WASHINGTON, Feb. 1.—The credentials of Mr. Mills as senator from the state of Texas for the full term beginning March 4 next were presented and placed on the calendar.

Among the petitions presented and referred was one by Mr. Peffer of Kansas for senators to admit soldiers of Kansas and other states.

LEGISLATION'S GRIND

WORK MEN'S DUES IN NEBRASKA
The following is the text of the bill introduced for an act to amend the law in relation to the dues of work men in Nebraska:

Section 1. The act to amend the law in relation to the dues of work men in Nebraska, approved February 18, 1908, is amended so that the same shall read:

Section 2. Whenever a work man shall have been employed by any person or corporation in this state for a period of thirty days in any one calendar month, he shall be entitled to the same wages as if he had been employed by such person or corporation for a longer period, provided that such work man shall have been employed by such person or corporation for a period of thirty days in any one calendar month in each of the two calendar years immediately preceding the calendar year in which he shall have been so employed.

Section 3. Whenever a work man shall have been employed by any person or corporation in this state for a period of thirty days in any one calendar month, he shall be entitled to the same wages as if he had been employed by such person or corporation for a longer period, provided that such work man shall have been employed by such person or corporation for a period of thirty days in any one calendar month in each of the two calendar years immediately preceding the calendar year in which he shall have been so employed.
