NATIONAL ELECTION!

Yet in Doubt.

The Result Depends on New York.

Uncertainty Everywhere.

Nebraska Comes up Smiling with 25% Repub. Majority.

All Three Republicans Congressmen Elected.

Up to the time we go to press nothing definite is known of the national election. Michigan, Wisconsin and Indiana are in doubt while Connecticut and New Jersey have probably gone Democratic. The latest returns from New York give Blaine a plurality of 603, while 12 election districts to West from. Whether these are Republican or Democratic cannot be learned, and what change they may make can not even be conjectured.

In this state the Republican slate ticket is elected by a majority of from 20,000 to 25,000, and all three of the Republican candidates for congress elected, though the vote in the first district is close.

In this district Durand, Dem., is elected senator by about 250 majority. Rabbinson, Rep., is elected representative by 98 majority.

As District Attorney Britton has a majority of about 140 in the counties he has from, with result in Cedar, Stanton and Knox unknown. He is probably elected by a small majority.

Wayne county stands by the Republican color and gives the largest Republican majority in the state in proportion to her population.
