### Back to school

A common question lately is, "Where did the summer go?" Back to school ads are being featured on radio, television and in print. The first days of school are only two weeks away. That may make parents feel joyful or pressured. If your school children outgrew everything over the summer, the threat of back to school clothes shopping may hang over your head. The following hints will help make your shopping easier and a little less painful.

**AS WITH MANY** large tasks the key is organization. Get out all the wearable school clothes and have a fitting party.

The two requirements are patience and cooperative children. While the kids model the clothes, make notes of what fits, garment colors and items that are needed.

Before you let the children get away, check their measurements for your notes.

Now you can sit down with a glass of iced tea and make your shopping lists. Using index cards or a small notebook, you can list the items each child needs.

Make a note of sizes, color preferences and any special likes or dislikes. This should help you keep things straight after your mind is fogged from shopping for several hours.

**AS YOU DO YOUR** shopping, try to color coordinate clothing. A little help from you, and your children can learn to coordinate what they wear on school mornings.

Sometimes the small things make the mad dash to get ready for school easier.

For younger children, keep in mind their abilities to manipulate buttons, zippers and other closures.

Fronts and backs should be clearly marked. There could be tags in side, an applique, bow or buttons on front.

Large buttons and snaps are easier for small fingers to manipulate. An elastic waistband in shorts, skirts and slacks can be more easily pulled on.

Select necklines and ribbings that allow for plenty of stretch so your child doesn't get stuck with a shirt halfway over his head.

**BUYING CLOTHES** that can be layered will keep your child more comfortable.

Several lightweight layers will be warmer and make it easier for them to regulate their temperature. Garments that can be taken off while the child plays and put back on in the classroom are more logical.

Examine the clothes you buy for quality construction details. Points of strain at knees, elbows and pockets should be reinforced.

Some of this you can do at home. Attach patches on the wrong side of the garment at knees and elbows with a fusible web.

**A FINAL CONSIDERATION** for parents is care of the garment. Select clothes that will be easy to clean and not require special treatment. Printed fabrics won't show soil or wrinkles as easily as do solid colors.

For those who want to sew some of the children's clothes, there is helpful information in an extension publication.

## Puppet power

### Unique puppets open door for interaction between non-disabled and handicapped

Several Wayne area residents began training last week with The Kids on the Block. The Kids on the Block are puppets recently purchased by the Region IV Developmental Disabilities Council. Jan Nowak, a spokesman for Region IV, said The Kids on the Block are a specially designed group of puppets designed to teach children to interact with handicapped youngsters.

The Kids on the Block consist of six puppets which in appearance and characterization represent a cross-section of a typical group of children, each totally unique, with definite likes and dislikes, hopes and fears, talents and limitations. The puppets include Mark, who is confined to a wheelchair, Renaldo, who is blind, and Mandy, who is deaf and "speaks" with her hands.

She said although the puppets' characteristics and personalities are outlined in a teacher's guide provided with them, they are flexible and can be adapted to fit particular situations or circumstances. NOWAK ADDED that the teacher's guide contains step-by-step directions for operating the puppets as well as photographs illustrating the proper procedures.

NOWAK SAID the puppets have proven to be excellent communicators because they can be manipulated and animated to express just about any thought, feeling, attitude or situation. Nowak added that children inclined to be reticent with adults will almost always freely interact and respond to the puppets.

The three other puppets are "normal" children whose small disabilities, including a weight problem and myopia, serve to help bridge the initial gap between them. NOWAK SAID although the puppets were purchased by the Region IV Developmental Disabilities Council, area volunteers are needed to operate them and present programs throughout the 20 county area in Northeast Nebraska served by Region IV.

Also included in the guide are 10 classroom proven scripts which feature all of the puppets in various situations, as well as suggestions for follow up discussions. Nowak said persons interested in training as puppeteers with The Kids on the Block are asked to call Region IV at 375 2880.

Created by an expert on special education and the mainstreaming of handicapped children, The Kids on the Block have received nationwide attention and have been hailed by both parents and educators as illustrating different ways to interact.

Nowak stressed that it is not necessary to have a degree in creative dramatics or puppetry to do justice to The Kids on the Block.

In addition to Wayne, other training sessions are planned in Norfolk, Columbus and O'Neill. Nowak said that once trained, puppeteers will be called upon to present puppet shows to schools and other interested groups throughout the area.

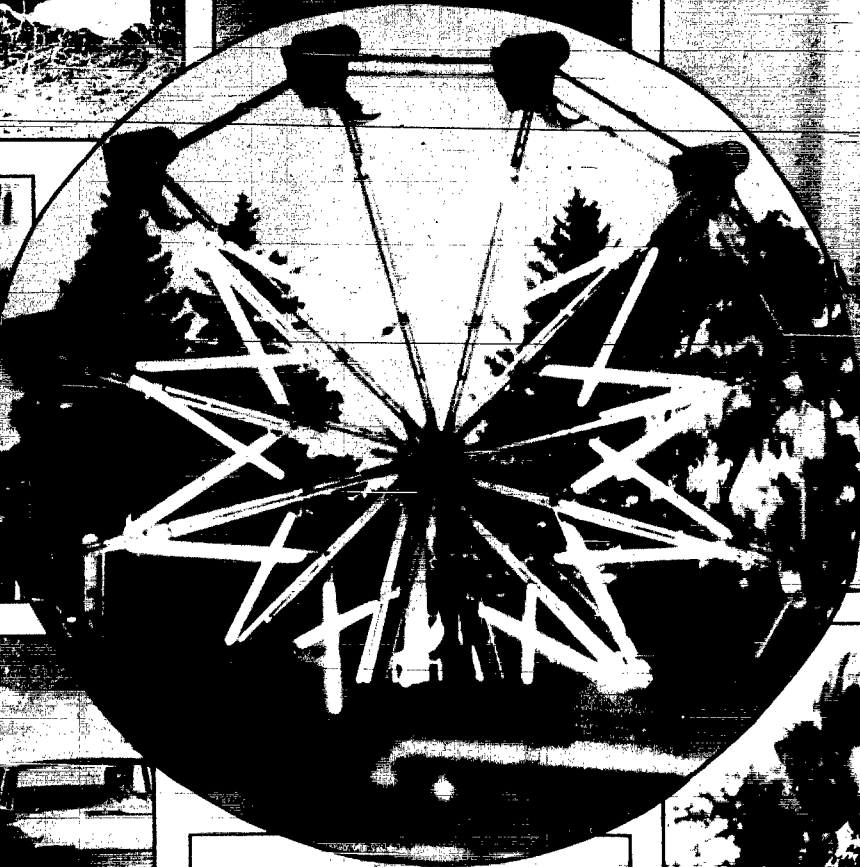

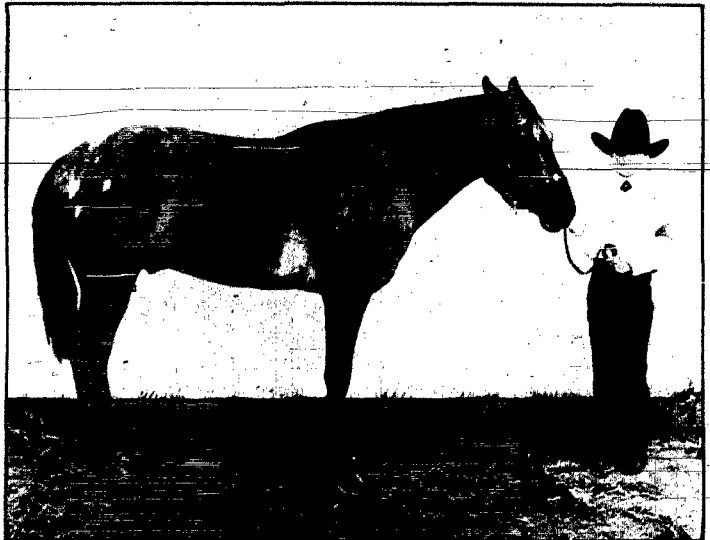

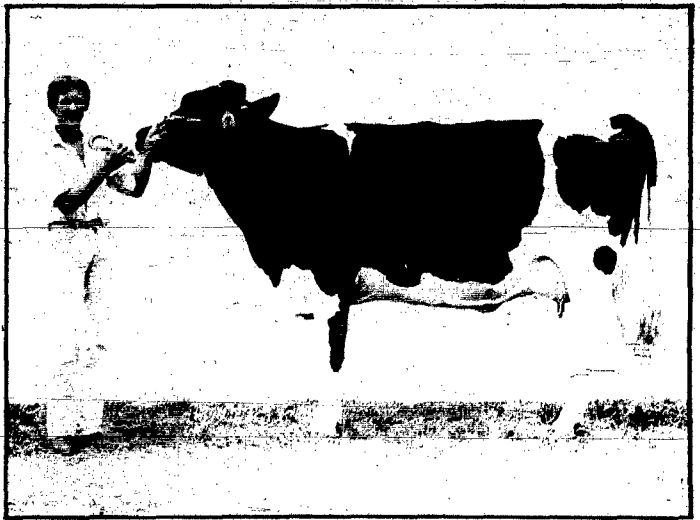

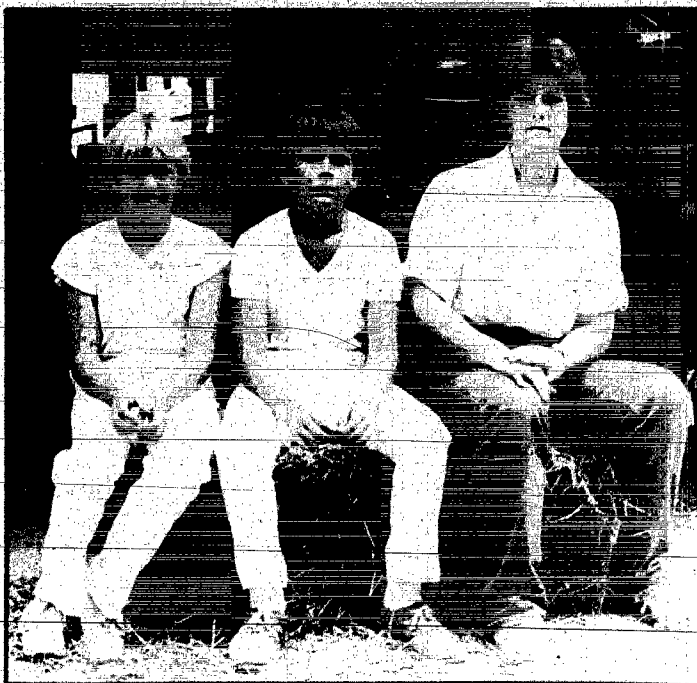

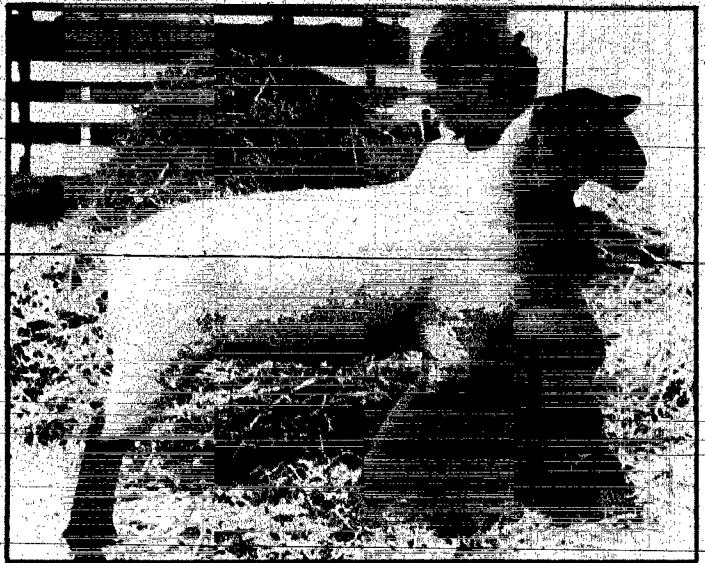
