The number 13 proved to be unlucky for the Wayne State Wildcats as they were eliminated 13-3 by Southeast Oklahoma State and 13-10 by Black Hills State in the double elimination NAIA Area 3 playoffs Thursday and Friday at Hutchinson, Kan.

The Wildcats won their opening game 7-6 against Black Hills, Thursday, but lost to Southeast Oklahoma later that day. The Wildcats then lost their second match with Black Hills to finish 23-22 on the season.

"We had a good season overall," said interim coach Steve Anson. "The guys came a long way and we beat some teams we weren't supposed to beat. I'm very proud of the team and there certainly is a lot of potential for next year."

Black Hills jumped to an early 7-1 lead in Friday's match. WSC rallied to lead 8-7 in the top of the sixth inning.

Black Hills then gained five runs in the bottom of the 6th, with a series of slowly tapped hits in the infield.

"That was the inning that hurt us," Anson said. "The trouble was the Black Hills players were not hitting the ball hard enough and we couldn't get to the ball fast enough."

Black Hills scored again in the

8th with WSC managing only two more runs in the 9th. Mark Westergaard was the losing pitcher, finishing 5-6 on the season.

## SECOND GAME

Southeast Oklahoma State defeated Wayne State College, 13-3, Thursday, in the second round of the playoffs.

Wayne State, which had defeated Black Hills State 7-6 earlier in the day, committed five errors against Southeast Oklahoma. Black Hills State eliminated the defending national champions, Emporia State, 8-7. Emporia had lost to Southeast Oklahoma, 8-7 in opening play Friday.

Southeast Oklahoma gathered four home runs in the game against WSC. Neil Blohm of Allen was the losing pitcher for the Wildcats. Blohm was hindered by a poor five hits for the normally slugging Wayne State. Gary Sipe of Southeast Oklahoma earned the win.

The victory was narrow for WSC, the game was tied at 1-1 in the top of the fifth inning when Schwartz, a .393 hitter this season, belted a grand slam home run. The Wildcats, who committed six errors in the game, were later in trouble, however, giving up 2 runs in the seventh and eighth innings, tying the game at 6-6 going into the top of the ninth. Schwartz came to the rescue again, hitting his second home run of the game and providing the winning margin for WSC.

Darrell Mueller started for Wayne State but was relieved in the eighth by Dewey Edgar, who earned the win.

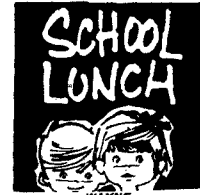

## Four Courses For SLD Teachers

Four courses designed to help teachers of students with specific learning disabilities (SLD) will be offered in the Wayne area this summer through the Wayne State College Extended Campus Division. The courses are offered as part of the SLD Endorsement Program for teachers.

The first course, "Principles of SLD," will be held from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., June 11-15, in the Birch Room of the Student Center at WSC. The two-credit, graduate-level course is designed to develop a basic understanding of specific learning disabilities and to examine topics ranging from recognizing the SLD child to help parents identify specific learning differences.

"Language Arts for the SLD Child," will be held from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., June 25, and from 1 to 5 p.m., June 26-29, at the Wayne Elementary School. Participants in the four-credit graduate course will work in actual classroom situations with supervision and instruction by recognized authorities in the field of specific learning disabilities.

A final SLD course, "Advanced Practicum," will be offered for those who have taken the Practicum course. Advanced Practicum also runs from 8:30 a.m. to noon, July 9-31, at the Wayne Elementary School. The four-credit graduate course is an elective for the 30-hour SLD endorsement program. Participants will work as a team, along with language arts therapists, to develop classroom management procedures and assist regular classroom teachers with prescriptive teaching.

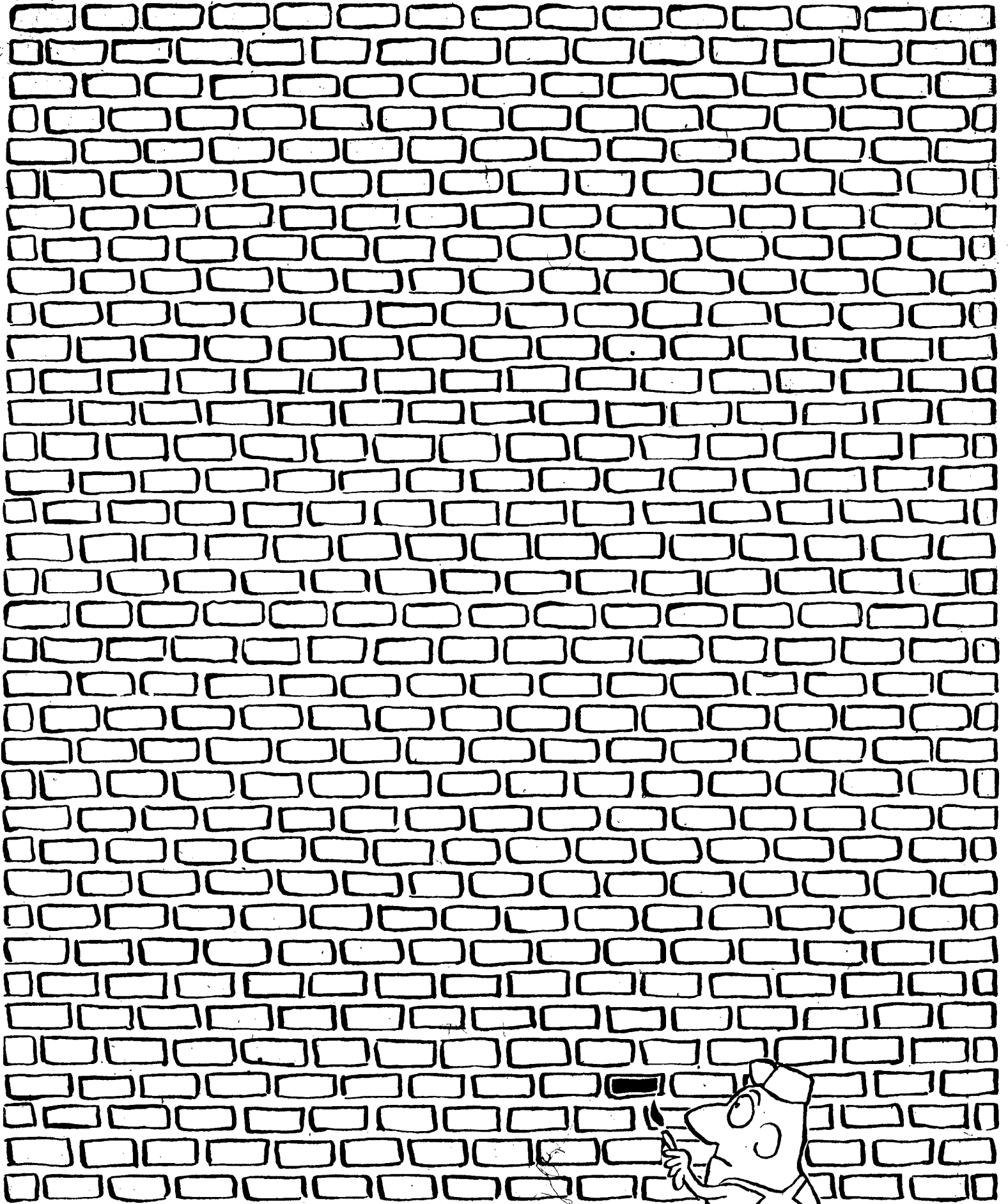

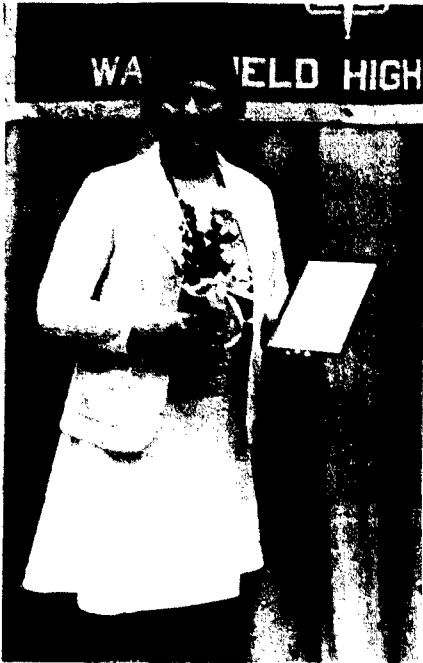

years old in 1984, according to the Rev. Crabtree. He said there are some 49 churches in the district with one application being reviewed.

"We have what we call the 'Mother Church' which provides the leadership for the new churches," the Rev. Crabtree explained. "As soon as the new church is able to get along on its own, it becomes an independent and separate entity," he said.

The Rev. Crabtree said the district has targeted some 29 churches to be constructed by volunteer labor in the next ten years. "This figure has evolved out of a survey which has prompted a progressive church building plan," he explained.

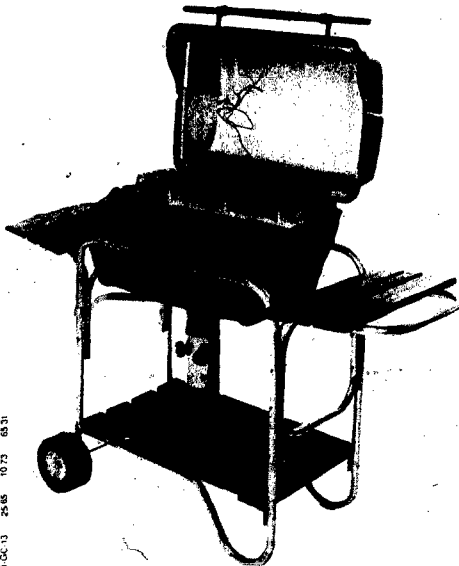

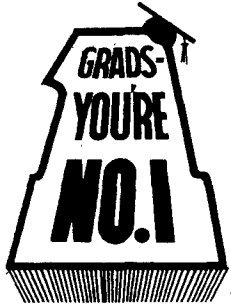
