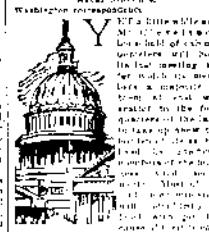

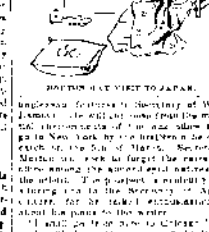
LOOK FOR OTHER JOBS

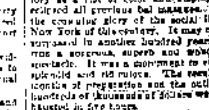
GREAT BALL IS GIVEN

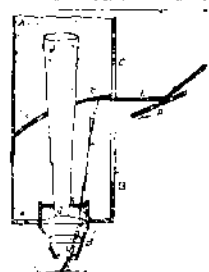
