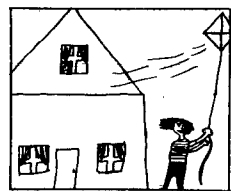

Dixon County Fair opens on Saturday

A rainbow of fun and amusement is being planned for this year's three-day Dixon County Fair, slated for Saturday through Wednesday (Aug. 12-16).

Rainbow Amusements will be providing the midway rides at the Dixon County Fairgrounds near Concord.

Events begin on Saturday with the Dixon County Fair Stampede that starts at 8 a.m. at the fairgrounds. During the four years that this run has been conducted, it has attracted runners from as far away as Japan and Finland.

This year's race is being redesigned to appeal to a wider variety of runners.

It will include a 4K walk for both men and women and a fun run for children-age 13 and under.

It will include divisions for ages 9 and under; ages 10-11; ages 12-13; a 4K run for men and women; and an 8K run for men and women.

Anyone interested in participating should contact Rev. James Moores, Ponca, at 755-2770 to register or to gain more information. Registration prior to Aug. 8 will save \$2 off the full registration fee.

The first 100 registered will receive a Stampede T-shirt.

SUNDAY KICKS off the 4-H judging at the Dixon County Fair. At 2 p.m. will be the 4-H and Open Class Rabbit judging event.

That evening, starting at 8 p.m., will be the annual Vesper Service event along with a flag raising ceremony and presentation of the Pioneer Farm Family and other special awards.

Monday's events include the 4-H horse show at 9 a.m.; 4-H food, garden, and home economics judging at 10:30 a.m.; 4-H open class dairy and goat judging at 1

p.m.; the sanctioned micro-mini tractor and pickup pull at 1:30 p.m.; 4-H dog, cat and household pet show judging at 2 p.m.; 4-H and open class poultry judging; the free barbecue that starts at 5 p.m.; open class Horse Play Days at 7 p.m.; entertainment by the Marsha Kaye Country Variety Music performance beginning at 8 p.m.; and the free square dance that starts at 9:30 p.m.

Starting off Tuesday's events will be the 4-H and open class beef judging at 8 a.m.; the farm and antique tractor pull at 1:30 p.m.; 4-H watermelon feed at 4 p.m.; 4-H ag olympics at 5 p.m.; the horse and dairy member parade at 6:30 p.m.; an Allen Junior Cheerleader Skit at 7:30 p.m.; musical entertainment with the group "Country with a Touch of Brass" that starts at 8 p.m.; and a free teen dance with Mr. Tunes beginning at 9:30 p.m.

THE FINAL day of the fair will feature the 4-H and open class swine judging contest at 8 a.m.; 4-H open class sheep judging at 10 a.m.; the Kiddie Pedal Tractor Pull at 1 p.m.; 4-H style revue and presentation of trophies at 3 p.m.; 4-H small animal and livestock member parade at 5:30 p.m.; grand parade of horses, antique autos and machinery at 6:30 p.m.; an ice cream social by the 4-H Council; a smashing demolition derby, put on by the Wakefield Demo Team, starting at 8 p.m.; and a free dance, with music by Donna Bourn at 9:30 p.m.

Approval given to rezone several lots in Sunnyview

A resolution to rezone three lots within one block in the Sunnyview Subdivision from Residential 2 to Residential 3 was approved Tuesday night by the Wayne City Council.

John Vakoc of Wayne, owner of the property, is considering the construction of rental apartments on the property. Currently, the R-2 zoning allows approximately nine apartment units on the three lots. Plans call for at least 12 apartment units at the present time.

"The demand for new single family homes seems to be stagnant right now. But there is an exceptionally strong demand for rental apartments," Vakoc told the city council during their meeting Tuesday evening.

He said a recent survey his firm conducted had shown it would be a justified investment in adding more apartment units to the community.

There are presently three single

family lots abutting the proposed apartment property — one reason why the zoning request was made. "We anticipate there could be some zoning problems with that in the future," mentioned Vakoc.

COUNCILMAN Darrel Heier said he had heard concerns from individuals who reside near the proposed apartment area were worried that the apartment complexes would affect their property values.

Vakoc said it was his opinion that the completion of the project would be enhancing surrounding property values "more than anything that would happen to be out there."

"There will be a finished lot with structures on it rather than just a vacant lot," he said.

The project could also serve as an impetus to complete the East View Street paving.

A motion to allow the rezoning of Lots 3, 4 and 5 in Block 1 of the Sunnyview Subdivision was approved by the city council. A motion to waive the second and

third reading of the ordinance was also approved 5-2 — with council members Jane O'Leary and Heier casting the no votes.

Heier had the lone no vote when the motion came to pass the rezoning resolution.

IN OTHER action, the city council:

— Accepted the application for membership of Thomas Geu as a member of the Wayne Volunteer Fire Department.

— Approved special designated liquor permits for El-Toro Lounge (class reunion at the National Guard Armory) and the Windmill (wedding dance at the Armory).

— Awarded the bid on the city's power plant cooling modifications to E. L. Black and Sons of Dakota City in the amount of \$29,950.

— And approved the establishment of the City of Wayne Audit Committee. To serve on the committee will be city council members Sheryl Lindau, Darrel Fuelberth and Darrel Heier.

Aide visits Wayne County to understand the farming life

Don Liedman, president of the Wayne County Farm Bureau, had a guest at this year's Wayne County Fair who didn't seem to know a whole lot about farming.

His guest, Jon Traub, is one of 12 participants in a Nebraska program that has urban congressional aides experience firsthand the lifestyles and problems facing constituents in rural-oriented counties and cities. Traub is from the legislative office of Representative Curt Weldon of Pennsylvania.

The legislative assistants' visit is being sponsored by Nebraska Farm Bureau Federation with cooperation from the Liedman family and 11 other Farm Bureau families. First District Congressman Doug Bereuter and his staff recommended the legislative assistants who were invited to participate in the program.

on Friday, Aug. 4 and, after spending some time at the Liedman home, returned Monday, Aug. 7 for his return flight to Washington. He was viewing the livestock entries and 4-H exhibits at the Wayne County Fair on Friday.

"I lived for about 10 years in Minnesota. But I've had no farm background to speak of," said the aide from the Philadelphia area.

Traub said he was "really impressed" with the Wayne County Fair since he has such an urban background. And he feels more informed about the farming community as it now exists.

He said he now has "double the respect" for the people who work on the small farms.

"I can now appreciate all the work and effort that goes into farming. They have to battle the weeds, the worms, the weather, other producers, sometimes the banks and let's not forget the government," said Traub.

"THIS IS A lot more than just putting the seeds in the ground

and watching them grow," he added.

There is no farming in Weldon's legislative district. "But they all have to eat. The Congress should be aware of the people who produce the food. It is important to understand the struggles that these farm families have, just to keep their head above the water," said Traub.

Traub added that he won't go back to Washington as an expert on the nature of farming. But he will have the necessary ammunition to understand legislation about the impact on farm programs when it comes before Congress in bill form.

"Lord knows that the government doesn't help farmers that much," he said.

Liedman said last Friday that Traub would be given tours of grain and livestock farms, hog operations, cattle feedlots and dairy farms in the Wayne County area.

Area volunteers such as doctors, optometrists and nurses did some health screening on wheels during the four days of the Wayne County Fair.

Their screening location was inside the spacious Nebraska Lions Foundation Mobile Screening Unit that was in operation on the

fairgrounds.

Inside, volunteer optometrists provide screenings for glaucoma and eyesight. Physician and physician assistant volunteers and nurses screened for blood sugar count and blood pressure readings.

Dennis Hull (DOMNLFMSU), which stands for Driver and

Wakefield advances to the Championship round at State

Wakefield's Junior Legion team advanced into the finals of the 1989 Class C State Tournament to be held this Thursday night at 7:00 in Wymore's Arbor State Park.

Wakefield will play the winner of the Creighton-Yutan game slated for late Wednesday. Wakefield has played both Creighton and Yutan in the tournament so far and have been both victorious and losers.

After defeating Fullerton by a 17-3 count in first round action Wakefield had to play Creighton in the second round held on Sunday. Wakefield jumped out to a 5-0 lead behind the pitching arm of Troy Twohig, but had to hang on and pull it out in the bottom of the seventh inning on an rbi single by Chris Loofe.

Heading into the bottom of the second inning the two teams were deadlocked in a scoreless tie. Wakefield however, exploded for three runs in the second inning as Chris Loofe doubled following a Mark Johnson walk. Both runners were knocked in by Troy Twohig's 3-run home run.

In the bottom of the third inning Wakefield added two more runs as Mike Mogus smashed a home run with Andy McQuistan on base. McQuistan had reached base via a single.

In the fifth inning Twohig got into a jam as he loaded the bases on singles and a walk. Coach Paul Eaton called for a change and brought in Steve Loofe who proceeded to strike out the first batter he faced and forced the next batter to ground out to second base to end the inning.

Creighton rallied however, with five runs in the seventh inning, all with two out to tie the score. Wakefield rallied to win the game in the bottom of the seventh inning on a Chris Loofe single which scored Mike Mogus who had earlier singled.

Down Yutan

On Monday Wakefield played Yutan in a contest that matched the tournament's only two undefeated teams. It was a slugfest from the onset but Wakefield managed to hang on for a 16-13 victory.

Wakefield got the fireworks started early as they scored four runs in the top half of the first in-

ning. Troy Lee led off with a double and Mike Mogus advanced him on his single with one out. An error led to Wakefield's first run as Matt Tappe managed to reach base.

Mark Johnson then laced a 2-run single and Doug Manz later added an rbi single to end the inning. Yutan however, bounced back to score five runs in the inning to lead 5-4 after one.

Wakefield scored three more in the second inning as Troy Lee drew a walk and Andy McQuistan managed a single. Mike Mogus then cleared the bases with a 3-run home run. Yutan though, bounced back and also scored three times in the bottom of the second to lead 8-7 after two.

Wakefield took the lead for good in the fourth inning as Troy Lee led off with a walk and Andy McQuistan knocked him in with an rbi triple. Matt Tappe drew a walk and with one out, Mark Johnson smacked a 3-run home run to put Wakefield up 11-8.

Troy Twohig scored in the fifth inning on a wild pitch. Twohig had earlier reached base with a walk.

Yutan cut the lead in half on a 2-run home run but Wakefield scored two more times in the sixth inning following an error on Yutan which led to a double steal which scored Mark Johnson and Darren Martinson.

Wakefield scored two more in the seventh inning to lead by six runs heading into the final half of the seventh inning. Yutan smacked a 3-run home run but it was not enough to overcome Wakefield's lead.

On Tuesday, Creighton won the rematch with Wakefield, this time by a 7-6 count. Creighton scored twice in the top half of the first inning and managed to stretch that lead to 4-0 until the bottom half of the third inning when Wakefield managed to tie the game at 4-4.

Andy McQuistan and Mike Mogus recorded hits in the inning which aided Wakefield's comeback but it was all for not as Creighton rallied to win a 7-6 decision.

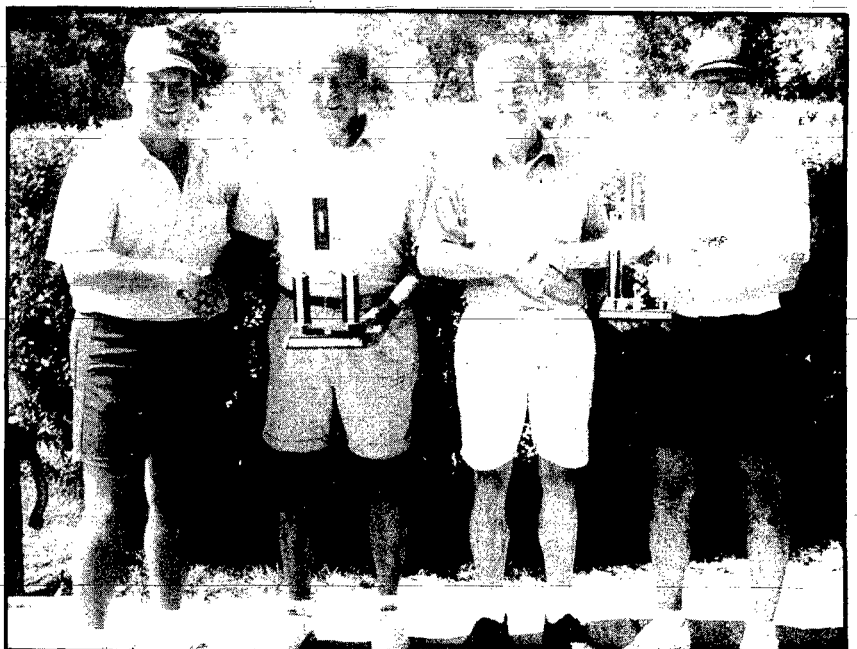

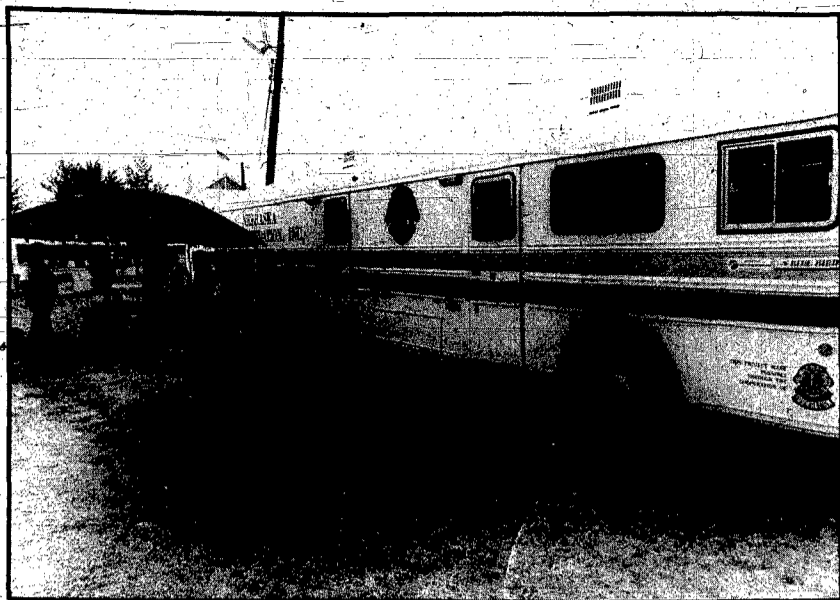

Operations Manager of the Nebraska Lions Foundation Mobile Screening Unit, conducted the hearing screening.

HULL SAID the mobile unit is not in competition with hospitals or physicians' clinics, but does a lot of referral through the assistance of the expert volunteers that work in the mobile unit.

"If we find any abnormalities, it is our policy to refer these people to physicians, optometrists or hearing specialists — whatever the case may be," said Hull.

In three days of the four day Wayne County Fair, close to 180 people participated in the health screening tests. The computer programmed mobile screening unit can handle up to 25 people in an hours time, Hull said.

OF THOSE who had undergone the health screening process during those three days, at least 15 percent show some type of hearing problem; over 5 percent had eyesight problems; nearly 6 percent became aware of problems in their blood sugar or

blood pressure; and up to two percent were experiencing glaucoma problems.

Hull said the mobile unit "comes totally equipped right down to the registration form." It also comes with a soundproof room that is used for the hearing screening.

"The only thing we do is add volunteer people to assist us with it," Hull said.

He said the cost to have the health screening mobile unit at the fairgrounds was \$25 per day. Funding for the visit to the Wayne County Fair was sponsored by the Lions Clubs in Wayne, Wisner, West Point, Wakefield and Laurel. Volunteers also came from those communities, Hull said.

THIS IS THE second year for the program which was requested by Farm Bureau members through the organization's policy development process.

And the visits are not planned as a lobbying effort, said Doug Gibson who is chief administrator of the Nebraska Farm Bureau.

"The 12 legislative assistants have the responsibility for agricultural issues in their respective Congressman's office, but few had any firsthand knowledge of agriculture," said Gibson.

"None of them had spent any time in the Midwest and know very little about agriculture in this region. One of the participants indicated his previous agriculture exposure was 'day trips and farm publications in the office.' That's probably typical of the group. They were all eager to learn about agriculture," Gibson mentioned.

Prior to his stay with the Liedmans, Traub was introduced to the Nebraska delegation during a luncheon on the University of Nebraska-Lincoln East Campus and he was given a tour of the Food Industry Complex while also being briefed on Nebraska's major crops.

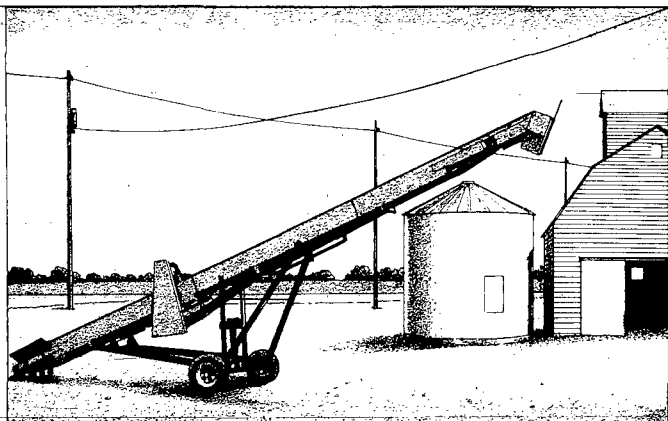
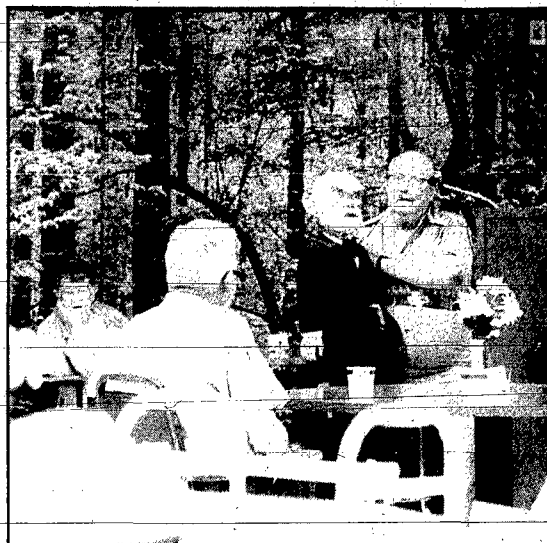
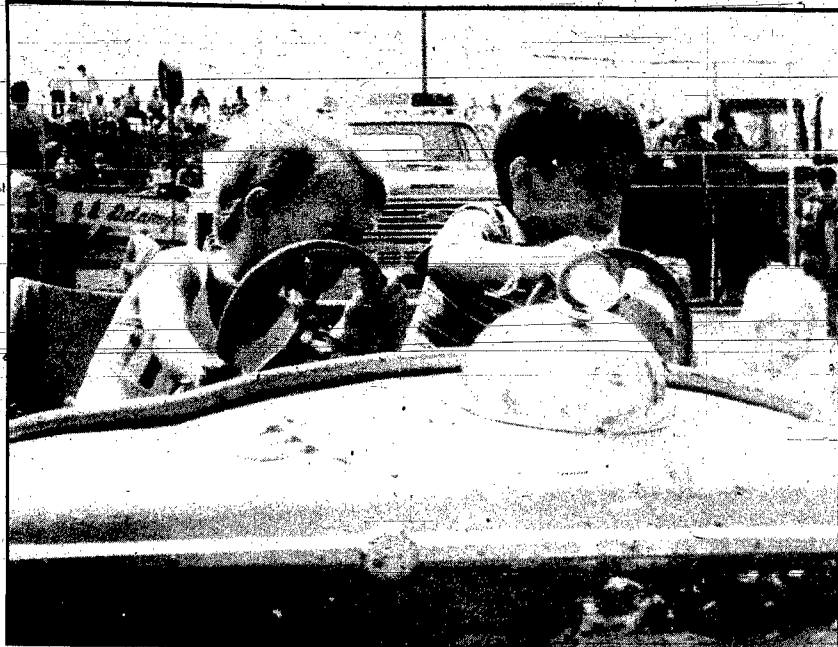

Demand keeps growing for child-care centers as more mothers remain in the work force, but reliable people are needed to staff the centers. Child-care administrators observe that older people enjoy working with young children, and absenteeism is less of a problem than with younger workers. Says one director: "The involvement of older people...also had a positive effect on the young parents' attitudes toward aging."

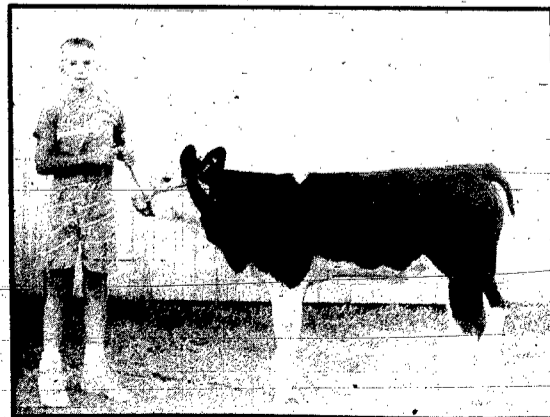

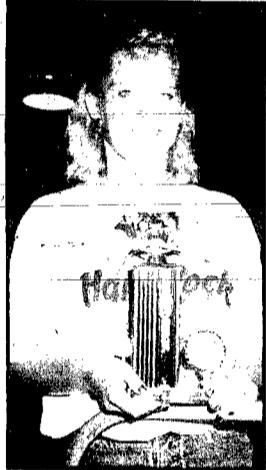



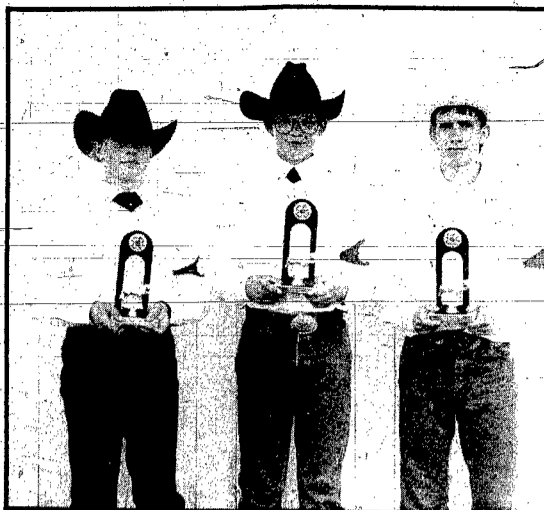
