The Sioux City Journal is dazed by the anti-prohibition majority in Pennsylvania.

A million dollars changed hands on the result of a horse race at Chicago Saturday.

The Sioux Indians have adopted Geo. Foster, of the commission, into the tribe under the title of "Young-Man-Proud-of-his-tribe."

Nick Foley, who murdered Mrs. Clarke at Elgin, in Holt county last week, was taken from the sheriff on Saturday by a mob and hanged.

All the territories that still remain out in the cold are bustling around getting up constitutional conventions and are preparing to knock loudly at the doors of congress with a demand for statehood.

The Sioux City Journal printed on Saturday report comes from nearly all the western Iowa counties. In almost every instance the report was that corn was never better than this year. Small grain there, as in northern Nebraska, is somewhat short.

It seems that there is trouble in Omaha over the assessment of the furnishings of some of the elegant homes that abound in the metropolis. From \$75 to \$300 suffices to furnish a \$30,000 residence in a sumptuous manner, according to the returns to the assessors.

Mark Siour City real estate another notch. A company has been formed with more capital than the United States treasury contains, to build a railroad from Siour City to the Gulf of Mexico, there to connect with lines of steamers to all parts of the world and a balloon line to the moon.

The decision of Judge Powers in the case of Wayne County vs. Bressler & Patterson disposes of the case as far as the county is concerned. The county attorney has advised the commissioners that the case should be dropped where it is, and unless the court allows the intervention of the attorneys and permits them to prosecute an appeal in their own names, the case is ended.

Gen. Butler was recently asked how he was pleased with the administration. To replied, "Every American citizen ought to be satisfied. The Samoa victory was a veritable triumph. All of Harrison's appointments are excellent. The only complaint that I hear is that the president does not remove the demerits fast enough. The rule which he has adopted, permitting capable political opponents to serve out their terms, ought to make him strong with the people. Harrison is all right."

This does not seem to be a good year for prohibition. Last week Pennsylvania refused by an overwhelming majority to adopt a prohibitory amendment, and Rhode Island by a majority of six thousand greater than the necessary three-fifths, repealed the prohibition amendment that had been in force in that state since 1836. Following the decisive defeat of prohibition in New Hampshire the result in these states indicates a general belief that the country is not yet ready for prohibition, and that a rigid license system will better control the liquor traffic.

The following is from the Lincoln correspondence of the 25th of Tuesday: "Secretary Garber's report and opinion of the reasonableness of local coal and live stock rates on all roads in the state, which are to be rendered in connection with a finding of facts in the Southern Railroad case, is published in confidence expected to be made public in a day or two. The subject has been treated upon very extensively in anticipation of opposition on one two members of the board to the proposed railroad regulations of the rates on these commodities now in effect upon the various roads."
