# Half of county's 252 bridges need work, report says

Almost 20 percent of the bridges in Nebraska are structurally deficient and in need of repair or replacement.

Here in Wayne County, that percentage is closer to 50 percent, and county officials

continue to juggle finances in an effort to update and upgrade some of the more serious bridge issues in the

A recent federal bridge report found that 2,739 of the 15,370 bridges in Nebraska are considered structurally deficient, almost double



# LEDs Help You See 'Green'

Nebraska customers can save money, energy with new light incentive

Columbus, NE – On Jan. 1, 2014, Nebraska Public Power District and its wholesale customer utilities began offering incentives to residential electric customers for the purchase and installation of lightemitting diode (LED) bulbs.

At the start of this new 2014 year, final provisions of the 2007 Energy Policy Act began phasing out the standard, 60-watt, incandescent light bulb. Production and importation of the 100-watt and 75-watt standard incandescent lamps have already been closed out over the past two years under the same policy.

Fortunately, customers have an excellent alternative. City of Wayne Electric utilities will provide customers with a \$5 account credit for each 60, 75, or 100-watt LED equivalent to the standard bulb they buy, with up to 10 credits available per residential account this year. Customers can purchase these LED lamps wherever they desire, but the package must be identified as ENERGY STAR® quali-

The Environmental Protection Agency's ENERGY STAR program encourages installation of LED lamps that use 75 to 80 percent less energy than equivalent incandescent light bulbs and have a rated life that is 25 to 50 times longer. LEDs do not contain mercury, which eliminates some disposal concerns.

LED lamps offer additional advantages over compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs), which have long been touted as energy-efficient alternatives to standard light bulbs. LEDs illuminate instantly when their power switch is turned on. Their light output is not diminished in cold weather. In fact, LEDs last longer in cold areas. LEDs offer a variety of color temperatures that allow customers to match the appearance of standard incandescent bulbs or the bright white of most office environments. Many LED lamps are dimmable, but customers should confirm this prior to purchase, as manufacturers are required to indicate whether they are or not on the packaging.

NPPD and its wholesale customer utilities are contributing approximately \$100,000 toward this campaign which will run through the end of December 2014. 





Seven-time defending national champion Concordia-St. Paul received 15 first-place votes and is tabbed the team to beat in the conference for the 11th consecutive year. Minnesota Duluth received the first-place vote from the Concordia coach, as coaches can not vote for their own team in the poll.

Following the Golden Bears and the Bulldogs are Southwest Minnesota State, Northern State and Wayne State in the top five. 

# 'Evil' depression claims life of comedy genius

I remember when Elvis died. John Lennon as well. They were voices of a generation, gone way too young and too soon for me to really understand (at the time, anyway) just what they meant to the people who they enter-

Monday, one of my voices, one of my inspirations, one of the true greatest of the greats is gone. And unlike Elvis (drug overdose) or Lennon (murder), Robin Williams was taken by the most evil, most horrible, coldest

Williams' battles with alcohol and drugs are well-documented, and he was quick to make fun of those battles on stage. And while he was in and out of rehab dealing with his substance demons, it was nothing compared to the demon of depression that ultimately took his life.

The guy was the grand wizard of improvisation. Watch any interview on any talk show and the guy absolutely took over whatever show he was on, from Carson to Letterman. Calling Robin Williams brilliant would be like calling water wet. Get his first comedy album, "Reality, What a Concept" and listen to the bit on Three Mile Island as told by William Shakespeare or "Welcome To Comedy Hell" – all of that is off the cuff and delivered in former U.S. Senator and one-term a manic, unfathomable display of unthinkable brilliance that no human being, before or since, can even get in the neighborhood of bringing to a

And for as brilliant a comic genius as he was – the guy could act. He could be mind-blowing funny in "Good Morning Vietnam" or "Mrs. Doubtfire" and then come back with "Dead Poets Society" and deliver an acting performance that made you stop and ask, "Is that the SAME guy?" There are brilliant comedians and equally-brilliant actors – the number of people who can easily bring both to epic levels the way Williams did can be

But for all of that genius and all of that joy that he brought to our lives, the man had a demon that was pure evil. People look at all that he had and all the fun he brought to our lives and have no clue what depression is, where it manifests itself and how it hides in the shadows and waits for its opportunity. A lot of people who are in the comedy field or who create images and words for a living do so while hiding a tremendous amount of dark skeletons that can't wait to come out of the closet and screw up somebody's life. We hide behind the laughter, and the drugs, and everything else because it's a distraction from the real beast that lurks in the deepest

When you deal with the level of depression that people like Robin Williams went through, every day is a round of Russian Roulette. In some cases, it's literally a 50/50 proposition whether or not you're going to get through the day alive or not. I've lived it. Even during my time here in God must be laughing Wavne. I've awaken some mornings and asked myself, "So how am I going to end this day and will I be alive when it's over?" And it's very hard to talk about it, because a lot of people in your life don't GET it.

"You're an Academy Award-winning actor," they said to Williams. "You're the funniest comedian alive and one of the funniest ever. You improvise like no other human being. HOW can you be so depressed?" I've had people ask me those kinds of questions. "You've got a great family. You're a fantastic journalist. You have this. You have that. What is are numerous reasons why we WRONG with you?"

Depression is that dark voice in your head that tells you that you can't do something, or you're not good enough, or you're not worthy of anything good, or that you're just a waste of protoplasm. It's a voice most people can minimize, if not ignore outright. For some of us, though, it's a real and difficult voice to shut down.

I laugh at people who criticize me, because they're bringing Kool-Aid to a gin party if they think they can get under my skin with a critical remark. I've said much worse things to myself over a misspelled headline than the most irate reader on the block can bring into the office and deliver in their best fit of rage over having a name misspelled. I can't BEGIN to imagine what the voices told Robin Williams that ultimately convinced him that suicide was his best available option. It saddens me to know that he couldn't overcome those voices, that his genius and his brilliance and all of his success couldn't drown out that horrible noise.

I've seen all of Williams' TV comedy specials and heard all of his albums, and I'll have countless wonderful memories of his comedy genius, his sense of timing and his insanely brilliant mind. He was my Milton Berle, my Groucho Marx, my George Burns. It profusely saddens me to know that, for all of that brilliance and all of the joy he brought to me and millions of others all over the world, that those evil voices of depression snuffed out the life of such a wonderful, funny, brilliant and insanely creative person-

Comedy will never be the same without Robin Williams. This generaion's comedic voice is gone.

RIP and "Nanu Nanu," Robin.

# How many debates is enough?

When you're the underdog - read that Democrat in a Republican state - you want to take advantage of public exposure. When you're underfunded, you want all the media coverage possible. One way to get both is by debating your opponent as many times in as many places as possible.

It comes as no surprise that Democratic gubernatorial candidate Chuck Hassebrook wants more than the two agreed upon debates with Republican Pete Ricketts in the first contested race for the governor's office in nearly two decades. Hassebrook is the former director of the Center for Rural Affairs and a former University of Nebraska Regent. Ricketts is an official at TD Ameritrade headquartered in Oma-

Hassebrook, who grew up on a family farm, wants an opportunity to let voters statewide know of his rural roots and his experience on the governing board of the statewide university system. Unopposed in the gubernatorial primary, he does have political name recognition as the Democrat candidate for U.S. Senate who lost out to popular Governor Bob Kerrey who jumped into the fray late in the game and lost the election to Republican Deb

Ricketts, well funded and ahead in the polls, doesn't have to worry about his public exposure. His political name recognition came as the person who finished second to incumbent U.S. Senator Ben Nelson in one of the most expensive races in Nebraska history as both candidates spent millions in advertising. Ricketts also emerged from an expensive six-way Republican primary race in May for the seat he is now seeking.

That primary, labeled by many as the bloodiest in Nebraska histo-



abundance of attack ads. Attorney General Jon Bruning, who finished second to Ricketts, blamed the Ricketts campaign for the negative ads. Ricketts vehemently denied it.

It's understandable that the Hassebrook campaign is probably steeling itself for more of that as the Nov. 4 election inches closer. Hassebrook has been walking parade routes, seeking donations - his biggest score being \$100,000 from billionaire Warren Buffett - and trying to get Ricketts to agree to more than two debates, one of which he has characterized as more of a joint appearance than a debate.

SAFETY IN CHILDREN Curiosity kills more than the cat.... Did you know that medications are the top cause of poisoning in kids?<sup>1</sup> Together, we can help change that! To get started, here are a few answers to

some questions parents commonly ask about medication safety for kids. **1. Where should I store medications?** People may call it the "medicine cabinet," but it's not a good place to store medications. Bathrooms are moist and can lower the strength of a medication. Plus, they're a little too easy for little hands to get into.

Instead, keep drugs, eye drops, and vitamins out of sight and out of reach of children. Try a high place, such as a hall closet or kitchen shelf. Don't forget that a curious kid may easily find medicine in a purse or dresser drawer.<sup>1,2</sup>

**2. How should I measure medicine?** With young children, it's especially important to get the dosing right. Always use the dosing device that comes with the medicine. Measuring spoons or other home utensils aren't the same as a medication syringe or cup. 1 If you use a syringe, try squirting the medicine on the inside of the cheek where there are fewer taste buds. If your child takes the wrong dosage, call me right away. I can tell you whether or not it's cause for concern. Or call Poison Control for assistance as well.

**3. Does a spoonful of sugar help the medicine go down?** Some medicines can taste pretty nasty to a child! It may be okay to mix a liquid medication with chocolate or maple syrup. However, don't do this for babies. If they don't finish a bottle, they won't get the right amount of medication.<sup>2</sup> And check with me before crushing and mixing a tablet or capsule with food. <sup>4</sup>

**4. Is it okay to share prescription medications?** No matter how similar their symptoms, don't have your kids share medications.<sup>2</sup> And never repackage them. Keep medications in their original childproof container.

**5. How long can my child use a medication?** Be sure to not use drugs past their expiration date. Most drugs lose their strength after about a year. If you have any question about whether or not to use a drug, talk with your child's doctor or me.

**6. Are OTC drugs safe for kids?** Be sure to read labels. Not all over-the-counter (OTC) medications are safe for children of all ages. Of course, never give aspirin to any child—it can cause serious illness, even death.3

Make sure you know a drug's potential side effects. But stay alert to any adverse reactions. Kids can be more sensitive to drugs than adults. For example, cold medications can cause excitability or severe drowsiness in kids, even at lower doses. The FDA recommends that you not use OTC cough and cold medications in children younger than age two.3 Rest, clear fluids, and a humidifier may be the best route to recovery from colds and flu.<sup>4</sup>

Remember: There's no substitute for getting your specific questions answered. I'm here to personally talk with you about your child's medications. I can also suggest OTC drugs and discuss any concerns you have about side effects. If you don't remember a question until you're home, that's okay. Just give me a call.


