New power plant may find home in Wayne

Company moving to SSC, could build 3MW plant here

Wayne could become home to a new power plant run by renewable energy after a presentation was made during Tuesday's Wayne City Council meeting.

Green Stars Gasifiers CEO Tony Dermir presented the council with information about his company, which is relocating from Bowling Green, Ky., to South Sioux City. The company recently entered into a public/private partnership with the city of South Sioux City and will be building a power plant in that city, along with moving its offices, manufacturing and research facilities to Nebraska.

Dermir said South Sioux City and Wayne have something in common as far as being stuck with the high costs of doing business with Nebraska Public Power District when it comes to power generation, and his company has designed a model that uses renewable resources to help generate power for communities.

"We realized that smaller municipalities like Wayne seem to be stuck with NPPD when it comes to power generation, so we've designed a custom model and are able to provide renewable energy that brings cities into the future," he said.

The company uses a variety of renewable resources, including wind, hydro, solar, wood waste and even municipal solid waste and shredded tires. In South Sioux City, they are building a gasifier that runs on wood waste and provides the heat needed to break down the molecular structure of the wood to create a gas that creates clean electricity with no emission.

Dermir told the council that their interest in Wayne is not only from a power standpoint, but an economic development standpoint as well. Building a 3-megawatt power plant in smaller municipalities like Wayne would create a number of immediate jobs that would benefit the community. He said that a plant like one he envisions for Wayne would add 15 full-time employees, while the one in South Sioux City is expected to provide 50 direct jobs and more than 400 indirect jobs to the community.

The power plant would allow the city to collect property taxes, and South Sioux City officials said there are CDBG grants and USDA loan and grant programs that

are available through the Farm Bill that would help offset infrastructure costs.

"Our model works well with small municipalities . . . but it doesn't work in big cities because it's very politically driven by billion-dollar companies that are protecting their assets," he said. "We're a small company that can have a huge impact on municipalities. If NPPD wants to change their prices or make it more difficult, Wayne can do nothing except try to fight it or go on the open market and hope for the best."

Dermir said a power plant such as the one he sees for Wayne would require about 5-7 acres of land. He estimated the cost to build a plant at about \$17 million, which would include a fuel storage area and required infrastructure.

Councilman Matt Eischeid asked about the amount of waste that would be put out by a power plant running on renewable energy.

"We would use about 97 percent of everything," Dermir said, adding that about 3 percent of the resources would wind up in the city's landfill.

Dermir said the company is also having conversations with seven other Nebraska communities, including Wisner. He told the council that he would like to keep a dialogue going with Wayne officials in the hopes

of someday bringing a facility to town.

"I think we're all interested in continuing discussion on this and getting more information to educate ourselves," Mayor Ken Chamberlain said, encouraging Dermir to contact city administrator Lowell Johnson to pass information along to city officials.

The City Council also approved a measure to have 2,000 tons of sludge removed from the city's old lagoon as efforts continue to eventually close the lagoon, which was used on the city's old water treatment system.

The Environmental Protection Agency requires a city to remove sludge every two years, and Doug Echtenkamp, city water and wastewater operator, said the city's last removal came in 2014, so something had to be done before the end of the year so the city didn't face an EPA violation.

The city had allocated \$250,000 for sludge removal, but Eischeid suggested a proposal to use \$150,000 of that money and see how much sludge can be removed for that amount. Councilman Cale Giese offered a suggestion to do nothing and save the money while continuing to work toward complete removal of the sludge.

Giese noted that nitrogen in the sludge would be of interest to area landowners and that there might be

Alert system approved by county board

Wayne County residents will soon be able to receive weather alerts, Amber Alerts and other county- and city-wide notifications through an online system that the County Commissioners approved at Tuesday's meeting.

Emergency manager Nic Kemnitz presented the board with information on Civic Ready, a product of CivicPlus, the company that manages the county's website, as well as the City of Wayne. The Civic Ready program allows dispatchers at the Wayne Police Department to send out notifications via cell phone, e-mail or landline phone services to residents who sign up for the free service.

Residents who sign up for the service can designate not only which notices to receive, but at what time of day they can be sent and by which medium they choose to receive them, whether it's e-mail, cell phone or landline telephone. The county opted to buy into the system and include all communities in Wayne County, including the entire town of Wakefield, which is split between Wayne and Dixon Counties.

The county board will sign up for the service, which includes an \$800 setup fee, a \$2,495 annual system maintenance charge, and a \$500 per year additional fee to include National Weather Service and Amber Alert notifications, which would come automatically into the system. Signup for the system will be available on the Wayne County website in the near future.

The county board received its preliminary tax requests from various entities and approved all but one.

The Wayne County Ag Society asked for \$95,377.68, an increase of \$14,877.68 over what they were given last year. Ag Society board members Dave Jaeger, Kevin Davis and Travis Topp spoke with the board, indicating their plans to use more of

New pastor says Wayne is 'a great place' to be

A month into his new 'job' Fr. Jeff Mollner says "Everyone has been wonderful and helpful and it has been an exciting time."

Fr. Mollner began his duties as pastor of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Wayne on July 1 and said his first month has been a good transition.

Fr. Mollner was born and raised in Omaha, graduating from Creighton Prep High School. From there he went to Rockhurst University in Kansas City, Mo. He earned a bachelor's degree in biology and spent several years working at Creighton University as a lab tech.

"I didn't consider the priesthood seriously until after I graduated from college. I had thought about it before, but not really very seriously," he said.

He then enrolled in The Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio

to study philosophy. He studied theology at Mt. Angel Seminary in St. Benedict, Ore. for four years before being ordained June 7, 2008.

"After ordination, I served three years as an associate pastor at St. Margaret Mary parish in Omaha. Then I was reassigned to Skutt Catholic High School as chaplain and teacher," Fr. Mollner said.

He taught religion classes as well as biology and chemistry classes. In addition, he served as a freshman football coach.

When the archdiocese of Omaha made the decision to have former St. Mary's pastor, Fr. Mark Beran, take a position as Director of St. Augustine Indian Mission in Winnebago, Fr. Mollner was contacted about becoming the pastor here in Wayne.

"I was interested in coming to Wayne for several reasons. I visited with Fr. Beran, who spoke highly of the church

and community. I was excited by the fact that there is both an elementary school and college in the community. Also, becoming a pastor is the next logical step in my priesthood," Fr. Mollner said.

Fr. Mollner noted that the parish has had a number of personnel changes in the last several months, including the addition of a principal for the first time at St. Mary's Elementary School, and all are working through the transition.

"I am really looking forward to meeting both the students at the elementary school and the college students. This is a very great place and I am happy to be here," he said.

Fr. Mollner's parents live in Omaha. He also has two brothers, two sisters, two nieces and a nephew.

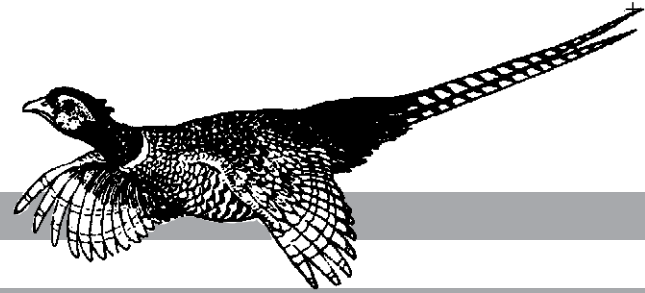
In his spare time he enjoys reading, movies and "really likes sports - especially the Kansas City Royals and Kansas City Chiefs."

She spent her childhood on dairy farms in northeast Nebraska, graduating from Wakefield Public High School in 1974. She pursued a Bachelor's degree, first at Doane College before completing a Fine Arts in Education degree at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1978. In college, Diane met Mike Row, her best friend for the rest of her life. They were married on July 15, 1979 and spent the next 37 years laughing together, pestering each other, supporting one another, learning together, and loving one another in the model of Jesus. They raised three children: Lindsey, David and Daniel. After two years teaching at Stromsburg High School, Mike and Diane left Nebraska for Texas, attending Christ for the Nations Institute in Dallas. Both received associate degrees in Practical Theology there in 1982 and went on to be ordained by the Church of the Brethren, Mike in 1982 and Diane in 1984. Diane's greatest ministry was always in the classroom. She was an exceptional educator and she cared for her students fiercely. She taught first at Stromsburg, then Fillmore Central, and finally, for 15 years, at Deshler Public Schools. She invested mountains of time and energy into developing the best art program she could muster and her dedication was evident in her students' work. Most of all, Diane loved her students; she wanted them to learn and love art, but she wanted them to be better people first. Because of her, they were.

While cancer troubled the last years of Diane's life, they were still years rich with joy. She still loved making new friends with random people in convenience stores, loved going on "adventures" where the itinerary was determined by whim, loved watching silly TV shows and loved teasing everyone around her. From Page 1A the material from the old Nebraska state fairgrounds to finish up the sheep building next year.

Future plans the Ag Society are considering include the pavement of the area that has been designated as part of the city's second phase of the walking trail, for which the county could possibly be reimbursed for in the future if and when the city moves forward with the project. They are also looking at replacing the grandstand, which has slowly moved forward due to the growing root system of the shade trees located behind the grandstand to the west.

The county board approved \$90,000 of the Ag Society's request, along with requests by the county libraries (\$13,000), Wayne Fire District No. 2 (\$66,950), Hoskins Fire District 3 (\$110,000), Winside Fire District No. 4 (\$40,712) and Wakefield Fire District No. 5 (\$113,000). No action was taken on the Carroll Fire District request of \$73,869, as the board wanted to confirm some information before approving the request. The board recessed its meeting until next Tuesday, Aug. 23.

The county board will hold a work session to finalize numbers for its 2016-17 budget on Tuesday, Aug. 23 at 9 a.m. at the Wayne County Courthouse.

From Page 1A a market for it. Mayor Chamberlain suggested bidding out 2,000 tons of sludge and see what the city could get for that amount. The council ultimately decided on two bids, one to haul 2,000 tons and another to take what is removed for use as fertilizer.

In other action, the Council: - approved an amendment to Appendix A of the city's Housing Reuse Plan for recapturing and program income funds for its affordable housing program. City finance director Nancy Braden and Wayne Community Housing director Megan Weaver presented information and asked for the city to approve an amendment that would change the limit on the downpayment assistance program from 100 percent to 120 percent.

The City Council's next meeting is Tuesday, Sept. 6 at 5:30 p.m. at the City Council chambers.

Hunters should first talk with processors, but may keep antlers, head and cape and donate the rest of the deer. Processors accept only whole deer in good condition to ensure a good yield of pure ground venison.

Local Boys Scouts part of trek to Philmont Scout Ranch

Local Wayne area Boy Scouts from Troop 174 and several other troops from Nebraska joined together to hike the third hardest trek at Philmont Scout Ranch in the San Christo mountain range located in New Mexico.

The basic trek was scheduled for 95 miles and covered five of the highest peaks in New Mexico. The scouts began at Base Camp and hiked through several historic camps that were part of the original Philturn Rocky Mountain Scout Ranch. They were treated to a taste of the lives and times of the mountain men, miners and settlers of the early Western United States.

As part of their trek, the scouts used burros for two days to simulate the use of burros by early settlers and miners. They developed a deeper appreciation what early frontiersmen had to work with and endure. The scouts also had two dry camps. Preparation for these dry camps included carrying in extra water and learning how to conserve water in the harsh New Mexico desert.

Along with many side adventures, they hiked up towards Mt. Baldy which has an elevation of 12,441 feet. The 12-day trek culminated with a hike along The Tooth of Time mountain range which allows people on certain days to touch the clouds as they hike.

The scouts also side hiked the Tooth of Time itself; a National Landmark which served as a guide to settlers on the Santa Fe trail. Along with the historical significance, the scouts were treated to a panoramic view of four different states and 100s of miles of beautiful western terrain.

The scouts learn much over the 12 day trek and had the opportunity to put their long hours of wilderness training to use.

As James Simpson, one of the Troop 174 scouts on the trek worded it, "Philmont gave me the chance to practice what we in the scouting movement state: Namely the habit of always being prepared and the ability to survive in the wilderness."

Philmont has a number of difference camping experiences. These treks range from standard camping, similar to what is experienced in our local camps, to longer treks

where scouts are challenged to extend their limits and grow beyond their normal experiences.

Adult Advisor, Jeff Simpson said, "It is good to see young men mature and be willing do things beyond their normal activities and prove to themselves that they can accomplish anything they set their minds to."

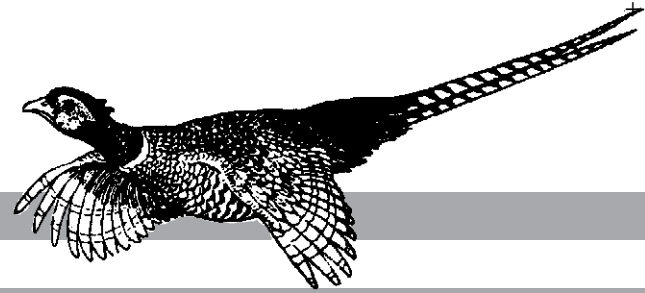

Have you ever asked a question, only to realize just how silly that question sounded at a particular moment?

About 90 minutes into the first practice of the season for the Wayne State volleyball team, I dropped in to take a few "first day of practice" photos for this week's paper, then asked coach Scott Kneifl how the team looks at this point in the season - kind of like asking a race car driver how his car is performing before he's had a chance to get behind the wheel.

Of course, we'll all know more about the team once the season gets going two weeks from now, but this will be an interesting season for the Wildcat volleyball team after last year's team went farther than any varsity team has gone before at the NCAA level.

Last year, the Wildcats made a magical run to the Final Four, led by a foursome of amazing seniors who put a lot of time in the program to get it to that point. The question now is - what will this year's team do for an encore?

The cupboard isn't completely bare from last year. All-American middle hitter Alyssa Frauendorfer is back, as is Alex Oppmer, who developed into a key go-to player during the Wildcats' run to its first-ever Central Region title. You also have Michaela Mestl back, who is a great all-around player that will help anchor the defense; and Mariah Halvorsen, who was expected to be a key player before she was lost to a season-ending knee injury at the start of last season.

Kneifl did a fantastic job recruiting some young talent, including Pierce native Jaci Brahmer, Papillion-LaVista standout Katie Stephens, Humphrey High standout Tarrin Beller and Kauth. He also

has some great young talent like Maria Wortmann, Payton Ruhl and Erin Gross who could step into the holes left behind by last year's amazing senior class.

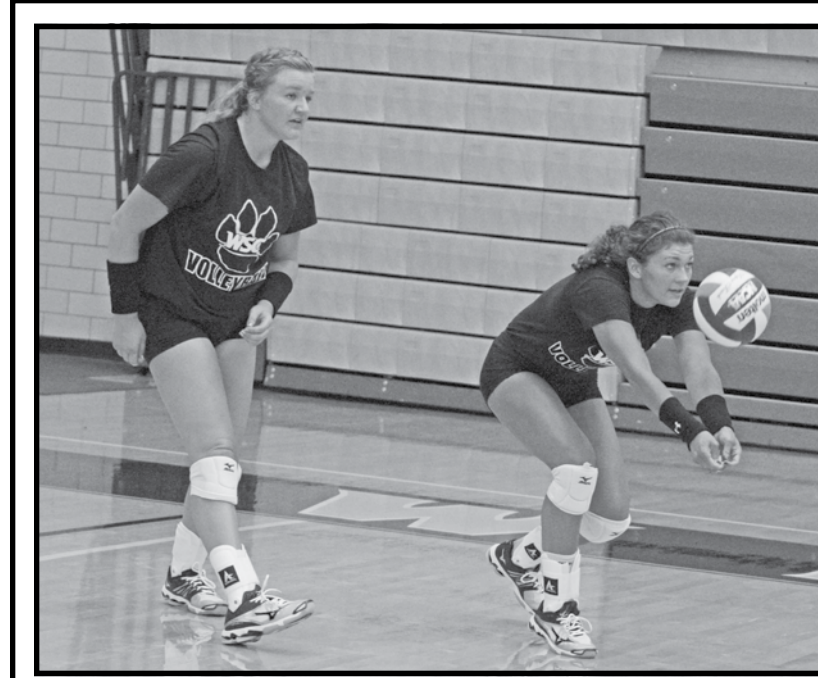

Wayne softball loaded for Class B run

The Wayne High softball team will have a lot of familiar faces and should be a solid contender for state heading into the 2016 season.

With eight of nine starters back from a team that finished fourth in Class C with a 29-7 record, coach Rob Sweetland is excited about the opportunities this year's Blue Devil softball team has to compete for a state title, even with a move up to Class B.

"We've got 12 girls that we need to give a serious look at, so it's nice to have that kind of competition in practice," he said. "We're going to mix things up a bit this year, so to have this much talent back is a good problem to have."

It's not often that a team has as much pitching depth as Wayne will have this season, and Sweetland said he expects to get a lot of use out of seniors Hannah Belt and Ashten Gibson and newcomer Tori Kniesche.

"We haven't had three pitchers who can pitch at the varsity level like these girls can," Sweetland said. "We probably won't have too many complete games this year, because at Class B the hitters are so good so we'll need to change looks. Hannah and Tori both pitched in some big tournaments this summer, and Ashten had a great summer with the Dirt Devils, so they're all battle-tested and we'll use them all this fall."

Wayne also has depth at the catcher position. Sophomore Sydney Biggerstaff stepped in late last season and performed well, and she and Annie Kniesche give Wayne solid depth at the backstop position.

"Sydney will start, but Annie is right there with her, so it's going to come down to who can limit their mistakes and play with confidence back there," Sweetland said. "It's one of the most important positions on defense and we have two who

can handle it."

The rest of Wayne's defense is loaded with experience. All three outfielders - senior Kiara Hochstein and juniors Kennedy Maly and Jenna Trenhaile - return, and the infield is anchored by returning starters in senior third baseman Kortney Keller and junior first baseman Jamie Gamble.

"I think our outfield matches up with anybody, both offensively and defensively," Sweetland said. "We have a lot of speed back there and they're all back, and then we're solid with Jamie at first and Kortney at third, and we have some other players who have played well there as well. We'll have Taylor Gamble at short and Ashten at second, so there's some solid senior leader-

ship in our infield as well, which is a plus."

Wayne will compete at the Class B level this year, but Sweetland feels the team is in a good position to return to the state tournament this season.

"Our district lines up pretty good for us to get an opportunity to get back," he said. "We'll see where we're at early with Blair on Thursday and the Lincoln tournament with some Class A and Class B teams. That first couple of weeks, we'll see where we stack up and I think we'll be right there."

The Blue Devils open the season Thursday at home against Blair and play host to the Wayne Invitational on Saturday at the Summer Sports Complex.

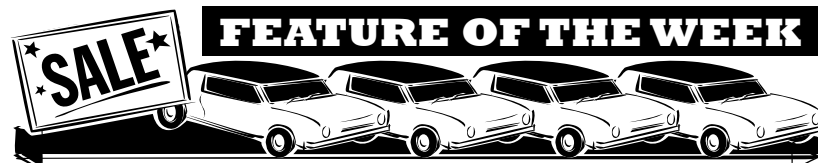

Wildcat baseball recruits seven

Wayne State baseball coach Alex Koch announced that seven student-athletes (six transfers, one high school) have signed national letters of intent and/or scholarship offers to join the Wildcat baseball program for the 2017-18 school year.

The seven additions - six transfers and one high school graduate - join seven high schoolers and one transfer who signed with Wayne State in the NCAA early signing period last November, bringing the total in the 2016 recruiting class to 15 players.

"We are bringing in another hard-working, talented group of young men," said Koch. "We needed to address some issues on the mound and we believe we have done so this summer. The class is a good mix of young high school talent and transfers. Our freshmen are going to have a good opportunity to see some playing time on the field this year and our transfers should be able to step in and take over in a couple key positions for us this year."

Cody Castro, a 5-foot-8 shortstop from Chula Vista, Calif., transfers to Wayne State after playing last season at New Mexico Highlands. He will have one season of eligibility with the Wildcats. Castro also played two years at Southwestern College in California.

Tandon Dorn, a 6-foot infielder from Filley, transfers to Wayne State after spending the last two years at Tusculum College in Tennessee and will have one year of eligibility with the Wildcats. Dorn also played two seasons at Southeast Community College in Beatrice, where he was a two-time All-Region selection in 2013 and 2014, batting .333 over two seasons.

David Janes, a 5-foot-9 catcher from Dubuque, Iowa, played the last two years at Ellsworth Community College in Iowa and will have two seasons of eligibility with the Wildcats. Janes posted a .282 average this season for Ellsworth with eight homers, 10 doubles and 41 RBI to earn All-Region honorable mention honors and All-Conference Academic accolades both seasons at Ellsworth.

Jacob Lemar, a 6-foot catcher from Urbandale, Iowa, was a two-year starter at Waukee High School and played summer ball with the Twin Cities Baseball Academy.

Wildcats sixth in AVCA poll

The Wayne State volleyball team will start the 2016 season ranked sixth in the American Volleyball Coaches Association Division II preseason coaches poll.

Wayne State returns three starters from last year's team that won the NCAA Central Region title and advanced to the NCAA Division II Final Four with a 28-8 record, placing fourth in the NSIC with a 16-4 league mark. The No. 6 ranking matches the highest preseason ranking ever for the Wildcat program while also extending their streak of consecutive national rankings to 89 dating back to Sept. 28, 2009.

Wayne State is among six NSIC schools and 10 Central Region teams listed in the preseason top 25. Perennial NSIC power Concordia-St. Paul leads the ranking, with NSIC foes Southwest Minnesota State (fourth) and Minnesota Duluth (10th) ranked in the top 10. 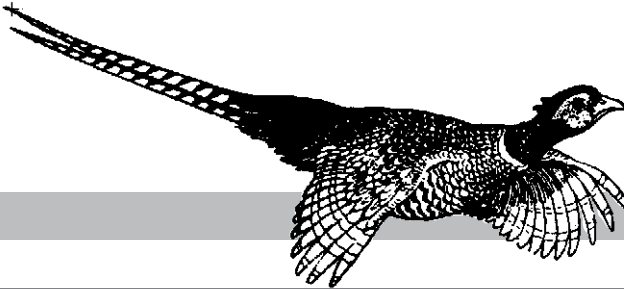

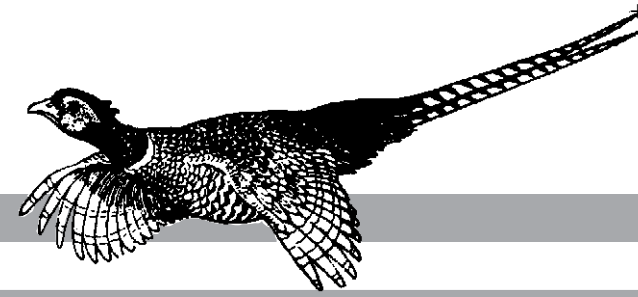

Let them know that they are loved

We have had quite the emotional month in our beautiful little community with what seems like one funeral after another.

Although I have been blessed lately to visit families before and after the death of their loved one, and also pray over an individual shortly before their death, I feel like I could have done more. I have seen the emotional toll that this tremendous loss has taken - not only on family members, but also funeral home employees, ministers, caregivers, nurses, doctors and countless community members. I keep asking myself "What can we do to help them?"

I struggle at times like this, because I'm not always sure what to say or do. When our son, Jacob, died 12 years ago this month, I promised myself that I would always try to be a source of comfort for grieving families - but it hasn't been easy. I do feel like I fail each and every time because I know that nothing I can say will take away the pain that they are feeling. I have tried to always ask myself "What was helpful and what was hurtful when Jacob died?" The only thing I have been able to come up with these days is to just hug them and say "I am so very sorry." I still feel like I should do more, but what can I do?

How do you talk to a grieving family and help them through a pain that can sometimes be unbearable? How do you answer questions like "Why, God. Why?" I don't know about most of you, but I don't think that any of us are completely able to answer that question. I think that all we can do is try to be a constant source of love and support for people at these times.

I remember thinking after Jacob died about how the world just kept revolving and everyone was going on with their lives. Didn't they understand that my life had changed forever? Didn't they understand that I wished my own life would end so somehow I could stop hurting all day every day? I was so consumed by my own grief that I couldn't always see the beautiful gestures that people would make during this time. All I could feel was pain. A pain that I felt would never ever end.

I have really thought a lot about how to help people lately during their times of grief, especially with all of the deaths our community has endured lately, and here are some things I came up with. I tried to think of those things that I thought



were helpful during my own time of intense grief. I hope that somehow you find some of these helpful:

- Call and/or visit them. They need to know that people still care. It is so important that they know that people remember and have not forgotten.

- Send them a card or flowers on the anniversary of their loved one's death or birthday. I spoke at our son's vigil and read a list of things people could do when someone loses a child. One of the suggestions was to send flowers on the anniversary. My dear grandma would send us flowers on the 28th of every month until she died the following year. She also would call on the 28th and say she loved us. I actually am crying remembering her doing this. Believe me - this meant a lot.

- Let them talk about their loved one. I know that sometimes it can be uncomfortable for us because we don't know what to say, but please just let them talk. They aren't looking for anyone to fix anything, because no one can. They just want to be able to talk about their loved one and they just need someone to listen.

- Don't judge. Everyone grieves differently and there is no right or wrong. I know that Mike and I would go play cards with friends on days where the grief got overwhelming. Some might think this was inappropriate, but all I wanted was to just feel "normal" for a while and take a break from grieving and crying. Those who have suffered a loss are enduring enough - the last thing they need is for people to judge how they are grieving.

- Help them somehow keep their faith in life and God. I hate to admit this, but I lost my faith in God for a while and thus I lost hope. When you lose hope, it seems like there is no reason left to live. We need to do whatever we can to remind them that, somehow, tomorrow will come

and that eventually the pain will decrease. The pain will never go away, but it will eventually get easier to handle over time. I don't know how we do this, because telling someone that life will get better doesn't help. What you can do is just love them, hug them, listen to them, be there for them. Somehow, someday, they will see the love that you are giving them and that might just be the one thing they need to hang on through the unbearable pain.

We are a wonderful community and I have seen that so much lately with the support, love and prayers that have been given to the many families who have lost a loved one.

To all those who have lost someone please know that there are many of us who love you and pray for you daily. Please don't ever give up hope - it is hard to imagine, but there will come a day that you will wake and suddenly feel the sun shining down on your face and be able to smile. Until that day comes, please allow those of us here to help you through the pain.

God bless each and every one of you!

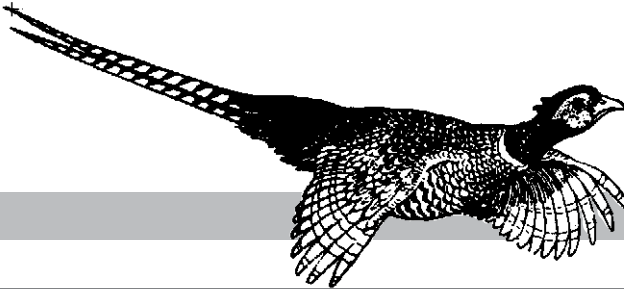

Information shared on ag lease agreements

Here is a bit of timely information from Al Vyhnales, Extension Educator from Platte County. It is that time of year to remind our landowners and tenants about verbal (oral) or "handshake" lease agreements.

Some farm leases are not written, but are verbal "handshake" agreements. Because nothing is in writing, the parties may have different recollections of their agreement, making lease disputes more difficult to resolve. The most common legal issue associated with verbal farm leases is how a lease may legally be terminated. For both year-to-year leases and holdover leases, six months advance notice must be given to legally terminate the lease. In contrast, the termination of a written lease is determined by the terms of the written lease.

For year-to-year leases, the Nebraska Supreme Court has ruled that the lease year begins March 1. Notice to a tenant to vacate under an oral year-to-year lease (legally referred to as a "notice to quit") must be given six months in advance of the end of the lease, or no later than Aug. 31. For example, for the lease year beginning March 1, 2016, and ending Feb. 28, 2017, notice from the landlord that the lease will be

terminated would have to be given to (and received by) the tenant no later than Aug. 31, 2016. The lease would then expire Feb. 28, 2017, with the new tenant (or new buyer) able to take over the lease March 1, 2017. If, however, the notice to quit were given (or received) after Aug. 31, 2016, the existing tenant would have the lease until Feb. 28, 2018. It is recommended that the farm-land lease be terminated by Regis-

tered Letter. This means that the person receiving the letter signs for it, therefore providing evidence that the termination notice was received.

What about pastures and lease terminations? Handshake or verbal pasture leases are different. The typical pasture lease is for the five month grazing season. The lease is only in effect for that time, so the lease is terminated at the end of the grazing season. However, different arrangements can be made in a written lease, and that would be followed if in effect.

Regardless of the type of lease (written, verbal, or even multiple year), it is best to have clear communications by all parties. By sending a termination notice before Aug. 31, even for written leases, you can avoid any miscommunication or pitfalls.

Please consider written leases - they are preferred in all cases. We have sample written lease forms that you can get from our office that have the "fill in the blank" spaces and get both parties thinking about the appropriate lease conditions for their situation. If you'd like to print your own fill in the blank lease, they are available at the web site

USDA Rural Development offers affordable loans for home improvements, appliances

The U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development announces that adequate funding remains available to assist very low income households with home improvements and appliances.

Rural Development's Home Repair Loan program offers low-interest (1 percent) loans, up to \$20,000, to very low income rural homeowners. Loans may be used to repair, improve or modernize homes or to remove health and safety hazards such as plumbing, roofs, electrical repairs, furnaces and to make homes accessible and useable for household members with disabilities. In addition, changes to regulations now allow eligible purposes to include the purchase or installation of equipment in owner-occupied households (e.g. ranges, refrigerators, washers or dryers).

Applicants must own and occupy their home in a rural community and not exceed income guidelines established by county and household size. The family's income must be below 50 percent of the county median income. For many counties in Nebraska, the income limit for one-four person households is \$30,500 and \$40,300 for five-eight person households. However, some counties may have higher income limits up to \$39,250 for one-four person and \$51,850 for five-eight person households.

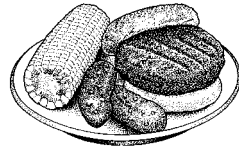



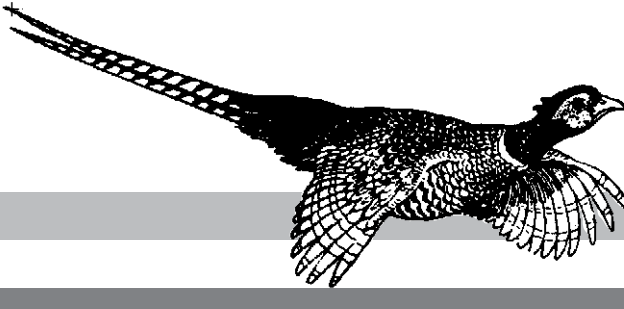

Other summer project are as follows: The weight room is looking very nice, the bathroom will be worked on during the school year. The chrome books arrived today. Maintenance is being advised by Kathy from Floor Maintenance on the upkeep of the floors. Compliments to maintenance as you

will notice the improvement and how the floor shines as you enter the building. Epoxy Floors is currently working on four other schools so their project may not get done before school starts and may have to wait for Christmas break or next summer. Mr. Shoff is also waiting on a call from Cornhusker International to fix the cameras in the new buses. Craig Evans updated Mr. Shoff that regardless if a used engine is replaced or replacement of the cylinders that are bad, it would take \$15,000. It was decided not to spend the money on this bus and use a van for an additional route if needed. The three vans will be arriving the last week in September. There has not been any word from Anderson Ladd on the gym floor. We continue to have a \$5,000 retainer, from Anderson Ladd to be paid when the job was finished. However, nothing has been done to finish the job correctly. The retainer will be used next summer, to hire another company to repaint and refinish the gym floor. The gym floor is able to be used in its current state. The wiring for the Wi-Fi has been installed. Once school has started a Board walk through, on a Saturday, will be scheduled. Mrs. Remm indicated that Wayne State College students will be coming September 17 for their "Reaching Out To Schools" program. They are willing to help in anyway at the school, on this day.

Todd Greunke wanted to bring to the Board's attention his concern on the south water way, by the bridge between the Rohde property and the school property. The water is not going where it is set up to go due to erosion. Marotz was told by Mundil that that there was a county easement between Mundil's property and the school. The question of property lines comes into play which Mr. Shoff will look into.
