a higher gross margin. It also offers customers lower priced substitutes to national brands," said Frye.

Some retailers in recent years have begun to offer a nonlabel line of food and other products called "generics."

Labels on generic brands generally carry only the name of the product and required information on contents. "The products appear to be of lower grade than national or first-line private brands and their prices are well below regular brand prices."

Larger chains gain another advantage, says Frye, by manufacturing product lines such as dairy, bakery, canned, bottled and prepared foods. "That gives them a controlled supply of private label products as well as profits from manufacturing functions."

**ECONOMICS OF SCALE**

Frye said a recent analysis by the department found that, all else equal, direct operating costs in large stores are substantially cheaper per unit of dry groceries than in small stores. Supermarkets four times larger than typical operate at direct per-unit costs of 11 percent less for dry groceries. Stores 13 times larger save 16 percent, he said.

"Payroll advantages are significant, too. Based on 1972 data for 145 of the nation's largest metropolitan areas, payroll expenses were more than 10 percent lower among stores with annual sales of \$4 million than among those of \$1-2 million."

"Large stores and chains can afford to hire specialized technical and managerial help. Also, larger firms can endure low profits — or even lose money — at a particular location because other stores in the chain can hold the chain's overall profits up."

"But," said Frye, "large chains are bigger targets for labor unions and public pressures regarding prices, profits and other issues."

There is concern that large food chains possess the strength to eliminate retail competitors. Food chains also are accused of using their great buying power to hold down prices they pay to farmers and small manufacturers.

But one thing small chains and stores may be able to exploit in competing with large rivals is the flexibility they have meeting the demands of particular customers.

And at the bottom line — profits — smaller stores and chains don't do all that badly, said Frye. "Small firms' profits vary more but while the traditional grocery retailer profit margin of 1 percent of sales after taxes fluctuated widely in recent years, profit rates have averaged slightly higher among independent retailers than among larger firms."

**BRUCELLOSIS VACCINATION**

Two to six months of age is the proper time to vaccinate for brucellosis. Many cattlemen are now working calves and vaccinating replacement heifers. But many cattle are too old when vaccinated.

Cattlemen should not have their heifers vaccinated if over six months of age. Heifers vaccinated older than six months are apt to give false brucellosis tests if they should be tested at a later date. Females kept for breeding purposes need vaccination while those to be fed out do not.

Brucellosis is still around, and it will continue to be around as long as Nebraska cattlemen import animals from southern states.

Vaccination alone isn't good enough because there isn't 100 percent protection.

Quarantine all herd replacements and then retest 30-40 days after vaccination. During quarantine there should be no contact between animals.

The problem is best avoided by routinely vaccinating heifer replacements, testing, quarantining and retesting.

**FOLIAGE PLANTS**

Luxuriant green foliage plants can add an atmosphere of

brightness to your office or home.

Living plants within a room should be blended into the interior decoration scheme.

Philodendrons, pothos, and rubber plants are some of the more popular house plants. They will grow well under the artificial light of an office or a well lighted area of your home.

These plants will grow well in a mixture composed of equal parts of soil, peat moss, or perlite. Such a mixture is less sensitive to over or under watering.

Combine one teaspoon of the mixture with each four inch potful of soil. A weak solution of soluble fertilizer may be added every two or three months.

Water when the soil surface becomes dry. Add enough water so some of it comes out of the drainage hole. Never allow plants to become so dry that they wilt.

Plants have a natural tendency to turn their leaves toward the light. Turning the pot one-quarter turn each week will keep them balanced.

Foliage plants will benefit from an occasional sponging of the leaves with lukewarm water. Plants with fuzzy leaves should not be sponged.

## Rural America Shows Progress

After decades of population loss and economic decline, rural America progressed significantly in improving its social and economic condition during the 1970's, according to a new publication released today by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

"Rural Development Perspectives, prepared by the Economics, Statistics, and Cooperatives Service (ESCS), contains articles on many aspects of rural development, including population trends, women in the rural labor force, rural housing and volunteers in rural communities.

Although agriculture remains the major industry in many rural counties, over 66 percent of rural residents have more than 90 percent of their employment in other industries, reports ESCS demographer Calvin Beale in one of the main articles.

Rural women are joining the labor force in greater numbers, accounting for the vast majority of non-metro job growth in the 1960's, said ESCS economist Jeanne O'Leary. Expanding opportunities, changing family size and structure, inflation and a

changing attitude toward female employment outside the home all help explain the rapid growth of rural women's participation in the labor force.

Rural housing conditions improved dramatically from 1960 to 1976, as the percentage of households in substandard units dropped from 59 to 8 percent. Yet 1.9 million rural households lived in substandard housing in 1976, mainly low-income people, report ESCS agricultural economist Ronald Bird and Ronald Kampe.

Volunteers contribute much to the quality of life in small America, said Thomas F. Stinson, ESCS agricultural economist. By using volunteers, communities can have publicly provided goods and services at a level they could not otherwise afford.
