DOMESTIC HINTS.

Corn Fritters—Grate twelve ears of corn, mix the meal with a silver knife, add the milk, then lay it to rest. Mix the pulp with twelve eggs and one teaspoonful of flour. Fry in hot springs.

One ounce oil of lavender mixed with one ounce oil of rosemary and sprinkled about a room will rid it of flies. One who knows says that four applications at intervals will be sufficient.

Fruit has taken the place of flowers in basket decoration. Waste paper baskets are ornamented with bows and ends of wild satin ribbon, among which are dried violets, strawberries, grapes and other fruit, with bunches of grasses or wheat.

Don't freeze walls or ceiling. Freeze painting is very well for large hallways, but the walls of a room are good for domestic rooms. Color on the walls in this way is sure to be in conflict with whatever color may be heightening in pictures, furniture, hangings, or decorative objects.

Roman Punch. Grate the yellow rind of four lemons and two oranges upon a pint of pounds of sugar. Squeeze the juice of the lemons and oranges, cover it and let it stand over the next day. Strain it through a sieve with the sugar and add a few drops of orange essence. If it does not infuse, it may be frozen or not so strong.

Don't put high colors on your walls or in your carpets or tapestries—and very little on draperies also. Well painted walls have a tendency to give a pleasant effect. Pictures can not look well if hung against bold patterns or positive colors, nor vice versa. It is best to have a few neutral colors, and because it is difficult to be confused with the designs and colors against which it is placed.

Potted plants will keep well in winter, and are good for windowsills. Those of the vine and aster are the best with a little pepper. Mix some powdered crackers with a little warm milk, two teaspoons each of white pepper, a quarter of a pound of the best butter, and add salt and pepper to taste. Pack in jars and cover with a thin layer of butter and cover closely. It will keep for ten days in the ice chest.

Souffléd omelets are a nice dish, and are also good for breakfast. Those of the egg and cheese, lard and salt with a little pepper. Mix some powdered crackers with a little warm milk, two teaspoons each of white pepper, a quarter of a pound of the best butter, and add salt and pepper to taste, mixing thoroughly. Bake in buttered scallop shells, or, if you have not scallop shells, or, if you have not, in buttered patty pans or large custard cups that have been thoroughly cleaned.

Salt eggs are a Savoy dish. The descendants of the "Hallows," an ancient Savoy dish, are still eaten in Savoy as an offering to the saint at Dresden salt eggs, larks and salt cucumbers. The eggs should be boiled until they are perfectly hard, then the yolks should be beaten, and lay the eggs in them strong enough to stand them. Let them remain in this for twenty-four hours.

Motion pie makes a welcome dish for the children's dinner, cold roast or boiled should be used for this purpose. Trim the meat to small pieces and put them in a pudding dish, if you have any gravy or stock pour that over the meat. In a little butter, mix with pepper and salt, add a little parsley, chop finely, cover the top with a thick paste made of as you make being powder biscuits broken into small pieces and serve.
