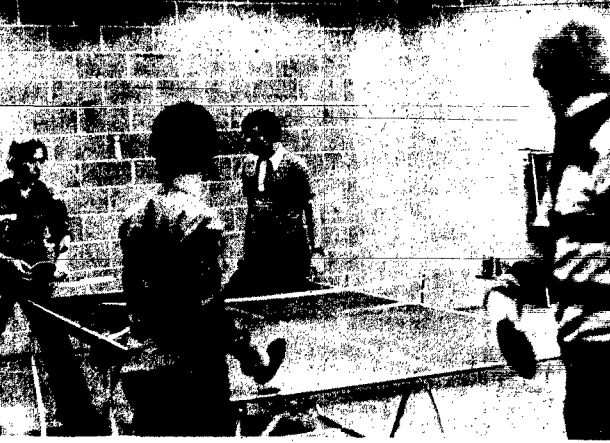
Some 27 Area Students Named to WSC Honor Roll

It was pointed out that cropping rotations are being used by the Andersons to eliminate or minimize the use of pesticides and herbicides. An early cutting of forages has resulted in a high protein feed and a lower total feed cost.

The Andersons have been able to incorporate a unique idea in their calving program which has greatly reduced mortality. It was pointed out that calf housing can be a problem with a dairy operation the size of the Andersons as they are calving throughout the year. Using an old barn or chicken house for calf housing has been a common See SELECTED, page 10.

'Best to You' School Feb. 16

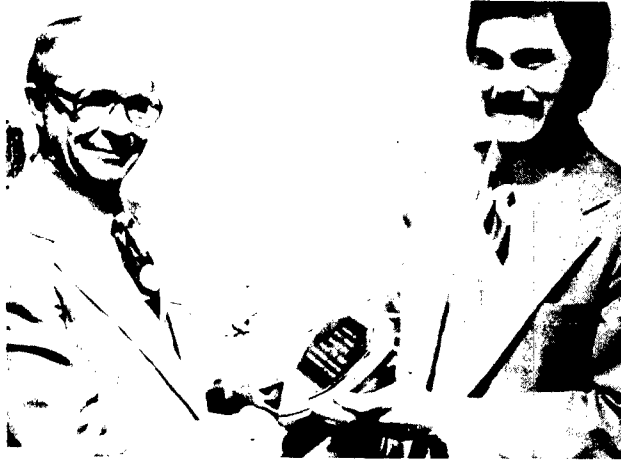
The Wayne Herald is inviting all residents of Wayne and the surrounding area to the "Our Best to You!" Homemakers School.

Burial in Omaha

Services Wednesday for Mrs. Val Peterson

The wife of former Nebraska Governor Val Peterson of Wayne died Sunday in an Omaha hospital following an extended illness.

Memorial services for Elizabeth Peterson, 75, were to be held Wednesday at 2 p.m. at the Fitch and Cole Memorial Chapel in Omaha. The eulogy was delivered by Norman Nordstrand, a retired Wayne State professor and longtime associate of the Petersons in the foreign service.

Private burial was in the Forest Lawn Cemetery, Omaha.

Born Elizabeth Howells Pleak in Omaha, Mrs. Peterson was the daughter of Robert Howells Pleak, a retail food dealer, and Mary Chapman Pleak. She attended elementary school and high school in Iowa, where her family had moved.

Mrs. Peterson attended Rockford College in Illinois before attending the University of Nebraska, where she was graduated with a degree in education.

She met Val Peterson in Carroll where he was a teacher-coach and she was a high school English teacher. They were married in 1929 and lived in Kimball for a time before he was given a teaching fellowship and went to the University of Nebraska.

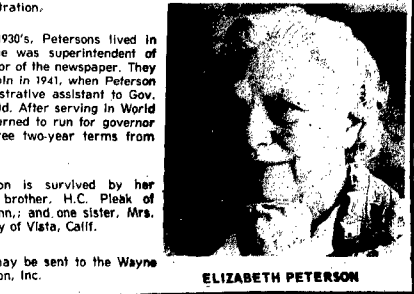
Petersons had made their home in Wayne since 1973, when they moved from Helsinki, Finland, where he had served as U.S. ambassador since 1969. Before that they had made their home in Hastings after his service as a Civil Defense administrator and Ambassador to Denmark (1957-61) during the Eisen-

hower administration.

During the 1930's, Petersons lived in Elgin where he was superintendent of school and editor of the newspaper. They moved to Lincoln in 1941, when Peterson was an administrative assistant to Gov. Dwight Griswold. After serving in World War II, he returned to run for governor and served three two-year terms from 1947-53.

Mrs. Peterson is survived by her widower; one brother, H.C. Pleak of Emporium, Penn.; and one sister, Mrs. Eleanor Bradley of Vista, Calif.



 practice, but the Andersons have come up with a new idea.

They use calf hutches for their new born. The hutches are individual plywood boxes open on one end for each calf to be tied. The hutches are placed four feet apart so each calf is isolated.

It was noted the Andersons at one time had a string of 78 calves without a loss and losses for four years are below two percent.

The impact upon the community of Wayne was pointed out through the production of

pounds of milk during 1978. The Anderson herd produced more than one million pounds of milk which equates to more than 100 quarts of milk for every person living in Wayne.

And it was noted that as most of the grain ration is purchased, the Anderson operation provides a market for more than \$20,000 of locally produced grain.

Anderson is busy in agriculture activities and organizations, having served on 4-H councils in both Wayne and Dodge counties, served on the Dodge County Extension Board, is a member of the Mid-America Dairyman and served as a delegate to the annual meeting, is a member of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America, is a member of the Nebraska Holstein Breeders and is presently vice president of the Northern Plains Holstein Breeders Association, a member of the Midwest Breeders Cooperative, is a member of the Farm Bureau Federation presently serving a second term as county president and past National Affair chairman and is starting his 19th year as a 4-H club leader.

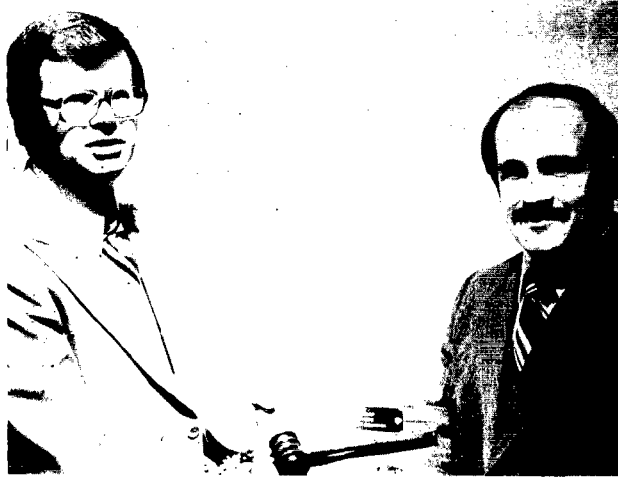

Trees Economical

Many Advantages To Windbreaks

Those who remember the Dirty '30s have tales to tell about black clouds, sleeping with wet cloths on their faces and stuffing rags around windows in vain efforts to stop the dust from forcing its way into homes.

Mostly, they don't want to see such a phenomenon again. Increasing windbreak plantings is one way to prevent another era of dust storms, but it's also a way to grow better crops, protect cattle, reduce home heating and cooling costs, slow down erosion and create more timber.

The Clarke McNary tree distribution program provides trees to rural landowners at a cost of \$17.25 per hundred, delivered, or \$14.25 per hundred picked up at the Bessey Nursery in the Nebraska National Forest near Halsey. They must be used for windbreaks, woodlots, wildlife habitat, erosion control or Christmas tree plantings.

James Brandie, assistant professor of forestry, fisheries and wildlife in the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources, University of Nebraska Lincoln, said there are definite crop production advantages with windbreaks — more advantages for some crops than others.

"Corn is more drought sensitive so it stands to gain more (with a

windbreak)," Brandie said. Windbreaks offer crop protection and erosion control by reducing wind speed through the area, he said. Any other effects a windbreak may produce are results of reduced wind speed.

"The United States really doesn't use the windbreaks to the fullest," he said. What Americans do plant must be adaptable and serve several purposes, he said. Besides crop protection or livestock protection, windbreaks also serve useful purposes as wildlife habitat, woodlots and in home heating and cooling reductions.

Bill Lovett, UNL assistant professor of forestry, fisheries and wildlife and tree improvement forester, said there has been a tremendous rate of windbreak removal in recent years.

This is partly due to the advent of center pivot irrigation systems, which need a large area to operate. Windbreaks often are in the pivot's path and the trees are taken out.

Some of the old windbreaks planted by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the Dust Bowl days have not been cared for adequately and are being removed, Lovett added. When possible, younger trees are being planted alongside the older, more established windbreaks to keep new stock coming up, he said.

"The older farmers recognize the value of windbreaks, where the younger farmers may not," Lovett said. "The older farmers remember the Dirty '30s and have seen the yield increases possible where windbreaks have been used."

The trees to plant may vary a little depending on the area of

the state. Lovett and Brandie indicated Eastern red cedar is the best overall tree to use, but has best adaptability in the eastern portion of Nebraska. Rocky mountain juniper also is a dense conifer, but has its best adaptability from North Platte westward. All the pines are good to plant, Lovett said, as they add height to the windbreak. Cedar has the advantage of not

losing foliage at the bottom. Hardwoods also can be used, although they don't provide as much protection in the winter. Lovett said Siberian elms often are used — and they don't have the disease problems that the American elms have, he noted. Lovett noted that the minimum standards for a three-row, soil conservation Service cost-shared windbreak are all rows

of cedar, a four row windbreak would consist of three rows of cedar and one possibly of pine. A five row windbreak might include three of cedar, one of pine and one of hardwood.

With all the obvious advantages, Lovett and Brandie pointed out some not so obvious advantages of windbreaks, including noise reduction along county roads.

BEDDING FOR CATTLE

In an experiment several years ago, feedlot cattle at the Dickinson, North Dakota Experiment Station has been successfully housed with only a slatted board fence for protection in a trial to determine what advantage bedding the animals and building up a manure pack would have on winter gains and feed efficiency.

In the trial, replacement heifers were allotted to two lots. Both lots had a nine foot high slatted board fence shelter on the north and west sides. One lot of heifers was bedded at weekly intervals, and more often when the weather made it necessary. The other lot received no bedding during the entire trial.

The heifers received a high roughage growing ration and were wintered for 197 days, starting in November. It has always been considered good practice to bed cattle when possible. The use of straw bedding improved the average daily gain of the heifers by 0.5 pound. The heifers not bedded were not adversely affected by the lack of bedding except for the slightly lower gain. The animals in both lots remained in good health throughout the trial.

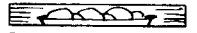
Ways To Kill Cattle Lice

Methods for control of cattle lice during cold winter months include use of dust bags, back rubbers and spot-on pour-on treatments that do not wet cattle, according to Bob Roselle, Extension entomologist in the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

According to the University of Nebraska-Lincoln expert, sprays may be used when the temperature is above 40 degrees. Spraying during freezing temperatures would be uncomfortable for cattle, Roselle said.

"The peak of lice populations is reached usually in March," Roselle said, noting that because lice reproduce most rapidly during winter months, fall is the best time to seek control. Chemicals approved by the Environmental Protection Agency for lice control include Co-Ral, Ruelene, Melhoxychlor, Toxaphene, Malathion, Korlan, Warbox, Rabon and combinations such as RaVap. Roselle said, cautioning the user to check labels for proper usage.

Most 1978 Farm Machine Accidents Were Caused By Unsafe Practice

The machine shield and roll over protective structures (ROPS) have done their jobs in reducing farm machine injuries and deaths, but now it's up to people to do the rest.

Only two or three of the 33 Nebraska farm accident fatalities recorded in 1978 were directly caused by farm equipment, said Rollin Schnieder, extension safety specialist in the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources, University of Nebraska Lincoln. He pointed out that most of the injuries and deaths were caused by unsafe practices.

"Farm equipment safety fared slightly better in 1978 than the previous year, but I don't know if we're going to reach a plateau," Schnieder said. "We can't expect 'hardware' to do the whole job in preventing accidents."

Although the 1978 farm injury accident record has been compiled only up to mid-December as yet, Schnieder said he expects the breakdown to be much the same as the past two years. He said 98 injuries and 33 deaths as resulting from farm accidents were reported up to that point in 1978, compared to 113 accidents and 34 deaths recorded in 1977.

The specialist noted that tractor overturn fatalities have been reduced over the years because of increased use of roll over protective structures, and an extensive tractor safety education program that has involved many people. While the seven overturn fatalities in 1978 were more than anyone would like, it is considerably less than the 20 to 25 persons killed

annually in tractor accidents during the 1960s and early 1970s, he said.

Power takeoff accidents have shown a slight decrease, he noted. Machinery guarding legislation has been effective in requiring better manufacturer shields, but old, unshielded equipment and the removal of shields by operators increase the risk of being caught in the open power drive.

At least one type of farm accident has shown no appreciable decrease, however, and a new type of accident has cropped up during the past year, he pointed out. Animal accidents, usually involving horses and young people, have claimed about five lives a year over the past 15 years.

A new problem appearing in 1978, involved improper use of nylon ropes and resulted in two deaths. "Nylon rope will stretch up to 33 percent of its length under stress," Schnieder explained. "If a nylon rope strung between a tractor and a load is extended by a chain and the chain breaks, the rope acts like a giant rubber band. It can snap back and send whatever is attached to the end of it — a clevis, shackle or part of the broken chain — rocketing into the operator."

Schnieder related a potentially fatal incident in which a clevis, powered by the whipping action of the nylon rope to which it was

Crop Improvement Examined

Growing acreage devoted to sunflower production, performance of new grain varieties and promotional efforts aimed at increasing the market for American soybeans were reported to those attending the annual Nebraska Crop Improvement Days program Monday afternoon in Columbus.

Charles Moses, Interstate Seed & Grain Co., Fargo, N.D., suggested that sunflowers, an oilseed crop, might be considered as an alternative crop in parts of Nebraska. He projected a continuation of the trend toward increased production of sunflowers in the four major

producing states — Minnesota, North and South Dakota and Texas — with a prediction that the bright yellow-headed crop will ultimately occupy 10 million acres.

Moses said new hybrids have greatly improved sunflower production, and listed drought-resistance and relative ease of carrying out cultural practices as other pluses. He expressed optimism that new processing plants might be built in the northern great plains to take care of the increased volume of sunflowers, putting some potential growers closer to a market.

Dr. John Schmidt, wheat breeder in the UNL Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources reported on three years of data showing superior per-

formance of newly-released wheat varieties Bennett and Centurk 7, and Centurk. Bennett, a cross of Homestead with a sister line of Buckskin, is an early, moderately winter-hardy variety best adapted to south central and southeastern Nebraska. Schmidt termed Bennett "a really good wheat," and said Centurk 7, selected from a five-head selection from Centurk, has slightly but consistently exceeded Centurk in performance. He said Larned winter wheat, selected in Kansas, has the highest level of Hessian fly resistance available in adapted varieties. Schmidt noted that 1978 featured the

most extensive infestation of Hessian flies in recent years. Schmidt also reported on Nebraska research on the merits of winter and spring varieties of triticale, a cross of wheat and rye. "We really don't have anything" in the way of promise for winter triticale under Nebraska conditions, Schmidt said. He expressed the belief that commercial varieties of winter triticale fall short of being desirable for Nebraska growers by being either "too tall, too late or (having) too poor a seed."

Over the period 1975-78, Schmidt said Lang oats, selected in Illinois, has performed well and has demonstrated a higher yield potential than varieties of similar maturity. There are not great differences in oat varieties, Schmidt explained, but he termed the development of Lang as "really a step up."

Ken Bader, chief executive officer of the American Soybean Association of St. Louis, Mo., and a former University of Nebraska Lincoln administrator, traced the development of the commodity, which he termed "the Miracle Golden Bean." Bader said both acreage devoted to soybeans and its market price have tripled since 1956.

attached, shot through the half-inch differential housing on a crawler tractor. "If the metal had struck the driver instead of the tractor, it would have destroyed him," he said.

In addition, accidents involving chain saws are increasing and mishaps with power takeoffs, augers and elevators are a constant problem, Schrieder said. Winter accidents frequently are caused by heavy cumbersome clothing and slick surfaces.

"January and February will bring an upsurge in accidents with feed grinder and tractor accidents rising in the spring," he said. "Baler accidents and falls from horses predominate in the summer and auger and elevator accidents generally increase with the onset of the harvest season.

"Once all reasonable safety improvements have been made upon a piece of equipment, though, the best thing farmers can do to avoid dangerous accidents is to know the capabilities of their equipment and to exercise caution in working with machines."

American Dollar Sinking, But Corn Market Strong

Although American travelers may not be happy about the sinking dollar, the nation's grain farmers can thank it for this year's unexpectedly strong corn market, according to an Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources extension marketing specialist.
Dr. Mike Turner, a University of Nebraska Lincoln professor of agricultural economics, explained that despite the government's recent efforts to bolster the plunging dollar, the currency's value is "considerably below what it was a year ago."
He said the United States buys more from foreign countries than it sells, which has caused a negative balance of payment.
"Foreign countries, particularly the Arab nations, have accumulated rather large quantities

of U.S. dollars," Turner said. "They're now looking at the United States to decide what to spend their dollars on."
"Many foreign nations are happy to bid aggressively for our grain, even though they don't anticipate buying a lot," Turner said. "They would rather have grain than dollars."
Turner noted that there had been many reasons to believe the 1978 corn market would not be particularly strong. Farmers added to the amount of reserves for the third year in a row, as a result of a record corn crop, and there was a potentially record high foreign crop, he pointed out.
The export situation was stable and even slightly lower than it was a year ago," he said. "Everyone was concerned with storage and transportation problems."
There was a slight increase in livestock numbers, but not enough to cause a reduction in reserves, Turner stated.
He explained that a recent government loan program has allowed farmers to borrow funds to pay bills and handle family living expenses, while "holding their grain in rather tight hands."
Turner said he expects the corn market picture to remain bright, despite government efforts to strengthen the dollar.
"Making the dollar stronger won't hurt the price of corn," Turner said. "It's just a temporary solution and I think the dollar will be in trouble again in less than a year."
