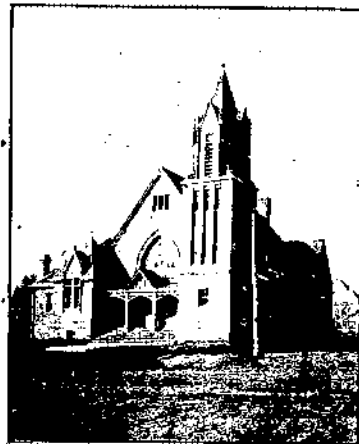


## M. E. CHURCH FORMALLY DEDICATED
