## Taxpayers express frustration with Council

Library budget, city trail draws ire of local residents at meeting

Prior to the start of Tuesday's Wayne City Council meeting, Mayor Ken Chamberlain wanted to give the standing-room only crowd of more than 50 in the Council chambers a chance to leave early.

Sensing that a number in the audience were in attendance to express their opposition to the second phase of the city's walking trail, Chamberlain told those in attendance that the Council would be discussing a resolution to pay an engineering company for work they have already done in providing design ideas for Phase 2 of the city's walking trail, and there would be no decision on the trail itself.

Only a few of those in attendance decided to leave before the meeting got underway, but Chamberlain's assurances didn't stop some of those who remained for voicing their displeasure about the situation.

City administrator Lowell Johnson said he asked Olsson Associates to give the city an option for moving the proposed trail route off of a street. The Council was to vote on whether or not to approve a resolution that would approve a preliminary engineering services agreement with Olsson with people coming out to me, and I walked Associates for additional design to move in peoples' yards," she said. of the agreement, the city would pay 20 percent of a \$3,250 invoice, with the remaining 80 percent coming from federal funds that were being used by the Department of Roads, which gave the trail its initial blessing back in 2003.

"We've asked (Olsson Associates) to give us an option to move the trail off the street. Approving this (resolution) does not mean it gets built, one way or the other," Chamberlain said, adding that if the city did not approve the resolution, it would be required to pay the entire \$3,250 tab.

Councilman Jennifer Sievers expressed some of the frustration being felt by residents living along the proposed trail route.

## Smalley to bring back anti-bullying message to Wayne students

May 13, 2010 is a day that will always be with Kirk Smalley – it's the day his young son, Ty, committed suicide.

Three years ago, Smalley visited Wayne and told a full house at the Majestic Theatre about his boy's life and how bullying led him to take his life at the age of 11. Soon after his son's death, Smalley and his wife started the Stand for the Silent movement, traveling the world to spread the message and encourage kids to stop bullying in their schools and communities ever since.

The Smalleys will return to Wayne on Thursday, Sept. 17 to do programs at Wayne Elementary and Wayne Junior-Senior High School, part of an ongoing tour to spread the message and help our children.

"It's been more than five years, and we've traveled to more than 1,000 schools and talked with more than a million kids," Smalley said in a phone interview with The Wayne Herald recently. "We've been invited to just about everyplace."

The numbers concerning bullying and the suicides that result are heartbreaking more than 55,000 kids in the United States have taken their own lives in the last seven years.

"That's more than the number of American soldiers that we lost in Vietnam," Smalley said. "There is a lot of awareness out there about it and how it devastates people.

It continues to haunt Smalley, even five years after he buried his little boy – a moment that, even today, he struggles with.

"Every time I do a presentation and talk about that day that we lost him, I relive

that day," he said. "We started doing this so quickly after we lost Ty, and I don't know that we've really taken the time to really heal from it – and I don't know that we even will.

In spite of that, Smalley said he knows that by talking about the experience, it's opening the eyes of many young people across the country.

We get messages from hundreds of kids every day that say 'You saved my life. I was going to do what your son did, and now I'm not and I want to make it stop.' It's a huge motivation to know that you had that impact on one child to be able to help them see that (suicide) is not even an option."

Smalley said he knows that, during his first trip to Wayne, his message made an impact on the community, thanks to responses he and his family received from those in the community who witnessed his presentation. He's hoping next month's programs will have a similar impact on both those kids who came in 2012 and those who will see it for the first time.


"I hope, with us coming back, we can get more kids involved," he said. "I know there are a lot of kids who haven't heard our message yet, and I hope we can get it out there and show them what bullying does to people and help kids out."



## Sen. Fischer pays Wayne a visit

Senator Deb Fischer conducted a Listening Session in Wayne on Friday.

Approximately 40 people first listened as Fischer highlighted some of the activity being conducted in the Senate and later asked a number of questions of the senator.

Fischer told her audience that in her first year in the Senate, only 15 bills were passed. This past year, 160 amendments were passed, including "some very important legislation, including the passage of the first balance budget in a decade."

Fischer noted that the Senate is working to get legislation passed, "like the Senate is supposed to."

During the question and answer session, Fischer talked about the senators working together, government regulations on technology, water issues, wind energy and Cuban and Iran relations.

Fischer also talked about her feelings on the negotiated agreement the U.S. has recently completed with Iran and said, "I am not in favor of negotiated agreement. This is a security decision and is not in the best interest of the U.S."

Transportation was also discussed with Fischer stating she was hoping to get some type of long-term highway bill passed.

The listening session was held in the meeting room of the Elkhorn Valley Bank in Wayne and was one of several Fischer is conducting during the Senate's month-long break.



## Capitol View **Rural issues look interesting**

If it's time for the University of Nebraska-Lincoln football team to start playing home games, it must be time for the Legislature's Interim Study Hearing Schedule to fill up.


Lincoln (they get paid for it) to attol on Fridays and then attend home football games on Saturday. It seems it has ever been thus. If that's what it takes to lure them to town when they aren't in session, so be it.

Now, for the studies themselves. There are hundreds scheduled each year and every committee has some to consider before the next session convenes. Lawmakers explain that is how they get the information they need to formulate new bills or tweak existing law.

Many of these are not the headline grabbers that topics such as prison or taxation reform might be, but they are still important to the fabric of life in Nebraska. Several being heard by the Urban Affairs Committee and one by Revenue deal with issues of importance to rural Nebraskans.

The current act, which has been modified 13 times since first adopted in 1991, authorizes incorporated cities and villages to collect and appropriate local tax dollars (sales and/ or property tax) if approved by the local voters, for economic development purposes. It is being used in 68 communities from Chadron to Falls City and Kimball to South Sioux City and a lot of places in-



between.

The Act involves the formulation of a local economic development program plan which forms the foundation for the collection and expenditure of local tax revenues for economic development through: direct loans or grants to qualifying businesses for fixed assets and/or working capital; loan guarantees; grants for public works improvements which are essential for business recruitment or retention; job training; purchase of real estate; salary for city staff or consultants to implement the program; bonding; production of films; grants or loans for the construction or rehabilitation for sale or lease of housing for low to moderate income individuals.

An economic development program may also include grants or loans for the construction or rehabilitation for sale or lease of housing for persons of low to moderate income.

One last item to fulfill my contractual obligation for the week - here's a question to ponder: as an American citizen, which thought scares you more? President Trump or President Clinton?






