

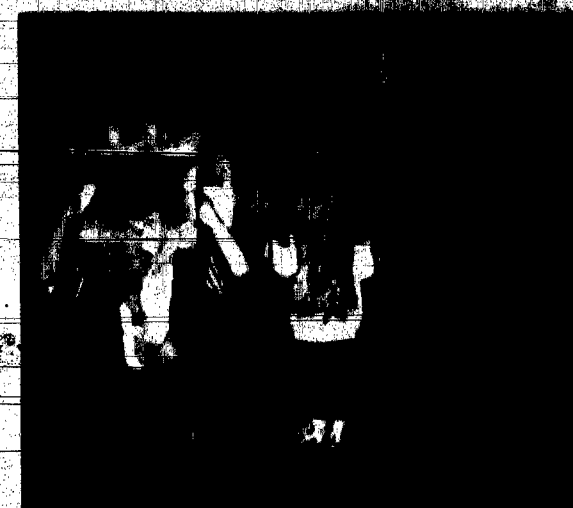
Wayne State releases honor roll

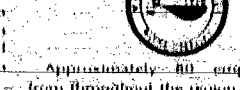


Celebrating the new year

Approximately 400 employees from throughout the region will be in attendance offering students information and answering questions that students may have about their companies.

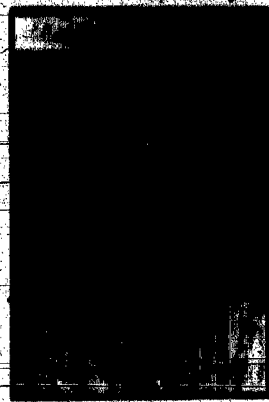
Some employers will do on-site interviews, while others will have private interviews after 4:30 p.m.

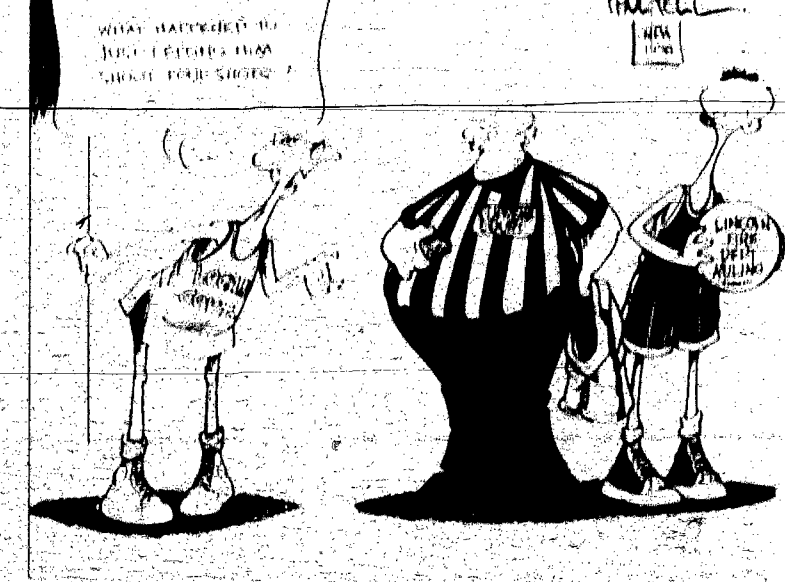

WSC men rebound from upset loss to Briar Cliff

Following a disappointing upset at the hands of Briar Cliff last week, the Wayne State men's basketball team recovered nicely on Saturday with a 15-point win over a solid Rockhurst College team, 62-67.

George McDermott's crew got after it from the outset as they built a quick double-digit lead.

The Cats would lead at the intermission by one at 40-31. Among the best half highlights was the stoppage of play when junior point guard Tyler Johnson broke the career-best record at WSC, finishing with 14 points.

Johnson would go on to dish out a season-high 14 assists in the contest and had 388 career assists following this contest.

Rockhurst led WSC, 39-30, in two points in the second half but the visitors never took the lead as WSC got back on track with back-to-back 3-pointers on two occasions from red-shirt freshman Brad Jones and freshman freshman Matthew Muller.

"I thought we responded very well after losing those boys earlier at home," commented Briar Cliff's McDermott said. "We are not accustomed to losing home games."

Lucy Philipp led a well-balanced attack for the Cats with 17 points, eight rebounds, knocking down four 3-pointers en route to a win, including 16 points Tyler Johnson finished with 14 points and Jon Hedberg posted 11.

WSC upset the visitors on the boards 48-37 led by Eric Henderson who notched a career-high 17 rebounds.

Wayne comes from behind to down Cadets; Girls fall

The Wayne boys and girls basketball teams were in action last Thursday and Friday with road games at different locations.

The Wayne girls dropped a 55-43 decision at highly-ranked Hartington Cedar Catholic while the Blue Devil boys erased a dismal first-half performance and cruised to a 60-43 win at West Point on Friday.

Rocky Ruhl's squad improved to 10-5 on the season. Wayne raked to a 17-12 lead after one quarter of play but the Blue Devils would play the entire second quarter with out scoring a field goal.

"We hit five of seven free throw attempts in the second quarter but that was the extent of our scoring," Ruhl said.

West Point, meanwhile, went on a 12-2 run and led Wayne by a four-point at the intermission, 27-27.

It was Wayne who would turn the tables in the second half on the host team, however, as the Blue Devils went on an 18-7 run to push a lead into double digits where it was never threatened.

Wayne led 44-14 at their end of three and out scored the Cadets, 16-11 in the fourth quarter for the 15-point victory.

"It was a tale of two halves," Ruhl said. "There was a bit of quick action in the first half and we were called for 13 fouls. In the second half, we played much smarter with only four fouls.

Ruhl credited his bench for keeping the game close before halftime.

"We had some kids playing together for the first time in a victory con-

test because we were in foul trouble and I thought they did a nice job," Ruhl added.

Ryan Dahl posted a season-high 20 points while Justin Thede poured in 18 and Matt Meyer, 11. Joel Munson finished with six points and Adam Endicott, four while John Magnuson scored two and Ryan Sturm, one.

Wayne dominated the boards to the tune of 33-18 with Thede hauling down eight rebounds and Endicott, seven.

Wayne committed 15 turnovers but forced 22 and the Blue Devils were 17-27 from the foul line with the Cadets committing on some of sixteen.

Wayne will play at O'Neill on Thursday before hosting the final three regular season contests beginning with Elk Horn Valley on Saturday.

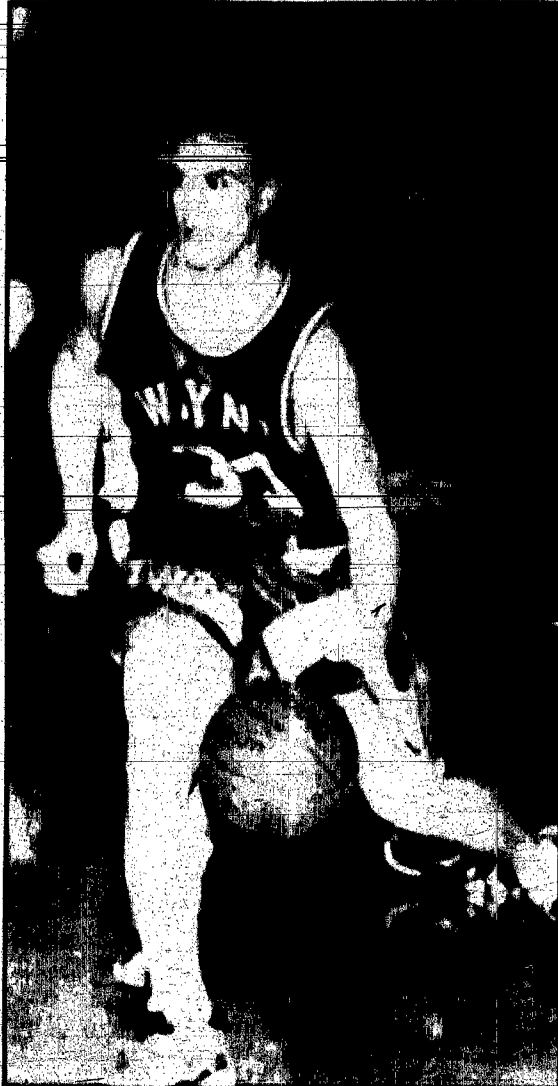
Defensively, I thought we played very well, but we could not take advantage of our opportunities at the offensive end.

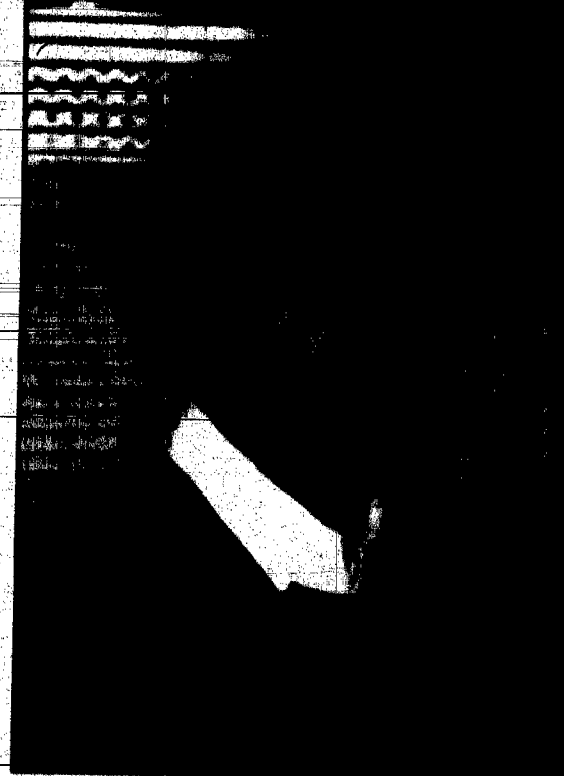

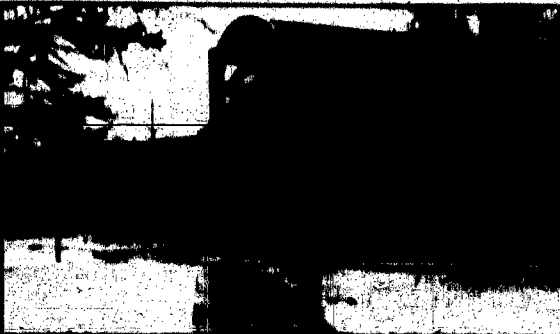
