MAPLE SYRUP FROM OURN.

Cherokee, Ia., Feb. 5, 1897. At different times during the last six months articles have appeared in the press commenting on the art of manufacturing maple syrup from our county. The fact that a great deal of maple syrup manufactured has been thoroughly demonstrated by the recent success of a citizen of the county, who has prepared the natives by making a syrup from colts that an expert cannot distinguish from the genuine article. It has the color and taste of genuine Vermont maple syrup and is as good as any to be had by taste and looks almost as sweet as the genuine. The manufacturer engaged to the production in a recent issue of Marcus, Cherokee county and expects in the near future to enter into the business on a large scale which perhaps a which company already being formed. Samples of the syrup are being sent to all parts of the country for inspection, and should it give satisfaction, we shall be pleased to supply it. The syrup can be made for less than half the cost of the genuine and is of reliable quality. People are getting to know us every day from the increasing country and some are investigating the matter with a view to buying. The process employed in obtaining these results is a mystery in the past, but only a select few have been taken into the secret. For a more complete report to divulge any of the details.

Wayne county's delegation to the Fremont Beet Growers convention held last week some home pretty thoroughly satisfied that the business as usual to become one of the state's leading industries. The new process of reduction they believe is found to solve the question between the grower and manufacturer. It is the result of the necessity of plants of this kind to the communities where the beet is grown and thus cutting off the exorbitant transportation charges. A large manufacturer of Omaha declared that he had investigated the business very thoroughly and was fully satisfied that the same machinery identically except that used in the refining process could be utilized for the production of alcohol from corn thus keeping the plants running the entire year instead of three months as at present. If this is true, then we are just approaching the time when our country can be successfully operated in all cities like our own where we can grow in perfection both the beet and corn. Factories of this kind, which we must have if we expect to become permanently prosperous. When we can turn our raw material into a manufactured product, then we are on the highway to prosperity and not until then. Let not our best growers become discouraged and abandon the business because it was not so highly remunerative during the last season as they hoped. The cause here is not the trouble between the factory and the grower any more than it is. The weather at the dipping time was against the proper market for the sugar. It never occurred to anyone and may never occur again. Grow beets, but don't grow it so cheaply. There is a great deal for the producer to be done along this line and it is necessary to obtain satisfactory results. Go a little slower and learn the business.


