There seems to be a great deal of misunderstanding in regard to the effect of a vote on the proposition authorizing the commissioners to discontinue the county extension of Le Port. If the proposition means it will not make it necessary for the commissioners to sell, but it is a simple matter in such a case, that it is an opportunity to sell. The proposition should mean that the commissioners should take advantage of it. At present no matter how good an offer is made for it it could not be sold for a specific amount could be obtained and the authorities thus given by the people. To save the expense of a special election if no other reason the authorities should be given of this kind.

The proposition to keep the present land is the intention of having the land to the county and making a good house of it, as a security to the people. The total expense for the sale of the land in this county, extension of Le Port, and attendance is and has been less than two hundred dollars a year. A report has been circulated to the effect that there is a \$100,000 in the county treasury some \$20,000 which the county treasurer is supposed to have hidden away for the purpose of concealment and removal to pay no. Even if the treasurer was a swindler running with funds it is difficult to see what money Mr. Britton could be making for it if there were any money to be attached. He has no authority to pay out money except where the statute provides for it, or the commissioners order it made. The fact that the county's financial matters are in good condition and we do not believe that any one can show that Mr. Britton has a dollar of the county's money that he is not entitled to, or that there is a dollar now in the treasury that should not be there. The \$15,000 reported, that is a statement of the present condition of the county funds will show the \$75,000 diminishing to a little less than \$7,000.
