Republican County Convention.

The strongest officers of Wayne county are requested to send delegates from the several precincts, to meet in convention, at the court house in Wayne, Monday, October 27th, 1885, at 1 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for County Clerk, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds, County Superintendent of Public Institutions, County Judge, Sheriff, County Surveyor and one County Commissioner, and to perform such other business as may be presented to the convention.

The lists of representation will be one delegate at large for each precinct and one for every twenty voters or fraction thereof cast for a Republican Presidential elector in 1884.

The several precincts are entitled to representation as follows:

Brewers 2 Lakota 2
Deer Creek 2 Plum Creek 2
Gardner 2
Hays 2
Lakota 2

It is recommended that the Republican electors of the several precincts meet in convention Monday, October 27th, 1885, to elect their delegates and to their bodies for delegates express also their choice for candidates for the respective offices, and that the delegates elected be thereby instructed to support the names receiving a majority of all votes cast by persons residing in the precincts, except such a majority as may be presented by some other person.
