NATIONAL ELECTION! Yet in Doubt.

The Result Depends on New York.

Uncertainty Everywhere.

Nebraska Comes up Smiling with 254-400 Republican Majority.

All Three Republican Congressmen Elected.

Up to this time we have seen nothing definite in the results of the national election. Michigan, Wisconsin and Indiana are in doubt while Connecticut and New Jersey have probably gone Democratic. The latest returns from New York give Blaine a plurality of 663, and a election of this state to him from either these or Republican is a possibility which may make our own election conjectural.

In this state the Republican ticket is elected by a majority of five 20,000 to 27,000, and all three of the Republican candidates for congress elected, though the vote in the first district is close.

In this district Darland, Dem., is elected senator by about 250 majority. Robinson, Rep., is elected representative by 98 majority.

Rep. District Attorney Britton has a majority of about 140 in the counties heard from, with result in Cedar, Stanton and Knox unknown. He is probably elected by a small majority.

Every possible precaution should be taken to prevent the unfortunate political jealousy often manifested by outside districts towards the town, and the best method of doing this is to give to each precinct the representation in the county conventions on a pro-rata basis.

THE FIRST ANIMAL LIFE. Did it begin in Wisconsin? Has there?

A theory has been formulated that the poles were first sites to produce life, which consequently commenced at the northern and southern extremities of the globe, developing independently, but to a certain extent corresponding, since conditions were similar. By the secular cooling of the globe the poles ultimately became uninhabitable to support life, and such forms as did not perish in the change of the earth's surface slowly migrated towards the equator, changing the course of ages, and ultimately giving rise to a fauna which, over most of the globe, consists of a mixture of northern and southern forms.

Many facts derived from the northern hemisphere lend support to this theory, and the southern hemisphere has recently added new facts which tell in the same direction. The animals of the northern hemisphere are still almost identical throughout the world's circuit. The same families and even the same species of mammals and birds are common to the north of the Old World and of the New. To give a few examples, the elk or moose, the reindeer, the beaver, the lynx, the wolf, the fox of Europe and Asia are especially identified with those of America.

The blood of America is closely allied to the animals of Europe, the brown bear of Europe to our own grizzly, the stag to the wapiti or elk, and so on. Remains of mammals now regarded as tropical—such as the elephant, hippopotamus, rhinoceros, hyena, lion, etc.—are common in the tertiary strata

of temperature and even Arctic regions. This is proof of a southern migration when climate changed. In the southern part of South America, in the Patagonia, have been found mammalian remains which seem to show that the tertiary fauna of Patagonia preceded that of the northern hemisphere, to the north of the equator the mammals are there and are somewhat more generalized than those of the north.

A sort of subarctic plateau connects Staten Island (part of Terra del Fuogo Archipelago) with South Georgia and other Antarctic lands, and it seems not unlikely that a great Antarctic continent once existed, the remains of which are Australia, New Zealand, etc., on the one hand, and Patagonia, etc., on the other. In Australia the marsupials multiplied and spreading eastward, mingled with the fauna of the Pacific, and their relatives first appeared in Patagonia by the time the great land bridge was broken. 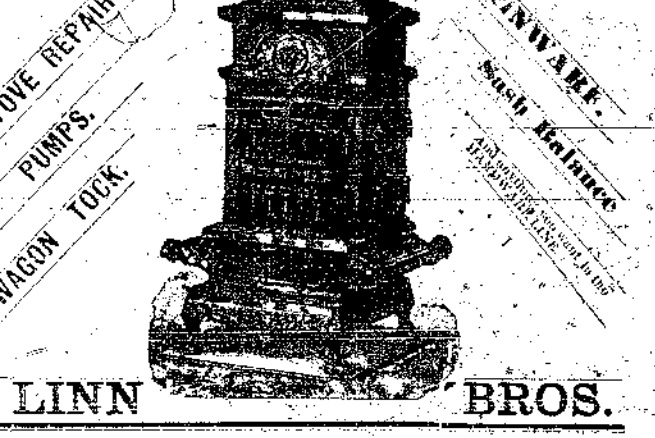
