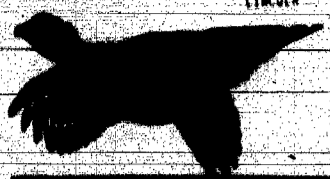
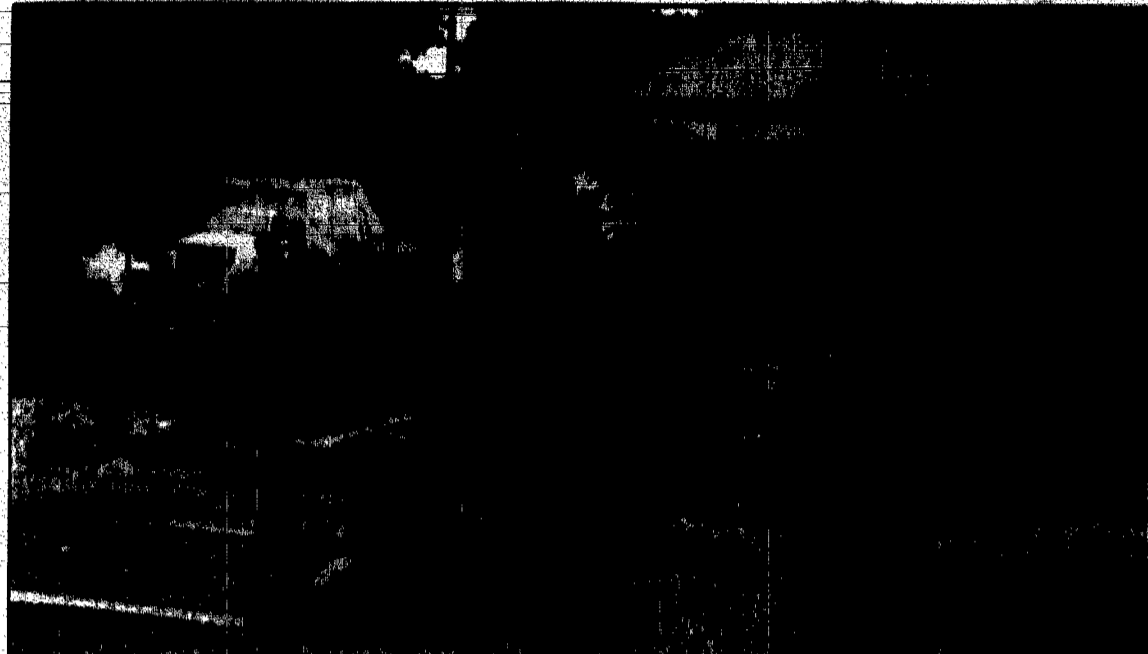

## Remodeling bid accepted

Construction is set to begin in early December at the Wayne County Courthouse following the acceptance of a bid by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners. A bid from Cita Construction for \$243,200 was accepted on a July vote. Commissioner Debra Danahy voted against the proposal. The project is expected to take 130 days to complete. A total of four bids were received on the renovation project. The contract was approved, pending review by the Wayne County attorney. The list of sub-contractors was also approved by the board. A pre-construction meeting will be held with the contractor and sub-contractors on Sept. 16. Jerry Berggren, architect for the project told the commissioners that the purpose of this meeting is two-fold, that being to go over courthouse procedures with those involved in the project and to allow the courthouse staff the opportunity to meet with the construction crew. In other business, the board approved a cooperative agreement with the Northern Plains Housing Authority. The board also established speed limits and authorized the placement of traffic signs along North Centennial Road and East 21st Street (Country Club Road). This action is necessary because of the Highway 13 widening project.

## Treestructure

The nearly 80 trees that will be excavated for the Highway 13 widening project will be removed by the end of the week according to Dobson Brothers Construction manager Red Dobson. Bob Block of Wausa, (pictured above) removes the branches from the highway between Seventh and Pearl and Lincoln Street. Construction is nearing the end of the first two weeks and Dobson said things are running smoothly. Centennial Road north of Highway 13 closed on Wednesday afternoon and will remain closed until the completion of the box culvert work which Dobson estimated to be approximately four weeks. Motorists are reminded to drive carefully through the construction zone and those caught speeding in the zone will be fined double. Motorists are also encouraged to watch for the flashing lights.

## Wayne utilities receive honors

Two Wayne based utilities are recipients of electric industry awards. Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) presented awards to the Wayne County Public Power District and the City of Wayne municipal utility during NPPD's Wholesale Customer Annual Awards Banquet recently in Grand Island. NPPD Vice President of Wholesale Gary Westphal announced the award winners for 1996. NPPD's President and CEO Bill Mayberry presented 33 Peak Performer and 14 Leading Edge awards to public power districts and municipal utilities in the state. In the category of Rural Public Power District with annual revenues of less than \$3 million, Wayne County PPD received the Leading Edge Award for winter load growth. Electric purchases increased 13.7 percent during the four winter months last year. Meanwhile, the City of Wayne received a Leading Edge Award for general development, in recognition of its efforts resulting MPM Farms and 201 new jobs to the community. NPPD recognizes Wayne County and City for their outstanding efforts during 1996. Westphal said, "We are proud to be a partner with the two utilities, helping to supply reliable, low cost electricity to customers in northeast Nebraska." NPPD presented Peak Performer and Leading Edge awards to 22 wholesale customers, including public power districts and municipal utility systems throughout rural Nebraska. The categories also included outstanding accomplishments in the areas of annual sales growth and incentive payments compared to total load. Nebraska's energy leader, NPPD serves the state in all or parts of 81 counties with retail or wholesale electrical power through a 6,200 mile transmission system. Governed by a popularly elected Board of Directors, the public utility seeks to enhance the quality of life for its customers by safely providing electricity, irrigation and related services, while balancing costs, reliability and protection of the environment.

## Busy week for Wayne police

Wayne Police Chief Lance Webster said his officers had a busy week, clearing several burglaries and two felony vandalism cases.

He said there is enough evidence to close these cases but not sufficient evidence to file charges yet. These cases also involve some of the same juveniles and are related.

Chief Webster praised his officers, saying they put in a lot of time and effort to bring these investigations to a successful conclusion.

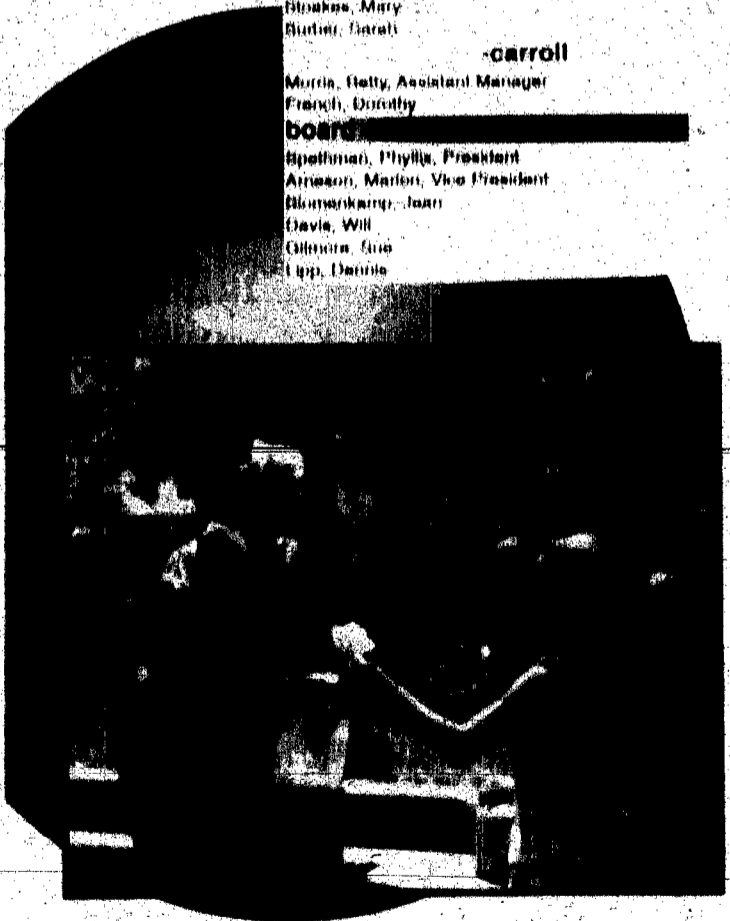

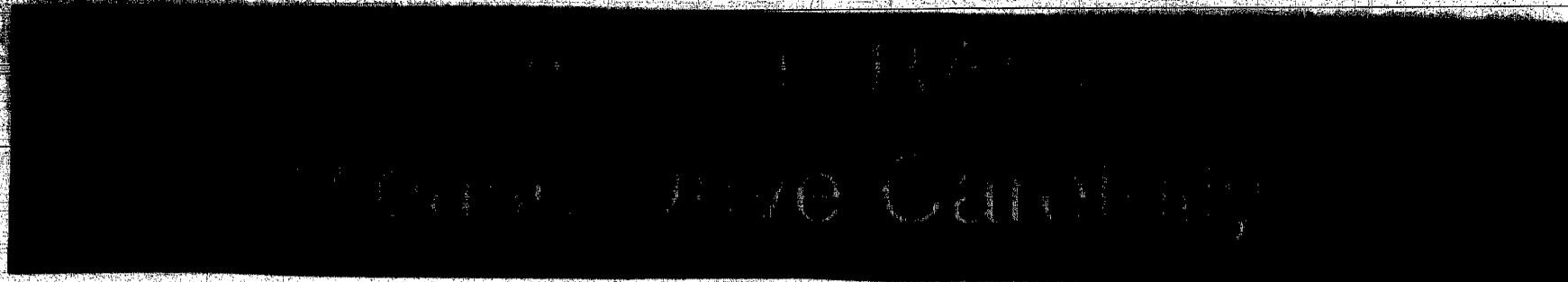

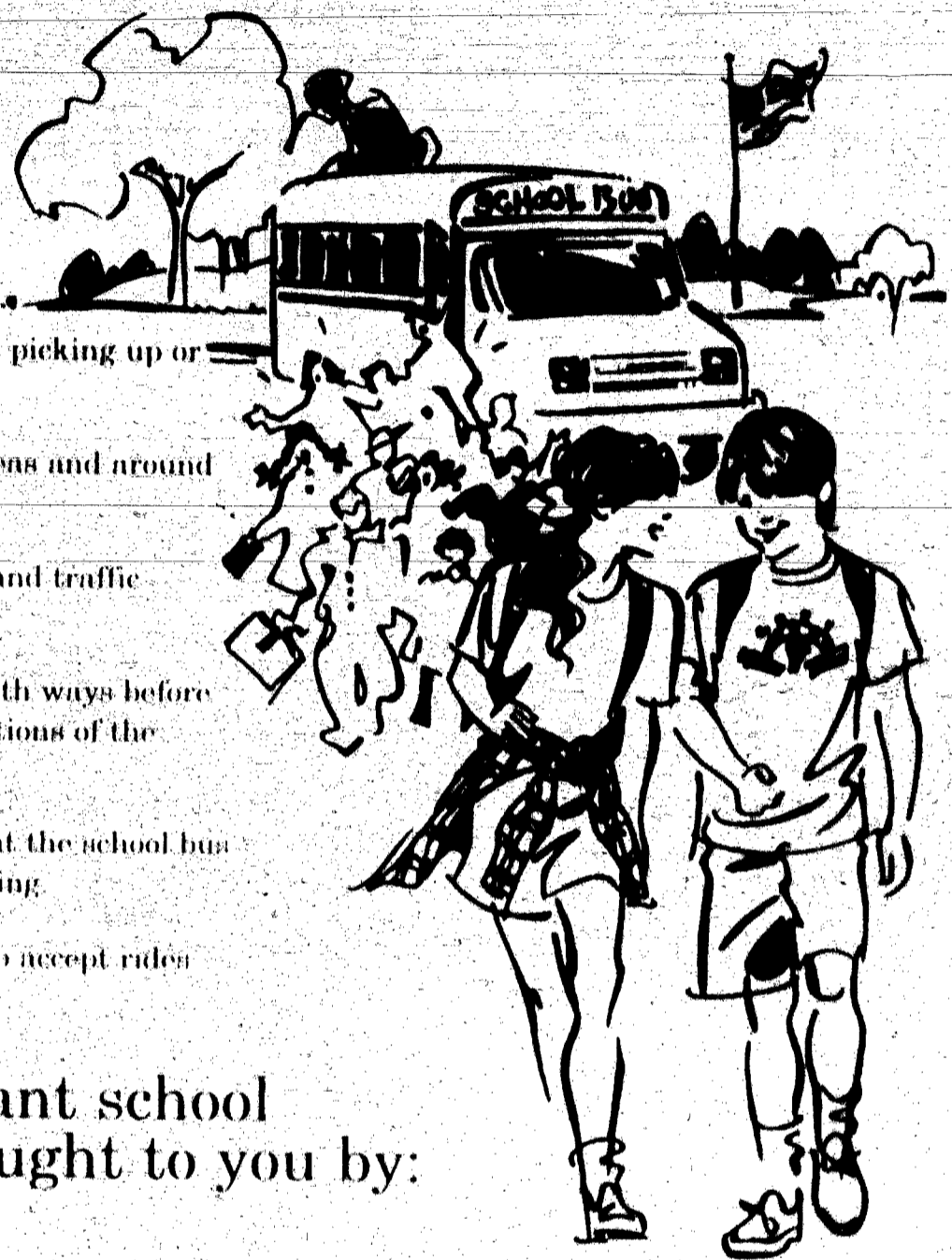

## Parents vital to child's learning

Q: What causes a child to be a "slow learner" - one who just doesn't learn like other children in the classroom?

A: There are many hereditary, environmental, and physical factors which contribute to one's intellect and it is difficult to isolate the particular influences. For many children who have difficulty in school, we will never know precisely why their ability to learn is limited. Let me tell you what is now known about intellectual development that may explain some, but not all, cases of learning deficits.



that the high stimulation rats had brains that differed in several important ways: (1) the cortex (the thinking part of the brain) was thicker and wider; (2) the blood supply was much more abundant; (3) the synapses necessary for learning were more sophisticated. The researchers concluded that the stimulation experienced during the first group's early lives had resulted in more advanced and complex brains. It is always risky to apply conclusions from animal research directly to humans, but the same kinds of changes probably occur in the brains of highly stimulated children. If parents want their children to be capable, they should begin by talking to them at length while they are still babies. Interesting mobiles and winking blinking toys should be arranged around the crib. From then on through the toddler years, learning activities should be programmed regularly.

Accumulating evidence seems to indicate that those children who are slow learners and even those who have borderline retardation may not have received proper intellectual stimulation in their very early years.

There appears to be a critical period during the first three to four years when the potential for intellectual growth must be seized. There are enzyme systems in the brain that must be activated during this brief window. If the opportunity is missed, the child may never reach his capacity.

Children who grow up in deprived circumstances are more likely to be slow learners. They may not have heard adult language regularly, they have not been provided with interesting books and puzzles to occupy their sensory apparatus. They have not been taken to the zoo, the airport, or other exciting places. They have not received daily reading and guidance from adults. This lack of stimulation may rob the brain of developing properly.

The effect of early stimulation on brain health has been studied in several fascinating animal experiments. In one study, researchers divided litter mate rats into two identical groups. The first was given maximum stimulation during the first few months of life. These rats were kept in well-lighted cages, surrounded by interesting puzzle toys and other toys. They were handled regularly and allowed to explore outside their cages. They were subjected to learning experiences and then recorded for remembering. The second group lived the opposite kind of existence. These rats crunched in dimly lit, dark, unstimulating cages. They were not handled or stimulated in any way, and were not permitted outside their cages. Both groups were fed healthily.

At 105 days of age, all the rats were sacrificed to permit examination of their neurological apparatus. The researchers were surprised to find

Of course, parents must understand the difference between stimulation and pressure. Providing books for a three-year-old is stimulating. Reheating and threatening him because he can't read them is pressuring. Imposing unrealistic expectations can have a damaging effect on children.

If early stimulation is as important as it now appears, then the lack thereof may be a leading cause of learning impairment among school children. It is imperative that parents take the time and invest their resources in their children. The necessity for providing rich, exciting experiences for young children has never been so obvious as it is today.

Q: What do you think of the phrase "Children should be seen and not heard"?

A: That statement reveals a profound ignorance of children and their needs. I can't imagine how any loving adult could raise a vulnerable little boy or girl by that philosophy. Children are the checks; they must be allowed to run.

**'Working together for a brighter future' is theme of swine forum**

"Working Together for a Brighter Future" is the theme of an upcoming conference designed to bring community and farm leaders to enhance community support for the swine industry and Extension Educator Bud Patent.

The conference, which is planned for Sept. 1 at the State City, Iowa Convention Center is a joint effort of Nebraska and Iowa Cooperative Extension and USDA Rural Development.

"For the long term health of Agriculture, and our rural communities, it is important that town and farm leaders work together. This conference offers speakers and workshops that address success stories of how this is being accomplished," Patent said.

The keynote speaker is Dr. Donald Arker, a former university president and agriculture professor. Arker will offer a much needed look at the role each segment of the community must play in an ongoing agriculture entrepreneurship within rural communities including the value of livestock production, and the importance of local value-added processing.

Dr. John Affin, ILL, Extension Rural Sociologist, will discuss how health and value in rural communities face challenges and opportunities for the overall development of the area.

The conference will offer two tracks of workshops for attendees. One track relates to agricultural development, including rural communities and rural leaders working together, changing face of rural communities, value added agriculture, risk taking, changing technology in agriculture, environmental challenges and tools that work for family farm producers.

Track two will offer workshops that relate to community development topics such as housing development, community fund-raising, collaboration among small communities, entrepreneurship in rural communities and child care.

Local community and agriculture leaders will be the lead presenters of the workshops. They will share success stories of what is working in their communities.

Each workshop will allow time for participants to ask questions and share their own experiences with the group.

Approximately 200-300 people from Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota are expected to participate in this conference. Patent said.

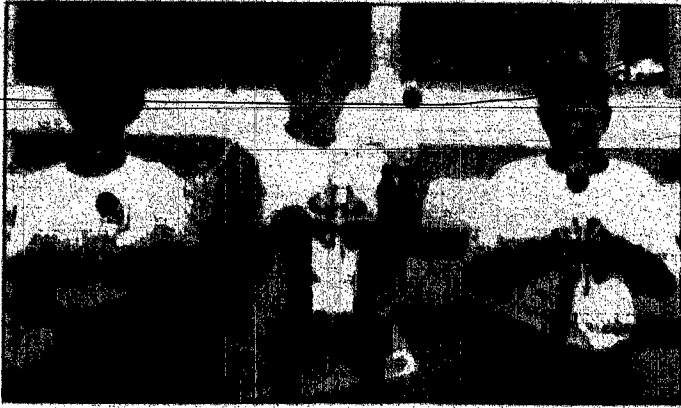

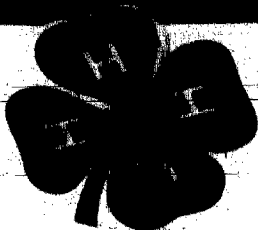

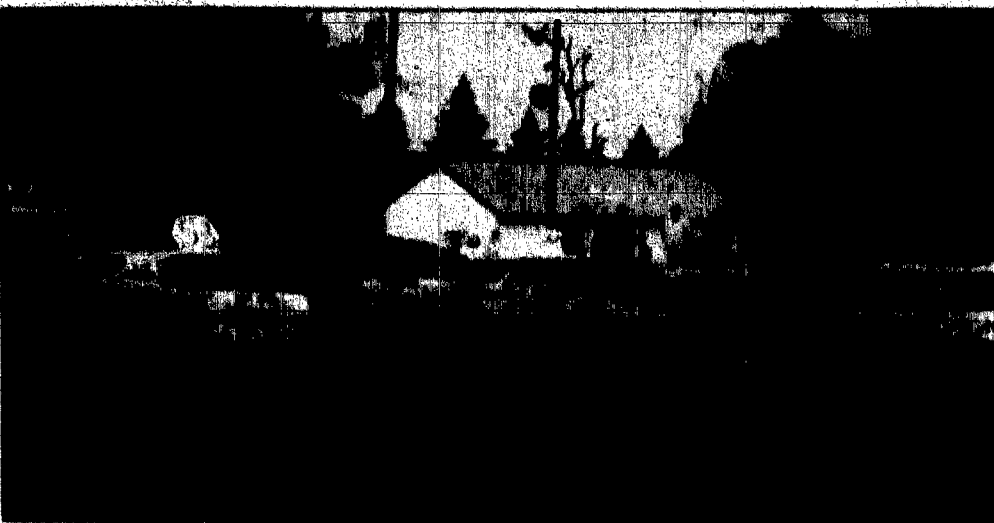
